

MILL PAINTING SATURDAY AND THE SEPTEMBER FAMILY EVENT DAY RETURN. The Oldland Mill dates from 1703. It is one of the best restored post mills in Sussex, and one of the oldest regularly working mills in the country. It is open on the first Sunday of every month between April and October.

The Mill was renovated by Oldland Mill Trust volunteers who now maintain and operate it. The Trust is always looking for volunteers able to either occasionally or regularly spend time helping us to maintain this local and important historic landmark.

STONEYWISH NEWS After months of drought, the Herb Garden at Stoneywish is looking a little ragged but remarkably colourful, and walking between the beds, one could almost forget that the land is gasping for rain. Neither the tall, lush spires of marshmallow, nor the flowering stalks of fennel, nor ground-hugging lavender and chamomile show any sign of thirst. Many herbs, with their fine-cut, feathery, or grey-green foliage are especially adapted to dry conditions. The Horse-Radish, Fennel and Marshmallow are deep-rooted. Woodystemmed Oregano and Thyme conserve water by putting forth tiny leaves and flowers. Sage, Mullein and Marshmallow are downy-leaved, the soft hairs offering a further means of conserving moisture. While our garden at home has pretty much parched up and dying trees are a common sight by the roadside, the community of plants in the herb garden seems to have been protected by a special collective wisdom. Being full of rich, aromatic oils which evaporate in the sun, they create a uniquely vital and soothing atmosphere around them. And where species have struggled, they have received 'help' from one another. For instance, germination was difficult this year for Nasturtiums and Marigolds, though those which are established look happy. The gaps in-between, however, have been filled by the ever-opportunistic Fleabane, which, despite much vigorous weeding in early spring, of course knew best and returned in force. For Fleabane there is no such word as 'drought'. The flowers are bright, yellow - little suns fringed with a lion's mane of narrow petals. Brambles and bindweed have swamped the roses, offering shelter and shade, protection in a crisis. That there might be a shared intelligence and spiritual resonance between plants would have been taken as given by earlier ages. Elemental affinities in herbs were identified centuries ago in the folklore of the ancient world and are still recognized today by in-

digenous healers and certain traditional herbalists. Nicholas Culpeper, who wrote Britain's bestknown Herbal in 1653, stood on the tilting ground between the dubious 'old school' practices of London's apothecaries, and the new 'scientific' approach of the College of Physicians, which so aggressively sought to eliminate all competition. Disenchanted with both camps, Culpeper struck out on his own, researching the herbs which grew in the hedgerows around him and testing their medicinal reputations. He offered affordable help and advice to the poor at a time when doctors were beyond the reach of ordinary folk and official medicines were more likely to kill than cure. He also incorporated the fashionable science of astrology into his practice. Each herb listed in his Herbal is duly assigned to a planet which 'governs' it. But the allocations are not merely fanciful - many of them were of great antiquity and their groupings had been based originally on practical observation, rather than superstition. Looking around the garden today, one can instantly spot affinities in form and colour which act as clues to the inner properties of the plants. Culpeper, following tradition, assigned his herbs to one of the 7 'planets' or planetary gods of the week, matching the particular qualities associated with each. Now I have always smiled on this as an example of primitive 'hocus-pocus', but suddenly I wonder if the system deserves a more respectful look. Deriving as it does from centuries of close, one might say in the best sense of the word, 'scientific' observation, it invites us to try a new and direct way of looking at flowers. So this month I have decided to take a celestial stroll with Master Culpeper round the Herb Garden and see what can be learnt. And if you would like to join me, the tour takes just a week, beginning on a Sunday, and takes the form of a kind of Botanical Happy Families: pairing and looking for 'likenesses'. Plants have characteristics on many levels,

so this game consists of 'reading' the clues and then identifying them with similar forms in other plants, noting their healing properties and finally matching them with one of the seven planetary bodies of the old Solar System. These heavenly 'bodies' were all considered divine in the ancient world. So, we get a tour of a pantheon of gods and goddesses thrown in free. First comes Sunday: The sun we know. It is bright and uplifting. Sunday is dedicated to Apollo, the solar god and god of music. The yellow blossoms of Marigold and St. John's Wort place them together under the influence of the sun. The wild creeping Tormentil, or Cinquefoil, and Tutsan are also yellow-flowered herbs of high summer and share similar astringent, pungent and stimulating properties which drive damp and lethargy out of the body. Monday, or 'Moon'-day belongs to Artemis, the huntress, and, since the moon governs the tides, her flowers have a watery disposition. They favour damp habitats and their leaves and roots become slimy and slippery when mixed with water. They are soothing, bland, and cooling to the body. Marshmallow is a prime example of a moon herb, though it does well in our sunny garden. The flowers are pale and the roots yield an extraordinary healing mucilage,

which hydrates dry tissue. Tuesday, or Mardi in French, belongs to Mars, the fiery god of war, and according to old plant-lore, his herbs are prickly, with toothed leaves and are often associated with the colour red. They can be bitter, stinging and peppery and they have a stimulating action on the blood. Echinacea belongs to Mars, as do Nettles and Onions and Thistles. Wednesday, Woden's day, is Mercredi in French, the day of the messenger god, Mercury. Mercurial plants are nervines, stimulating circulation to the brain and calming the nerves. They are often hollow-stemmed and highly aromatic. Fennel is one, as is Parsley. And Lavender, the age-old cure for headache, is another. Thor, the Thunder-God owns Thursday. In classical Rome he was Jupiter, and in Holsts's orchestral suite, The Planets, he appears as 'the bringer of jollity'. His plants, according to Sajar Popham, are often 'large, broad-leaved, thick and oily', though the delicate Lemon Balm is a Jupiter plant in Culpeper's book. Borage, 'for courage', belongs to Jupiter, so do Burdock and Sage, (the indispensible cooking companion for fatty meat, such as pork and goose). All these herbs aid digestion and nourish the body. Friday, is Frigga's day, Frigga being the Scandinavian equivalent of Venus in classical

mythology. Venus, as Goddess of Love, owns sweet-fruited plants such as strawberry and blackberry, cherry and gooseberry with cooling, astringent juices for beautiful skin. She also claims the tonic and relaxing herbs that are good for women, such as ladies mantle, yarrow and raspberry and herbs with anti-fever and cleansing properties. These bring comfort, sweetness and strength. The rose is the herb of Venus par excellence, a healing medicine for the heart - which leaves Saturday, the day of Saturn: a distant planet and the oldest of the gods. Saturn's plants, like the brittle Horsetail and the Teasel, grow in jointed whorls and spirals. They have a rigid structure and are said to promote strong bones and sinews in the body through the action of their bitter salts. Thus, Horsetail is not only useful for scrubbing pots and pans. The silica crystals on the stems can promote the growth of strong nails and hair when the plant is taken as tea. Saturn as god of rest, also owns toxic herbs such as Poison Hemlock, which bring the sleep of death! And so back to Sunday. At the end of my tour I begin to see these groups of plants, not merely as objects or entities in their own right, but as messengers, offering to balance our internal human energies with the elemental energies free-flowing around us. This is a concept of oneness, wholeness, (the root meaning of Health), which suddenly

makes rational sense. Not only do I feel better for inhaling the scents and sharing the environmental resilience of the herbs – I am somehow more in tune with life and with myself – as though I had taken a literal tonic! I also have the beginnings of a new, dynamic botanical index forming in my head. So, thank you, much-ridiculed Master Culpeper, and please forgive my former arrogance! If you are tempted to go a little further in this study of seeing things from the inside, why not try testing a trusted herb on your other senses too? Choose your herb with care! No rash experiments, please!! Take a gentle culinary herb, like mint or lemon balm or fennel, draw it to understand the structure, sniff it, chew it, make a tea with it and see what it has to say to you. Do you like it? Does it make you feel cheerful, or dreamy, or clear your head, or stimulate your energy? Would you turn to it if you felt depressed, or sluggish? Today being Monday, another week is off on its merry-go-round. I think I might go back to the Moon Goddess and ask her again for rain...

4SIGHT VISION SUPPORT PROMOTES NA-TIONAL EYE HEALTH WEEK 4Sight Vision Support provides support and specialist information to blind and sight impaired residents throughout West Sussex and is delighted to be lending its support to National Eye Health Week (NEHW). This will be held from 19th to 25th September

with the theme for this year being 'Your Vision Matters', promoting the importance of good eye health and the need for regular eye tests for all.

Sight is the sense people fear losing the most, yet many of us don't know how to look after our eyes – National Eye Health Week aims to change all that! Two million people in the UK are living with sight loss, that is severe enough to have a significant impact on their daily lives, yet half of this sight loss is avoidable.

Regular sight tests can detect early signs of conditions, including glaucoma, which can be treated if found soon enough. In addition, during a sight test, other health conditions such as diabetes or high blood pressure may be detected. Those with vision loss should continue to do so as checking for further changes in the eyes can help make the best use of remaining vision and prevent any unnecessary further sight loss.

4Sight Vision Support will be raising awareness of a focus on prevention and the importance of getting things checked out. Anyone is welcome to contact



GREAT TIT Just for the record; I've never trusted them. Unlike all the other familiar, friendly faces on my back garden bird table there's just something about the Great Tit that's always made me suspicious. Perhaps it's my mistrust of uniforms. The Great Tit's smart

plumage with a collar, black tie and a glossy black cap makes them look too official, too authoritative. And that bright yellow chest? Far too garish for the garden.

Their behaviour isn't exactly endearing either. Great Tits are the bullies on the bird table. They'll aggressively assert their authority and violently peck at other birds as they plunder the peanuts. When a house-hunting Great Tit can't find a suitable hole to nest in, it'll simply evict a Blue Tit and move in.

Their dominance is also heard in spring when their two-note song, "Tea-cher! Tea-cher!" Tea-cher!" rings out through our woodlands. It was this "Teacher!" that taught me my first lesson in bird song identification; an easily recognisable two-note war cry used to proclaim the tit's territory. But I was soon to learn that not everything was how it seemed. Each male actually has an average of four different songs, which can be sung at three different tempos. This varied repertoire is a sly Beau Geste trick employed to trick other Great Tits into thinking that a woodland is more crowded than it really is. The birds who know the most tunes secure larger territories and breed more successfully. And it's a trick that fools me each year too, if I don't recognise a bird call in the woods it's always a Great Tit.

Through aggression and deceit, these birds have successfully established an empire that spreads

from England to China. And it's from the far-flung corners of this empire that we've recently received reports of some rather worrying behaviour. From Finland came news of a group of Great Tits changing their vegan diet of seeds and nuts to something much more meaty: other birds. In Hungary, scientists made the chilling discovery of a population of Great Tits which have developed a taste for the brains of hibernating bats. Sure, these are isolated incidents at the moment but with human society plunging rapidly towards the abyss and an army of Great Tits acquiring a taste for blood and brains, is it unreasonable to hypothesise a post-apocalyptic future where humans are at the mercy of plagues of zombie Great Tits? Close your windows people - they're coming for us!

STEVE'S BACK PAGE GOSSIP

I was hoping by now I could spectacularly reveal what the new shop was going to be, but sadly apart from some very nice plywood walls nothing has really happened. Whoever it is that does go in, has a nasty habit of leaving the lights on 24/7. I used to be a bit of a naughty boy in that direction myself, but ever since we've got our new electric contract in for the shop I'm a changed man. Whereas we used to pay approximately £2000 a year, it's now gone up to over £6000 a year. That's a lot. Problem is unlike domestic tariffs there is no price cap on commercial electricity supplies, obviously if we're making enough profit we can offset it against tax at the end of the year and with all businesses doing the same you think how many billions less the Government is going to receive in Tax receipts. So, you'd think that they'd get their finger out and do something about it, although "what" is not a question I'm educated enough to answer, but if it gets any worse I can see a lot of shops closing because of these electricity charges.

On a lighter note, all of this beautiful weather has brought a few problems with it, for example, a bit of an explosion in fleas and ticks. Now I know a lot of you have done a very good deal with your local vets to receive a monthly dose of flea killer, but a lot of these can be Advocate or Advantage or even vets' own brand which are great - nothing wrong with them at all, except they don't kill Ticks, the product that kills Ticks is Fipronil, and none of those I mentioned contain it. Advocate is Imidacloprid and Moxidectin, Advantage is just Imidacloprid. Ticks can be very troublesome or even dangerous so, just check whatever you're using protects your pets – also, as it's holiday time, if you're going away and locking up your house for a couple of weeks, don't forget to spray your home with a good household flea spray and make sure it contains Smethoprene. What it does is it basically gives the adult flea a vasectomy and stops it laying those 100 eggs, so eventually you end up with less of a problem, or even no problem at all. I'm not trying to frighten you, I just don't want you to arrive home from your wonderful holiday and open your front door, to be met by an army of fleas and while you're at it, make sure you spray the interior of your car as well, because they will be in there too,

Our little doggy Tinkerbelle is 14 1/2 now and she's very sensitive to fleas and what we put on her to prevent them, but we found a tick on her the other day, so now I'm using the Fipronil product on her as well. You can use two different products, it's quite safe, as long as you put them on separately. She's been a bit arthritic for the last couple of years during which time we gave her a 1/4 tablet of paracetamol which our vet advised was the cheapest and most effective painkiller, as well as a cupboard full of herbal joint remedies, but now she's on this new injection from the vets which is amazing and you really can see the difference it's made to her life - also because she suffers from Pancreatitis, her diet consists of chicken and rice Chappie which we sell for £1.25 a tin with cooked chicken in, otherwise she gets bored with the Chappie. Chappie is an excellent product for sensitive digestion, we were spending a fortune on prescription diet foods so, to save money we gave Chappie to try and that was it, we never looked back. Incidentally the dosage of Paracetamol is 1/4 tablet per 10KG of body weight. With this excessive heat there are no berries and a lot less natural food for the wild birds, so keep feeding them if you can, we charge £16.50 for a 20K sack of wild bird food, which I don't feel is excessive. I've seen some of the prices they charge online and they aren't 'cheap cheap' as you'd
