


REPLIES TO STEVE BACK PAGE GOS-SIP ABOUT WHAT SHOULD HAPPEN TO NATIONAL TYRES



DITCHLING FILM SOCIETY Our film on 2nd November is The Farewell a 2019 American comedy-drama written and directed by Lulu Wang. It stars Awkwafina, Tzi Ma, Diana Lin and Zhao Shuzhen. This funny, uplifting tale is "based on an actual lie". Chinese-born, U.S.-raised Billi returns to China to find that, although the whole family knows their beloved matriarch, Nai-Nai, has been given mere weeks to live, everyone has decided not to tell Nai Nai herself. The family bring forward a wedding date as a pretext to get the family together without letting grandma know they have come to say goodbye. As Billi navigates a minefield of family expectations and proprieties, she finds there's a lot to celebrate... COULD YOU JUST? Those are the words so often on the lips or in the mind of anyone with a substantial disability. They were certainly often heard in the Brighton household of a young quadriplegic man. His NHS power chair had been adapted so that he could control it by head movements and a special arm. He could choose between using his tablet or moving around. But he had to call for help to change from one mode to the other. No statutory or commercial adaptation was available. No wonder his mother contacted REMAP, a national organisation of retired engineers who specialise in one-off solutions to the individual problems of disabled people.

The Brighton branch had just been joined by Noel Poncelet, a recently retired BT engineer. With skills in electronic and mechanical engineering, and manual dexterity which meant that he could not only design but build his own components, plus a lifetime of problem solving he began what turned into three years of research, creativity and innovation. It was, says Peter Cattermole, Remap's Chairman, 'probably the most complex task that any of us have undertaken'. The result was a system based on two adapted wheelchair arms, again controlled by pressing a head button, but now the pressure will swing

the relevant arm into position depending on whether the user wants to use his computer or drive the chair. When not needed, the arms park themselves behind the chair. For good measure, Noel also designed and made a 'stick dispenser' where a mouth pointer can be stored and offered up when needed.

It is not surprising that at the REMAP annual awards ceremony in London on 28th September, Noel received an 'Above and Beyond' special recognition plaque. It had been an outstanding achievement, bringing together electronic and mechanical skills. Other awards included bed access steps for a six year old, a shower mounted shampoo and conditioning device, access to a narrow boat and a Thomas the Tank Engine walker for a toddler who needed to push his ventilator and oxygen bottle.

With such a galaxy of sophisticated designs, it is easy to forget that REMAP is proud to be involved with providing free solutions to the smaller, seemingly insoluble 'could you just?' difficulties which confront people with disabilities every day of their lives. THE WINDMILLS JUNIOR SCHOOL We have had such a brilliant start to the year—with plenty of sunshine, biblical rain and the most incredible learning experiences, some old favourites, and others new to this year. Year 6 had a very successful trip to PGL where they challenged themselves and dug deep to overcome their fears and take part in all the activities. They all get a prize for sticking it out in one of the wettest campfires ever! They came back exhausted but energised by the experience.

Our new year 3 children recently had the chance to immerse themselves in a stone age experience; reliving exactly what it was like to be alive at this time. They had several exciting adventures to go on. One of these was an amazing tent experience where the children travelled back in time and met two people from this period in time. They explained to the children how they survived with their cooking, hunting and weaving skills. After preparation, the children watched a fish being cooked over the fire and then got to taste this tasty treat—the children wanted more! Year 3 also got to explore, feel and try on some amazing artefacts including holding a stone that was over 20,000 years old!



Year 3 and year 4 parents were invited in to share a book with their child on the field in the second week of term. This was a lovely event that really celebrated the love of reading and allowed parents to spend a bit of time in school with their child. The children were very excited to show their grown-ups the school field, their classrooms and introduce them to their class teacher and teaching assistant.

In year 5, the children recently spent a week doing some work based around the 'Room of Requirement' from Harry Potter. The children created their own rooms which they then went on to write about in English. Before they created their rooms, they looked at various techniques in art such as: cross hatching, circling, zigzagging and chevrons. The children were able to build texture to make their artwork look more realistic. The children particularly considered light and dark tones. For example, by overlapping pencil in areas where there might be shadow.

The children loved being back enjoying new experiences in our outdoor learning environment. Year 6 were challenged to make Green Man faces on the trees using mud, leaves, twigs and even some fruit (all things sludgy and slimy!). 

The Hassocks Community Veg Patch - the 'Patchworkers' displayed some of their autumn harvest and welcomed newbie gardeners to come along and start growing veg together.

The Schools Group table included the young creators of the Windmills School Manifesto for Change, which inspired visitors with their imagination and optimism directed to practical solutions. They showcased their ideas and shared an informative quiz to test your eco knowledge. Lots to learn! There was discussion and support shown for the idea of a School Streets project, which aims to make travel to school safer and more eco friendly.

Dear Ed, Michael wrote a lovely article about helping our pollinators, including hoverflies, and the need for more bee-friendly plants - in October 1805 Vice Admiral Nelson signaled "England expects every man will do his duty" before the Battle of Trafalgar - surely in 2023 the same message applies with the same urgency with the loss of so much natural habitat.

Not only should the nation plant bee-friendly plants but we need to be aware of the invasion of the aggressive (to pollinators) and carnivorous Asian Hornet, which has a diet of bees, wasps and hoverflies. Asian Hornets are already having an adverse effect on pollinators in Europe and if it gets established in the UK it will have equally devastating consequences for our pollinators. DEFRA & NNSS are so concerned about the potential consequences of Asian Hornet colonies that they have developed the free Asian Hornet Watch app for Android and Apple phones. Asian Hornets are wasp like but have yellow legs and a orange / yellow fourth segment on their abdomen. DEFRA & NNSS are asking everyone to down load the app and report any possible sightings - if in doubt take a photo and submit on the app. No pollinators: no food: no future

SLUGS I've had a strange fascination with slugs since I was a little boy. Back then I believed that they were homeless snails that had lost their shells. It turns out I was right. Sort of. The whole eviction process had started as far back as the murky Mesozoic when some land snails cast off the shackles of a shell and evolved into slugs for some truly independent living. Sure, shells are great for protection and will help you to avoid drying out but they're clunky and require calcium to construct. Without them you can roam anywhere and (to namecheck another mollusc) the world's your oyster.

The slug's shell has never been completely lost a fragment remains hidden under their skin, a tiny, shrunken souvenir of their snail ancestry. Another link to their slimy dynasty is that all slugs, like all are both male and female. snails. As hermaphrodites, they possess both sets of sexual organs and this means that, if the situation dictates, they can go it alone and simply self-fertilise to produce their offspring. A true state of independence. Self-fertilisation creates a clone - or in a slug's case hundreds of clones – but the problem with inbreeding is a lack of genetic variability. Clones all possess the same weaknesses. An entire slug population can be wiped out by the same parasites and pathogens. To produce varied and resilient offspring, most slugs go in for the more old-fashioned approach of finding a partner for a quick rustle in the undergrowth.

But one garden slug species has turned this chore into art - a flamboyant celebration of a lack of independence. The spotted and striped Leopard Slugs start their performance by chasing each other around a tree, giving each other sonic, sensuous strokes and cheeky nibbles. Then they



climb, shimmy along a branch, and descend on a rope made of their own mucous. Here, hanging in mid-air, the slugs evert their sexual organs, entwining them to create a moonlit globe. This graceful, balletic trapeze performance must be one of the most mesmerising sights on our planet. If you search hard enough, you can find beauty in the strangest places. Still, if I was strolling through the woods at night, I'd hate to walk into it facefirst.

DITCHLING CLIMATE ACTION NET-WORK BIKE SWARM On Saturday 23rd September, members of Ditchling and Hassocks community met to raise awareness of the dangers of the stretch of road joining the two villages. A large number of people set off from Ditching School and slowly cycled or walked together to Hassocks in a bid to encourage East Sussex County Council to improve road safety along the Keymer Straight.

In 2018 a Sustrans report recommended that a new cycle and footpath, separated from the road by the hedge, be constructed. Since then, there has been no action by East Sussex County Council, in spite of increasing use of the road. Concerns remain over the dangers to cyclists and pedestrians using the road, many of whom are school children, from fast traffic.

Approximately 100 members of the community attended the event and made the journey by bike or on foot from Ditchling School to Hassocks Saturday Market.

Local MP Maria Caulfield also attended the event to show her support, along with local councillor Sarah Osborne.

The bike swarm was a huge success in raising

awareness of the current safety issues of the road between Ditchling and Hassocks and putting pressure on the Council to take action. A concerned Ditchling parent at the event reported "My son used to cycle from Ditchling to Downlands School, but I stopped him after another parent told me they'd seen a car speed right up to his back wheel and stay there all the way down the Keymer straight. It's just too dangerous".

Another bike swarm participant exclaimed "It felt great to come together with our children and our community to highlight the dangers of the Keymer Straight and show how many people want to be walking or cycling more, if the road was made safer".
