NEWS FROM STONEYWISH We seem to have given up sunshine for Lent. No need for further privation. Almost every day this month has dawned drear and grey or has been quickly scumbled over with cloud and the crocuses have come and gone and the early daffodils have been flattened in mud and the birds have sat mute through squall after squall and the farm paths are reduced to slop and where are the 'joys of spring'? Such grouchiness, on my part, is doubtless physiological and stems from sunshine deficiency. There is simply not enough colour in the world! Nature's palette is cold. And greyness eats into the mind, no matter how much one tries to look on the bright side. After all, bright grey is still grey! No wonder the Bulgarians used to tie red ribbons around their farmyards at the beginning of March to remind them of the colour of the heart - Nature's stirring lifeblood. No wonder all traditional farming communities once performed stamping dances to awaken Earth from its winter slumber, or lit spring bonfires to encourage the sun. Europeans used to participate in the cosmic cycles of growth and decay, with festivals and rituals, never taking things too much for granted, for Famine, along with Auntie Smallpox and Bogies and Ghosties, haunted the hinterland of the mind then, just as we now have Global Warming, and Bird 'Flu and The Bomb. But the Earth, for all that, was felt to be con-

scious and alive, pregnant with new life, a presence to be fed and plied with gifts - a relative in time of need. Human life was inextricably woven into the complex of vibrations which made up the 'music of the spheres' – or the cosmic dance which animated every level of existence. "As above, so below," says the ancient hermetic author of The Emerald Tablet. Such influences flow either way. Hence the old resurrection myths enacted in the Christmas Mumming Plays and the symbolic celebration of new life in the miniature cornfields or bowls of sprouted grain which decorate family tables for Persian New Year. They remind the cosmos of what is needed, but they hearten the participants too, for feeling or believing these connections can make all the difference between living alienated or integrated lives. Which is better, to master and determine one's environment, or accept and lose oneself in it? Rationalists favour detachment. Lovers are lost in awe. At any moment one can move from one mindset to the other. But our ancient ancestors inherited a culture of belonging and for them it was simply assumed that every star, tree, rock, river was animated with spirit. They could send messages to these spirits and know that they would be read. They could love them and receive their love. Likewise, they could offend them and arouse their wrath. Mother Earth was one spirit you really needed to have

on your side, so feeding her, dancing and singing to her, celebrating her beauty, were critically important. I have just bought an old coin as a present for a friend who has become interested in Roman history. The coin depicts the head of an Emperor's wife, Salinina. c.206 A.D. On the obverse is a goddess with a child. The lettering around her reads: Fecunditas, and she holds a cornucopia, the familiar symbol of abundance, spilling fruit and flowers. This is the famous horn of the goat-nymph Amalthea, who suckled Zeus when he was a baby. Fecunditas, fertility, is a term sadly tainted in our day with negative concepts: with over-population, or with hormone disruption. Fertilisers are either beleaguered bees whose colonies keep on collapsing, or chemical 'improvers' which leave the planet with toxic slag-heaps and depleted soils. But fecundity is the joy of spring – the magic that drives the birds to sing, as soon as there is a break in the weather; the miracle of life in every seed. Rather than worrying about how things should or shouldn't be, perhaps I should be reaching out to whatever is simply there. Abandon the expectation for something more and befriend what is. According to the explorer Benedict Allen, the native peoples he has met in some of the world's most challenging environments do not see their lands as hostile, or wild, or nadequate. They see them simply as home – places which provide them with what they need to survive. These people *are* their landscape. They do not seek to escape until they catch the white man's disease and, taking off their forest, become dispossessed. In Hawai'i, the tradition of Aloha 'Aina binds the people to their land with the breath of love. Traditionally, wearing the flowers, the grasses of their surroundings, they became part of the fertility of the land. Aloha – the practice of opening the heart and sharing the breath with for their own kind - created a powerful sense of community which nurtured life. Where such traditions have been broken, the land begins to suffer. Fecunditas fails. Pierre Rabhi, the Algerian visionary, who pioneered the practice of Agroecology on his organic farm in France, and then set up

programmes in Sub-Saharan Africa to restore soils consumed by the desert, found a way to tap into Earth's self-renewing fertility. His secret? This same Aloha. The poetry of love. Inspired by the oasis home of his childhood, he realised that trees, which hold the key to life, are, like Amalthea's horn, rivers of life, and that we might be the same. "Trees," he said in an interview, (my translation), "are the fleece of our earth. Observe a tree at close quarters and if your senses are truly awake you will feel that it reaches for the sky. It captures energy. Earth in its cosmic complexity, is endowed with several means of communication and a tree is one of the most obvious. It is not just cellulose, a physiological mechanism for exchanging oxygen and carbon gas. There is within it a living being, something which raises up a kind of magic. The role of the tree is really to connect earth and sky. It is also the protector of the earth and that is why we ourselves must protect it... I maintain that a tree is nothing less than a manifestation of the earth itself, reaching towards the sky." Trees moderate the weather, they harvest water, they condition the soil and they are beautiful companions. They provide a home for birds, animals, insects. They lift the spirits – nourish the soul. "And yet we massacre them," says the interviewer. "We massacre all creatures," says Rabhi. "Every time we maltreat a tree, we injure

ourselves. Every time we cut a tree without real need; we deliver an axe-blow to ourselves." A tree embodies the miracle of Fecunditas. And a seed is the beginning and end of all. "Give me one grain of corn," says Rabhi "and I can feed the world." There is just one impediment, however: the greed which makes humans crave ever more, turning them into 'hoggers of the harvest'. This greed, the creed of EVER MORE, is antithetical to Rabhi's belief that "Life promotes life". Unaware that trees are the guardians of life, modern mankind allows them to be casually destroyed. Never before has society officially endorsed what amounts to a war on Amalthea, interfering in the integrity and viability of all life forms, including seeds, essentially in pursuit of profit. The cornucopia represented Nature's limitless generosity. In folklore the abuse of such a gift appears in 'killing the goose that laid the golden egg' or milking a magic cow into a sieve. Not sharing is the ultimate crime. Is it too late for the West's 'hungry ghosts' to curb their appetites? To decline the assets which industry fashions for them out of global plunder, and determine instead to become nourishers, givers, not takers, and recognise the sovereignty of the living things around them? To be gracious and respectful, even when such things seem to be in the way? Old tree stumps, muddy puddles, clumps of weed – all are home to someone and that 'someone' might be the vital link for an unseen community, which includes us too. The Highland Maya of Guatamala welcomed the forest into their gardens, because the forest brought with it the vigour that their cultivars needed to survive. This kind of hospitality was accompanied by gifts of chocolate and beads at any place where the spirits of the earth might accept them. Back in Hawai'i, Kumu Micah Kamahoali'i's Auntie welcomed the lava from a nearby volcano. Yes, she said placidly on the telephone, she could see the flow, which was making

Work has already started with Monday Group and SDNP volunteers clearing much of the bracken and brambles that have been choking less invasive native species on Lodge Hill.

Proposals to introduce more trees and new ponds to improve drainage of the site are also being considered.

Hassocks Junior Football Club which provides footballing activities to over 300 youth players of Hassocks and the surrounding communities recently donated all their previous football kit to children and young people in Ghana, Africa. The Street to School project where football plays a big part for children in helping them access education and healthcare is called Akwaaba Volunteers.

They give it everything and appreciate every opportunity they get to play football."

He also found it moving to see how much the young people appreciated being given a kit and acknowledged the great work done by the project to give children in poverty opportunities to learn and thrive, all through playing football.



Here were gannets dive bombing into the waters and storm petrels bobbing on the waves. 

Dressing up to look their best, they imagined stepping on board Titanic, dancing and experiencing life as a passenger travelling in either 1st, 2nd or 3rd class. Each child had been researching a real Titanic passenger and saw life on board through their eyes. JK Theatre Arts led a drama and dance workshop for us and we were so impressed by the children's acting and role-playing skills, their thirst for knowledge and empathy for the characters. Back in class, we wrote postcards home to our loved ones and produced some wonderful artwork of the ship. At the end of the day, we shared scenes from our day and enjoyed watching each class perform a dance to either a waltz, ragtime jazz or Irish jig.

To enhance and bring alive their space topic, Year 5 visited the Science Museum. The 'Exploring Space' exhibition on the ground floor was a sight to behold and the children immediately got started on a treasure hunt, finding objects around the room. This ranged from the giant Apollo II to perhaps the strangest object; a 'space nappy'! We also climbed to the very top of the museum to experience the brilliant 'Flight' exhibition, full of fascinating aircraft and aeronautical inventions. We were also lucky enough to experience an educational show - Mission to Space - which was filled with amazing experiments, rockets and even some pyrotechnics!

Year 6 are fully engrossed in their history topic at the moment, with World War II as the focus of our learning. So far, we have learnt about; the state that Germany was in after World War I, The Treaty of Versailles and Hitler's rise to power, Britain's declaration of war, and two of the three *key* turning points in World War II (Dunkirk and the Battle of Britain). The children have been debating which of these turning points was more of a success story for Britain, weighing up the advantages and disadvantages of both events.

Our Year 6 basketball team attended the Sussex county-wide basketball finals in Littlehampton. After some exceptional victories and one hard-fought draw we fell to a narrow defeat at the very last hurdle leaving us Sussex-county runners up: 2nd out of 232 primary schools! We are so proud of these incredible basketballers for their incredible commitment to the sport. '

The new Asian hornet is brown and has ONLY 1 YELLOW STRIPE near its tail end. It has YELLOW legs and is slightly smaller than the European. But it is nasty, can be aggressive and will destroy bee hives. If you happen to see one, **please don't kill it.**.but trap it under a glass (so we can try to trace the nest it came from), then ring Ken Isted **01273 842458**, Heather McNiven **01825 722066** or Manek Dubash **07762 312592** or Notify the Great British Non Native Species Secretariat (NNSS) immediately. This is becoming an emergency that beekeepers do not need. Neither do you.



THE SOUTH DOWNS

I love heading out at the weekends for a hike over the Downs - but 90 million years ago, this part of the planet wouldn't have been a safe place to be. I'd have been busy avoiding the teeth of hungry aquatic predators like the 10-metre-long Mosasaurs as I cruised through a shallow sea. But it would be much smaller, less fearsome prehistoric organisms that would shape Sussex. The calcium shells from microscopic marine algae slumped to the sea floor and millions of years of pressure and erosion moulded them into the curvaceous chalk hills that form the familiar foundations of the South Downs.

It only feels like yesterday (well, about 6,500 years ago) that we humans showed up and got to work. The wild Sussex woods were chopped down and eventually sheep grazing became the dominant activity on the cleared hills for many centuries. The sheep-nibbled short downland turf is an internationally rare habitat, rich in flowers and the creatures that depend on them.

And, as chalk downland is such a rare habitat, the species that live here are also uncommon. Our butterflies are a prime example. Species like the Grayling, Silver-spotted Skipper, Small Blue, Adonis Blue and Chalk Hill Blue are restricted to this special habitat.

But it's not just wildlife that benefits. Those porous chalk hills filter, store, and provide us with most of our water. They also offer loads of other free services from flood prevention to pollination and food production. The open countryside around Sussex also offers us immeasurable physical, mental and spiritual benefits. The South Downs were designated a National Park in 2011.

While writing this article, I discovered a letter penned in 1915 by the Lewes naturalist, W.E. Nicholson, expressing concern for the future of the South Downs around Lewes, and especially the rare Adonis Blue butterfly and scarce Forester Moth that live there. I'd like to think that Mr. Nicholson would be re-assured to know that, more than a century later, his beloved Lewes Downs, butterflies and moths are still just where he left them and all flourishing under the care of Sussex Wildlife Trust on their reserves at Malling Down and Southerham.

Sussex Wildlife Trust is a conservation charity for everyone who cares about nature in Sussex. Founded in 1961, we have worked with local people for over half a century to make Sussex richer in wildlife.

It's a funny thing how some things you remember so clearly as if they happened yesterday when other more important events seemed to drop into the memory ravine never to be remembered again. I only mention this because when I was at school our history teacher was Wing Commander Smith a lot of ex-servicemen re trained as teachers after the war. He was a kind patient man who soon lost his temper if he thought you weren't concentrating. To be honest maths was not my favourite subject mainly because I wasn't very good at it, as far as I was concerned once I had learnt my times table it was job done. On the plus side I became an excellent blackboard rubber dodger probably the only thing I ever came top of my class in! However, I did enjoy history very much and it was a lot more interesting than maths especially when we did Roman Britain, that was a remarkable era. Did you know the Romans invented self repairing concrete something which we've never been able to replicate mainly because we can't work out how they did it. What I'm leading up to in a very convoluted way is the Romans were very good at communication they were forever sending messages. After the Roman invasion of Britain probably a few years into it, one of Caesar's top generals, whose name I can't remember, Maximus Peronius probably, sent a message home to Caesar detailing several important issues but ending with a question, "Why on earth did we invade this country all it does is rain and morale is very low?" He wrote two books in his early 20's -Craven House and Two Pence Coloured - which were moderately successful but his first real success was a play called Rope - this taut psychological thriller was eventually made into a film directed by Alfred Hitchcock and starring James Stewart. He also wrote Gaslight and Hanover Square both made into films and hugely successful but it's the film Gaslight which has provided the world with the term gaslighting which we now know is a term used to describe the process where individuals can be manipulated so that they lose their resilience and question their own perception of reality and make them think they're going mad. At his peak in the 1930's he was one of Britain's most successful authors with vast global sales and he was born in Hassocks.

Anthony Patrick Hamilton playwright and novelist who invented the term 'gaslighting' died aged 58 on the 23rd September 1962, perhaps we can persuade the owners of the new development when it's built to call it Hamilton Place?
