

NEWS FROM STONEYWISH Well, the country saying is 'February fill-dyke' and this month has certainly done its best to live up to its reputation. Though lucky compared with no other regions, here in Sussex we have had our own share of floods and gales. The streams at Stoneywish are swollen, the ponds brimming. Spatham pond has burst its bank and half-emptied into the Bevan stream and the ground is temporarilv too wet for any work in the Farm Centre. Instead, we have turned to the sad task of felling ash trees stricken with ash die-back disease. The feeling is palpable here, as in many places, that all is not well with our environment. This is gloomy talk for new year and, like other observers. I am reluctant to use that word 'environment' which suggests are disconnected between humans at the centre of things and the rest of the natural world, a kind of suburb or encircling envelope. As I see it, we are the suburb too, part and parcel, and if something is wrong there it is most probably wrong here too. Einstein stated that it was impossible to solve a problem by employing the same thought processes which had created the problem in the first place. If he was right, we cannot stay fixed in our rationalist mental citadel and 'fix' anything out there. Ancient Chinese Taoist teaching encourages attuning one's life to the energy or 'flow' of Nature. In Chinese medicine, the body is a world in miniature with its own



internal weather systems. Health is determined by the balance of inner heat, damp or wind. Too much fire or too much water brings disease. For the Highland Mayans of Guatemala each individual was a microcosm, with bones for rocks, blood for rivers, muscles for animals and so on. The task of each villager was to feed Life (with a capital L) by creating and sustaining pathways of beauty in his or her own small life. All were challenged to remember their cosmic origins so that they would be fit to return there one day. These views from other cultures, fanciful as they may seem to a Western mind, offer reassuring alternatives to our own often bleak world-view. When the newsreaders and weather forecasters have finished their dismal reports, we need space and calm to explore our own more positive connections to the world which gives us life. For Nature is surely more than wallpaper to enhance our holiday snaps, or a mat for us to exercise on, or a fridge for us to raid. It is, acknowledged or not, the intelligent source and substance of our own nerves and molecules. The ash trees, the flood-waters and even corona virus, are surely telling us that the world is not static, inert, or bound by our mental equations. At a casual glance, the sick ash trees looked sound before they were felled, but each log reveals a black spot at its core where the rot has taken hold. Left to run its course. the disease will kill a strong tree in a couple of years

when the entire trunk may, without warning, crash to the ground. The Chinese dictum of 'strong outside rotten inside' does not need spelling out. Eco-systems which show small signs of disturbance may actually be in deep trouble, for everything depends on the tiny interactions we are often too busy to notice. The humblest weeds and insects turn out to be the capillaries which feed the heart of the whole and if you have once experienced their mysterious ministry it becomes almost impossible to justify disrupting them. COMMON SEAL - HERE BE MONSTERS Legend has it that it's been visiting Lewes for years. There have been sightings from Southease all the way up to Barcombe. In January, John glimpsed it vanishing into the murky waters of the River Ouse near Tesco. A few months later, Barry was on his way to work when he encountered the creature hauled out on a pontoon by the Cuilfail cliffs. You'll find 38 species of wild mammal living in or around Lewes. Badgers, foxes, stoats, weasels, shrews, rabbits, hares, moles, voles, dormice, bats, rats, hedgehogs, mice and mink all form the mammalian fauna of a landlocked South Downs town. Yet there's one salty surprise on the list; the Common Seal, an animal that's typically found in Britain's coastal waters 12 kilometres away.

And the seal's certainly a surprise to any Lewes residents who, while innocently strolling along the Ouse, encounter their local leviathan. I've never seen the legendary beast myself but have received plenty of excited tweets, emails and mobile phone photos from amazed observers who can't believe what they've seen. Throughout history, sailors (without the benefit of smartphones and a Twitter account) have confused seals for mermaids and sea serpents and, as Sussex mammals go, this seal is a real monster.

Common Seals can weigh up to 150 kg; twice the weight of a Fallow Deer, the second biggest wild mam-



mal in this area (and 50,000 times heavier than the smallest; the Pygmy Shrew). As you'd imagine, on land this blubbery behemoth is about as agile as Peter Ustinov trapped in a sleeping bag but underwater they're as balletic as Baryshnikov, gracefully swimming at speeds of up to 25 mph as they hunt fish, shell-fish, squid and octopus.

It's this quest for food that occasionally leads seals into Sussex rivers such as the Ouse and the Arun as they follow fish migrating upstream. Common Seals breed in Sussex, where there is a colony at Chichester Harbour. It's a sink or swim situation for seal pups born on the sandbanks exposed during the low tides of summer. Their aquatic life starts as the next high tide rolls in and within hours of their birth they're swimming in the Solent alongside their mother. Mother's milk helps them to double their birth weight in just a few weeks. The name 'common' is a bit of a misnomer. In British waters you're three times more likely to see their larger. Roman-nosed relative the Grev Seal. The patterns on each seal's fur are as individual as fingerprints. Keep an eye out when you're next walking by along a Sussex riverbank and see if a seal is giving the river its approval.



HASSOCKS TOWNSWOMEN GUILD Members of the Hassocks Townswomen's Guild met for their first meeting of the New Year on the 28th January.

It was a pleasure to welcome back Mr Tony Turner whose expected talk on the construction of the Suez Canal had to be postponed due to technical difficulties but replaced by a fascinating account of the fortunes of the famous Tea Clipper, the Cutty Sark. Built in 1869, the vessel had a chequered career, initially sailing to China with general cargo and returning to England with a consignment of tea, running into many tons. Built for speed, although she was not quite the fastest clipper on the China Tea Run. Cutty Sark collected her final tea cargo in 1877 and from then traded in general cargo such as coal and wool and other commodities. She was then sold to a Portuguese company and renamed Ferreira.

She returned to England after being purchased from her last owners by a retired sea captain who in 1923 restored her to her original name, and subsequently gifted her to the Thames Nautical Training College.

Now fully restored after a disastrous fire in 2007 she was reopened to the public in 2012 and can be seen in Greenwich.

After a vote of thanks to Mr Turner for his excellent talk, tea was served and the raffle drawn.

Although I had heard that one in four people will die from heart disease I was always convinced that I would not be one of them. In February last year I was fit, exercised regularly, had a good diet, had low cholesterol, a low heart rate and low blood pressure. Then one day I came back from jogging round Hurstpierpoint and experienced severe palpitations in my chest.

I quickly found myself in the care of the brilliant cardiac team in the Royal Sussex Hospital in Brighton. Over the next fortnight they carried out numerous tests on me using an array of extraordinary equipment and finally decided to install in my chest a very high tech ICD pacemaker. They also put me on a drug to steady my heartbeat, and blood thinners to discourage the possibility of blood clots which might lead to a stroke.

Since then I have learnt that funding from the British Heart Foundation went into the development of the first pacemakers, the development of clot-busting drugs and statins and much much more. Today the British Heart Foundation is funding more than half of all research into heart and circulatory disease in this




country. There is still much to be understood about the heart and circulatory diseases like strokes and vascular dementia, their causes, prevention and treatment.

I was so pleased when my wife, Julie Roberts, and pianist, Michael Hinton instantly agreed to do a charity afternoon concert for the British Heart Foundation and that Richard Burrows offered the wonderful venue of the great hall in Danny House in Hurstpierpoint for the concert. I am grateful too to the British Heart Foundation volunteers who are helping with this project.

I know everyone who comes to the concert will really enjoy a programme of great songs wonderfully sung and performed. I am looking forward to a memorable and very worthwhile occasion.

PROSTATE CANCER AWARENESS MONTH:

March is Prostate Cancer Awareness Month. Organised by Prostate Cancer UK, this special month aims to raise awareness of prostate cancer, as well as raise money so the charity can provide even better support to both sufferers and their families.

The prostate (found only in men), is located just below the bladder and produces some of the fluid in semen. The prostate fluid protects sperm during intercourse. While the prostate often enlarges as men get older, for many men it doesn't cause any problems.

Prostate cancer is important because of the total number of men nationally and worldwide that are affected. Prostate cancer affects 40.000 men in the UK every year. It is estimated that 250,000 men in the UK live with prostate cancer but sadly 10,000 of them will die of the disease each year. It is most common in older men with the majority of newly diagnosed men in their 70s to 80s. It is rare for men to have prostate cancer under the age of 50.

There are strong familial links in prostate cancer with men being two and a half times more likely to get prostate cancer if their brother has prostate cancer. Black Caribbean or black African men have three times greater risk than white men.

The common symptoms of prostatic enlargement are reduced urine flow, increased number of day and night voids, urgency, hesitancy at the start and a persistent dribble towards the end of urine flow. However, these symptoms merely indicate an increase in prostate size and not of the nature of this

enlargement and are therefore a poor indicator for the presence of cancer.

If you are suffering from any of these symptoms, the prostate can be assessed with a rectal examination, which will highlight if the prostate is enlarged, and a blood test. The higher the score of the PSA (Prostate Specific Antigen) then the higher the risk of cancer being present. This test is a good indicator but not always conclusive and further tests may be required.

It comes as figures show more than half of men don't actually know where their prostate is. It's the second biggest cancer killer in men.


