TO EVERYTHING THERE IS A SEASON' - and the audio version of Talk About has come to the end of its season. This April edition will be the last one to be recorded for visually impaired readers. Sixteen years ago, a blind man suggested that an audio version of such a useful source of local information should be included in the Village Action Plan. As a result, a group of volunteers without funds, but rich in enthusiasm and ingenuity, launched 'Talk About on Tape' in time for the Queen's Jubilee. Dennis Walmsley fitted up a studio mainly from equipment salvaged from skips, and he and Simon Brown became responsible for the monthly recording sessions. Friends and Neighbours provided the cassettes, the Yews Talking News in Haywards Heath gave Simon access to their expensive copying machine, and a rota of volunteer readers was quickly formed. At its zenith, Talk about on Tape reached the great majority of registered blind and partially sighted people in Hassocks and Ditchling and later, Hurstpierpoint.

Why then, are we closing down? The reason is simple: we have been overtaken by technology. All talking newspapers are having the same experience. Although we now record on memory sticks as cassettes are obsolete, there is little demand for the service. The range of audio services is vast compared with 16 years ago. Happily there have also been significant medical advances. More people are retaining useful vision so all the enlarging facilities on tablets and PC's are open to them as well as audio. Talk About itself went on line at the beginning of this year so our listeners can access it direct.

Edward Culpepper, a distant relative of Thomas Culpepper the famous herbalist commissioned the mansion in 1590 on land previously purchased by William de Wakehurst which evidence has been discovered of Stone Age and Iron Age activities (charcoal burning) and Roman (iron smelting). The mansion was then sold on to Dennys Lydell, Commissioner for the Navy in the reign of Charles II for a purchase price of £9,000. The sale being necessary to cover a Culpepper family member's gambling debts. Over the years the mansion was taken over by other incumbents, each putting their own individual mark on the property, the last being Sir Henry Price (the 'Fifty Shilling Taylor') and his wife Lady Eve, who in 1965 bequeathed the manor to the National Trust.

The manor played it's part in WWII, having been taken over by the War Office in 1939. It then became the HQ for the Canadian Army and HQ for the planning of the D Day landings. Recently an underground radio station and several relics from WWI have been located in the gardens.

Wakehurst is now managed by Royal British Gardens with the Millennium Seed Bank opening in 2000, now holding approximately 25% of the world's species and by contrast a yew tree is still standing in the garden which has been

HASSOCKS WI Our February meeting was rubbish! Literally! Who would have thought an evening on waste management and recycling could be so entertaining and enlightening.

A year ago the WI passed a resolution to reduce 'plastic soup', the plastic pollution in our waterways, and partly this meeting was intended as a practical follow-up to that. Firstly, Gerry reported on a WI conference on how washing our synthetic clothes is contributing to microplastic pollution, and showed us a Cora Ball, one of the devices produced to collect the microplastic fibres before they enter the waterways. Then Matthew Bird, from Mid Sussex District Council, gave us an overview of how our waste collections are managed. Even our black bins are screened for recycling, and much of the contents is burnt to produce heat and power, so less goes to landfill. Colin McFarlane is a West Sussex Waste Advisor, and in a lively presentation tested our knowledge of recycling and food storage. Being WI, of course we did quite well, but all of us learnt something, and we left with a new determination to reduce our use of plastics of all sorts, and waste in general. We will be examining labels to avoid buying products containing microplastics why would hair conditioner or shower gel need microplastics? - and trying to buy less and reuse and recycle more. A group of ladies shopped at Tesco, then (with the knowledge and approval of the manager) removed all the unnecessary packaging, most of which went into the store's collection skips for plastic waste. This is an on-going concern, and we

MALE CANCER AWARENESS WEEK - 8th April The eleventh Orchid Male Cancer Awareness Week will take place from the 8th to 14th April. This important annual

campaign raises awareness of male specific cancers prostate, testicular and penile cancer - providing practical advice, support and information on the detection, diagnosis and treatment of these diseases.

Many men who develop prostate cancer don't develop any symptoms at all. But getting up at night as well as going very frequently and perhaps rushing to the loo, those are all the common symptoms of any prostate problem. Prostate Cancer is a very serious disease and in fact it's the second most common cause of men dying from cancer in the UK. If men do have symptoms it's very worthwhile having this sort of problem excluded. It comes as figures show more than half of men don't actually know where their prostate is. It's the second biggest cancer killer in men.

Most men's testicles are about the same size, though it's common for one to be slightly bigger than the other. It's also common for one testicle to hang lower than the other. The testicles should feel smooth, without any lumps or bumps, and firm but not hard. You may feel a soft tube at the back of each testicle, which is called the epididymis. If you notice any changes or anything unusual about your testicles, you should get checked out.

The Club, which raises substantial funds for charities and local sport every year, was prompted to install the defibrillator partly by a late-member, Dan Erssler, who brought the idea forward after losing his brother suddenly, and also because committee members were anxious to fund something that everyone in Hassocks could have access to.

Chairman David Price explained, "We are keen to play our part in improving life in the village and we can't think of a better way than potentially saving someone's life. We have a great location here in Adastra Park, with many people using the park itself daily, while we are a couple of minutes' walk away from the High Street. We hope this never gets used but we are committed to maintaining it for the village from now on".

He went on, "We're ever so grateful to Burgess Hill District Lions and the Rotary Clubs for their help in this. The Lions not only came up with half of the money themselves but in their officer Tony Parris they brought loads of experience of how to organise and manage the installation. They were absolutely invaluable in helping us achieve this aim"

OUT, STANDING IN THEIR FIELD For sheep, life is like one long festival. They're either stood crowded together in a muddy field in the rain or running around in the sun trying to find the best grass. Next time you're walking around Lewes town centre look up at Sussex Wildlife Trust's Malling Down nature reserve and you'll see my woolly colleagues living the good life. But don't be fooled. They're actually hard at work on the most important construction job in Sussex; making perfect chalk downland.

You can keep your tropical rainforests and your underwater reefs, for me chalk downland is the world's number one natural wonder. This rare habitat supports an extraordinary diversity of wildlife and it's right on our doorstep.

Paradoxically, wildlife-rich chalk downland is a man-made creation (well, credit where credit's due – a sheep-made creation). Since around 800 AD sheep grazing has created and maintained our county's iconic downland landscape. The short, sheep-nibbled turf is perfect for Adonis blue butterflies, burnt orchids and a multitude of other wonderful wildlife. But, like rainforests and reefs, it's under threat; one of the main issues being neglect. Turn your back on downland and it mutates into long grass, brambles and thorn bushes and the butterflies and orchids vanish under the cold shadows.

Sheep are our best defence against this prickly invasion. Every bite and every hoof print creates downland with an ideal varied structure – impossible to create by uniform mowing. We have various rare sheep breeds in our grazing

army stationed near Lewes at Southerham: Hebrideans, Wiltshire Horns, Southdowns, but my favourite sheep, baa none, are the Herdwicks.

Like all heroes, the Herdwick's origins are shrouded in mystery. Some folk say they came to Britain with marauding Vikings. There's some that say that the Herdwicks swam ashore after escaping the sinking Spanish Armada. Their ancestral home is the Lake District – it's claimed that 95% of the world's Herdwicks live within 15 miles of Coniston.

They're tough sheep; hard grazin' hell-raisers who are at home in harsh, hilly landscapes. If you like your sheep white and fluffy then you've come to the wrong field. Herdwicks are born black and develop white heads and legs as they mature. Their grey, wiry wool has an insulating undercoat – perfect attire for English hilltops. Feeding amongst thorns and thickets can leave their coats looking torn and tatty but this isn't a cause for concern, just proof that they're hard at work. For Herdwicks, grazing is a passion - not a fashion show.





BETTER BIKING: LINKING DITCHLING HAS-SOCKS & HURST As you may recall HKD Transition are plugging away at trying to make the main road (B2116) from the centre of Ditchling to the centre of Hurst friendlier to cyclists for getting to the station, to school and to the shops.

The feasibility study of how this could be done has been completed and has been with officers of Mid Sussex District Council since October 2018.

DITCHLING DOWNS WI Catharine introduced the speaker, Dorothy Porter who was with us to describe her work with the Samaritans. This is a registered charity aimed at providing support for anyone in emotional distress or at risk of suicide. It was founded in 1953, by a vicar whose inspiration came from when he conducted the funeral of a 14 year old girl who had killed herself, not realising that the bleeding she had experienced was actually perfectly normal menstruation. The movement grew rapidly, now with 201 branches across the UK and Ireland, with over 2,000 volunteers, all of whom have been rigorously trained to be nonjudgemental and empathetic. They do not advise as such, but have excellent listening skills; they help people to explore their own feelings and work out their own way forward. They have a strict code of confidentiality. The Samaritans telephone helpline operates 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. On average, Samaritans receive over 5 million calls a year, one every 6 seconds. Dorothy described some of the work she has carried out in Lewes prison, where prisoners are trained as "listeners", so they can support other prisoners. In some cases, the prison "listeners", on their release from prison, later become trained as Samaritans themselves.

Our speaker for April will be Barbara Ehlers with the title "Silversmith". Guests are always welcome to attend up to three meetings a year before becoming a member and a small donation is suggested.

HURSTPIERPOINT SINGERS (1950 – 2019) It is with a sense of sadness that we report the demise of this once-thriving village choral society. Founded in 1950 by a small group of like-minded friends, by the mid 1960's it had a membership of 36, employing a paid conductor and accompanist. Rehearsals took place in the Parish Room. The Singers were a contributory choir of the Lewes Music Festival, coming together with others each year, to sing a major choral work under the baton of nationally known Guest Conductors.

Financial considerations led to the choir becoming part of the local Adult Education Programme, with termly fees going to the District Council and rehearsals re-locating to St. Lawrence School. However, continuing growth in numbers allowed the choir to become independent and self-sufficient again and acquire charitable status with the objective of "educating the public in the art and science of music". Rehearsals then moved to the Music School at Hurst College and in the mid 1980 / 90's, membership reached its peak at just under 80. Thereafter numbers began to decline, in spite of becoming part of the West Sussex Festival Chorus, several recruitment drives and a move to a more central rehearsal venue at Hurst Methodist Church. From 52 in 2004 the membership has dropped to just over 20 - an unsustainable critical mass for the type of music performed, resulting in the decision to disband.

Over the years the choir has sung from a wide repertoire;

from "Jingle Bells" to Handel's "Messiah"; from Hurd's "Hip Hip Horatio" to Haydn's "Creation"; from Bach's "Peasant Cantata" to Britten's "Ceremony of Carols"; from opera choruses to Janacek's "Otcenas"; from Stanford's "Bluebird" to Coleridge Taylor's "Hiawatha" etc. etc. The choir has performed in village halls and the Albert Hall, in local churches and in Arundel Cathedral and abroad. In general, concerts have been well received and in this respect, the Singers would like to record their thanks to the loyal audiences for their support over the years.

It is hoped to hold a wake later this year, when the weather improves, when former Singers can re-unite in a party atmosphere to celebrate the 69 years of Hurstpierpoint Singers' music making.

BE AFRAID, BE VERY AFRAID This horror film warning means a dreadful disaster is imminent. The only reason that it was not heard at a crowded meeting of environmental groups in Horsham in February was that it was too close to the truth for comfort. They had met because of grim reality: time was running out for the human race. Climate change was rapidly becoming climate breakdown. Only by reducing carbon emissions could we prevent 'runaway and irreversible climate change'. We had only eleven years left to achieve this. Scientists predicted that 2030 would be crunch year.

year. The meeting was called by Sussex Green Living. The audience was packed with people responsible for an astonishing range of 'green' activities across Sussex and Surrey, ranging from Kinder Living Home Shows, community green space projects, kinder tech events (repairing lap tops and PC's) and a community fridge scheme to reduce food waste. Our Mid-Sussex villages, Hurstpierpoint, Hassocks, Keymer and Ditchling, were represented by HKD Transition. Alistair Whitby listed our solar energy projects with Network Rail and at Downlands School, our rain gardens, our food directory – there wasn't time for everything! All good and useful ways of reducing our carbon footprint, and replicated across Sussex, but rather resembling David and Goliath – though we all know who won in the end.

In break out groups members tried to identify how else we could press the urgency of the situation. – 'create action' was the buzz word. There was complete agreement that pressure must come from us – the 'ordinary people'. We dare not rely on central government. We must tell the truth about climate change clearly, calmly and frequently. There was a place for active, non-violent action. An increasing

number of towns and councils were marking their determination to 'create action' by declaring a climate emergency. Surely this could happen in Sussex?

With the May local government elections in the offing, there was opportunity to raise these issues with Councillors and candidates. It was agreed that we should demand that our councils should declare a state of climate emergency and undertake to review their activities with the aim of reducing carbon emissions. It was further agreed that the many groups represented should unite to achieve this and a steering committee was appointed to take this forward.

Swift action has followed. The South East Climate Alliance (https://seclimatealliance.uk/) has been formed representing 'green' groups across Sussex. We already have five Climate Reality Leaders in West Sussex, people trained under the Al Gore leadership scheme, qualified to speak on climate change and look at solutions, so we are off to a flying start. West Sussex County Council has been approached and a Motion laid which will be debated in April. In preparation, Councillor Kirsty Lord, our Hassocks representative on West Sussex County Council, is meeting with a group of HKD members in March.

High on the agenda will be ways in which we 'ordinary people' can influence the decision-makers. Should we be pressing for 'citizen's assemblies' where politicians, the public and experts meet on equal terms to assess evidence and agree targets? How can local authorities support local groups wishing to set up a repair café or to appoint 'Ditch wardens' to advise and help solve local flooding issues? We hope that our meeting in March will be the beginning, not the end, of the debate. Your ideas are welcome. Mail us on info@hkdtransition.org.uk.
