



NEWS FROM STONEYWISH One of the joys of this time of year is seeing the ponds and ditches full of fresh water on the Reserve. The leaf-spikes of yellow iris and the furled leaves of marsh marigold emerge from the depths, with the promise of new life. Damp margins everywhere are buzzing already with insects: bee flies, shiny beetles, ladybirds and sulphur butterflies, startled out of hibernation by the warmth of the sun. This is a time of year traditionally much concerned with water, for as the earliest farmers knew, water means life itself. For thousands of years, Spring dances and festivals across Europe called on the forces of nature to yield enough water for crops to grow. Rivers were gods. Every well and spring had its dedicated saint or water spirit which demanded respect. The water nymphs had power over life and death between Spring (when they emerged from their winter hibernation) and Harvest (when the crops were ripe). They haunted the fields and woods, dancing and combing life-giving moisture from their watery locks, and woe betide the foolish man who stumbled across their revels, for they represented the feminine principle of fertility and would not tolerate interference in their affairs. These water spirits, known as Willies in the Balkans (as in 'having the willies'), as Nereids in Greece and by a variety of local names in other countries, were held in honour and dread. All watery places



received their protection. And a calendar of 'superstitious' practices dedicated to them, persisted in many of these countries until enlightenment and science drove them, together with much of their water, underground. Today we put our faith in water companies. The marshes have gone and with them the midges and malaria which struck down those who wandered into them. Our water is safely sanitized, piped, and delivered directly to our homes without any terrors beyond the quarterly bill – but it seems the Willies have not quite finished with us. The Head of the Environment Agency last week warned of the 'existential threat' of a water shortage, which in 25 years, at our current rate of consumption, will expose the UK to catastrophe. At Stoneywish, we have seen this water problem developing for years. Water comes to our ponds already polluted and dries up in the summer. Alas. we have no spring here, though Michael's father dowsed for one, years ago. The wildlife, so abundant when groundwater is high, is inevitably affected. We look to government for a fix. More pipes. More reservoirs. More treatment works... But are we missing something? That water is not a commodity, after all, but something more miraculous, the life-giver venerated by our ancestors. What a disaster for a culture to think water's primary function is to be dirtied by humans and end up in a sewer, bypassing the environment altogether, or that we



BACK GARDEN BEETLEMANIA On 17th May Peter Hodge stood waiting at Lewes bus station when he noticed an intriguing little black beetle crawling on the brickwork. Peter, being one of Britain's top coleopterists (beetle experts), delicately picked up the little insect between his thumb and forefinger and took it with him. And so both passengers rode the 143 bus back to Ringmer and into the pages of Sussex wildlife history. Because when Peter examined the little beast under his microscope, he realised it was the click beetle Melanotus punctolineatus – the first one recorded in Sussex - making it the 3,000th species of beetle recorded in our county.

That little beetle may have been historic but it wasn't much to look at. To be honest, most of the other 2,999 Sussex beetles aren't going to win any Miss Beetle beauty contests either. But if it's good-looking beetles you want my friend then you need to take a trip to Arundel or Lewes this month because those towns are both famed for being a hotspot for the most glamorous beetle in Britain - the rose chafer.

The rose chafer is one seriously gorgeous insect. Each one looks like it's been designed, carefully crafted, coated in the most dazzling metallic green and hand polished. How can I put it? The rose chafer looks expensive. Their resemblance to Egyptian scarabs brings the romance of The Nile to your compost heap – a great place

for their C-shaped larvae to develop. The adult beetles live for just a few weeks.

They're powerful flyers too. Dark, smoky wings extend from under their emerald elytra (wing cases) and with a buzz our Faberge bugs take to the air. Admittedly they do tend to crash into fences quite a bit. I said it was beautiful, I didn't say it was graceful. Recently these beetles seem to have been crashing around in other areas of Sussey.

So this summer I'm starting a campaign to make Sussex the official rose chafer capital of England. I'd like you to look in your gardens and nearby parks for this stunning, shiny green beetle. If you see one, please try to take a picture and email it to my colleague Lois at the Sussex Biodiversity Record Centre with details of when and where you saw it (loismayhew@sussexwt.org.uk). HASSOCKS WI There was a good turnout, including several guests, at our March meeting, to hear a fascinating talk on the history of medicine in Sussex. Our speaker, Dr Hilary Morris, a medical historian attached to both Brighton and Sussex and London Medical Schools, concentrated on the many women who have contributed to the development of medical provision in Sussex. Traditionally, the sick were treated by 'wise women', who had a wealth of knowledge of medicinal herbs. At a time when a trained physician, if you could find one, would charge the equivalent of £600, these women were very important. However, in the 15th Century Archbishop Thomas Arundel made witchcraft illegal, resulting in many of these wise women being eliminated, often for ulterior motives. Women have traditionally been involved in nursing, but Sussex women such as Alethea Howard, wife of the Collector Earl of Arundel contributed greatly to scientific research in the early 17th century, Sarah Wardroper in the 1860s became Superintendent of the nursing school founded by Florence Nightingale, and in the early 1900s Octavia Wilberforce and Louisa Martindale became amongst the first women to train as doctors, and went on to found the

New Sussex Hospital for Women. We have many women to be thankful for, not least in recent years Lady Sarah Clutton who gave land for Chestnut Tree House Children's Hospice.

We now have a second, afternoon, book group. Regular groups have continued to meet, walking, singing, creative writing and baby station. The craft group have made many more heart-shaped cushions for ladies following breast surgery - we are told they are very much appreciated, and sadly there is always a need. We had a most informative talk on Powers of Attorney from Fiona Dodd, and by the time you read this, a visit will have taken place to Farley Farmhouse. This month we are looking forward to participating in the Hassocks May Day celebrations and some members are going to an Abba Concert at the Albert Hall followed by the Sky Garden. Preparations are also well under way for the South of England Show WI Craft entries in June. Best of all, this month we are 10 years old, and in true WI tradition we will be celebrating with a party. DITCHLING DOWNS WI Dr Anne Weaver was with us to speak on the subject "Emergency Medicine". She is a Consultant at London's Air Ambulance, and has had many years of experience. In 2004 she became the first female Consultant in Emergency Medicine and Pre-Hospital Care in the UK. In 2007, she became Lead Clinician for London's Air Ambulance, and cofounded the first Pre-Hospital Care Programme in the UK for medical students. She led the "Blood on Board" initiative that brought pre-hospital blood transfusion along the lines of battle fields to civilian medicine. Not only was this precedent set in London, but Anne also led the development of protocols on efficient blood storage and safe administration of blood transfusion for patients who are not yet in the hospital environment. This means that this innovation is available to any airambulance team, so that the same standards of care can be given to patients as they would get in hospital. The logic now is to get to a seriously ill patient as quickly as possible, with all the facilities that they need. In cities, there has been a dramatic reduction of seriously injured people bleeding to death, on the basis that the medical team can treat patients in the actual vicinity of an accident, in situations when patients would previously have died before reaching hospital. Such prompt treatment has saved a great many young lives in the reRemovalsStorage



HASSOCKS BEST KEPT SECRET Every Monday an elderly horse box chuggs up Station Approach and parks near the Hassocks Hotel. The driver, Ed Johnstone, leaps out, opens it and reveals a walk-in mobile farmers' market, stocking meat, fish, cheeses, breads and cakes, as well as a large array of organic fruit and vegetables. At 2 pm he is open for business, and will be there until 7 pm. Everything has been supplied by local farmers and growers: local food, farmed well, for local people.

Known as the Sussex Peasant, Ed is a man with a mission: to change the face of food retail. Only 1% of the food produced in the Home Counties ends up directly in local kitchens. The rest travels the country with only a proportion returning wearily to its place of origin. Can he do better? Can he renew the link between customer and grower by building up a co-operative of sustainable Sussex farmers and growers?

Starting in a small way through family contacts and then by word of mouth, he now has around twenty local suppliers in West and East Sussex. I visited in March, when the 'hungry gap', that bane of every peasant's life, was still in evidence. Yet there was spinach from Cuckfield as well as green and purple sprouting broccoli, all picked the day before, and, astonishingly, multi-coloured tomatoes from Nutbourne, six weeks early due to the February sunshine. In addition, every root vegetable you can



think of was on display – even the potatoes were organic. Soon they will be joined by all the salad crops and the soft fruits of summer.

'Pile it high and sell it cheap' is not part of Ed's ethos. He aims to supply local people with 'the very finest local and seasonal produce'. Prices appear to be comparable to those charged by the organic 'vegetable box' suppliers, but with the advantage of 'choosing your own on the spot'. Customers like what they see, for in 2018 their enthusiasm resulted in the Sussex Peasant being one of the finalists in the BBC Food and Farming Awards, an amazing achievement for such a young venture. This year he is a regional finalist for a 'rural Oscar' - the Countryside Awards scheme. He now has a team of five enthusiasts. and another van is on the road. On Fridays and at weekends they have six pitches in Brighton (details on www.thesussexpeasant.co.uk). Any surplus is donated to Brighton food bank.

If you are thinking of dinner party menus in May, look no further than the Sussex Peasant. South Down lamb from Barcombe, asparagus (weather permitting), followed by a compote of soft fruits with South Downs yoghurt, what's not to like? But a lovely fresh picked salad with a local cheese would be a treat at a more modest cost. I went home with a treacle tart made in Hartfield. The new Skate Park will be sited where the current skate ramps are in the south east corner of Adastra Park. The build will be constructed from sprayed concrete which is the most practical and resilient material for builds such as ours. The concrete takes time to cure which means that although the facility may look finished through the fences, until the fences are removed the Skatepark is not ready for use.

We will be operating a building site and access will be prohibited. Therefore whilst the build is in progress and the area fenced off, we would recommend that skaters use the nearby facilities in Burgess Hill, Lewes, Haywards Heath, Henfield and Brighton.

To keep everyone up to date with how the build is going, photos will be uploaded on the Council's website (www.hassocks-pc.gov.uk) showing the progress. Once completed, to celebrate the opening of the Skate Park there will be an official opening "Skate Jam" event, and details will be available soon.
