WAXWING - HOLD ONTO YOUR BERRIES Once there was a time when people believed that the rare appearance of a flock of waxwings was an evil omen; a portent of disaster, war or pestilence. Well, if Armageddon is the price I have to pay for a glimpse of one of these beautiful birds - then bring it on.

Waxwings are dumpy, starling-sized birds which look like something from a Beryl Cook painting – all silky curves, coiffured crests and heavy makeup. Imagine an orangey-brown hand grenade wearing eye shadow and you're almost there. Add to it black, white and yellow wings jazzed up with a row of shiny, scarlet teardrops. These waxy red feather tips, which give the bird its name, are believed to be used in courtship; the biggest and best wing-bling belonging to the older males.

Waxwings roam in gangs – you're more likely to see twelve than one. To be next to a berry-laden bush when a flock descends is akin to being sat in a quiet pub when a drunken hen party bursts through the door. Waxwings announce their arrival with high-pitched chattering and excited trills, and greedily squabble over berries as if they were fighting over half-price handbags in the January sales.

Waxwings love berries. They can eat their own bodyweight in just a few hours. Once this flock of feathered Pac-Men have chomped their way through one berry bush they fly off to ransack another. Their reliance on

berries is the cause of their irregular migrations or 'irruptions'. Every few years a failure in the berry crop in their eastern Scandinavian and northern Russian homeland sparks a winter-long, Europe-wide berry guzzling rampage which eventually leads them to our island. British 'waxwing winters' are by no means an annual event and we may go for years without seeing any waxwings in Sussex.

During some winters though, we hit the jackpot. At the start of November 2012 thousands of them arrived on the Northern Isles and throughout December the advancing waxwing tsunami surged south, binging on berries in Banff then Bolton then Birmingham then Bracknell. By mid-December they hit Sussex and flocks of the birds were reported all over the county. They're not fussy about where they dine; industrial estates, petrol station forecourts, parks and gardens - anywhere that can lay on a decent berry buffet. Out of town supermarkets have a habit of planting decorative berry bushes which attract waxwings. So look out for them over the coming weeks while you're shopping – you may find yourself an early Christmas present.

We know, or think we know all about rain. With constant updates from the experts, we are all meteorologists now. We do not even need to go outside

to see what the weather is doing. Somehow, over the vears, the child who dawdled to school, who had to touch the leaves or the iron railings on every walk, who instinctively put things in his or her mouth, just to see what they tasted like, who liked to bend over to see the novelty of the world upside-down between splayed legs, that child is educated out of its bliss and buried and lost beneath a heap of information. Life has become serious. So serious it is almost life-threatening! We are all worried to death. Life is also getting faster. So fast we can't keep up with ourselves. What are we to do? Scientists in Japan believe they have come up with an answer. The antidote to busy, competitive city-life is to spend time with nature. Sounds obvious, doesn't it? In Japan they call it shinrin-yoku – forest bathing. Two hours spent quietly communing with forest trees is enough, so medical researchers reveal, to lower blood pressure, improve mental function, lower blood sugar levels, boost the immune system and bring feelings of peace and happiness to subjects who were previously stressed to the hilt. Yes, yes, we know that. Aren't we going to the country? But for shinrin-yoku you have to leave all distractions at home: mobile phones, bicycles, pedometers, cameras, maps... You won't have time for them. You will be too busy drinking in the sights, sounds, smells, and tactile sensations of the world around you. Yes! Smelling the trees! Each one. now it is official: inhaling the aromatic chemicals they produce is one of the most calming and uplifting ways to enhance your health. Gradually, the curious child within, so long buried and left for dead, emerges, brighteyed and playful once more. In Japan the pine forests are particularly prized for their health-giving atmosphere. Forests are judged for the quality of their light, their fragrance, their rocks, the sound of their water-falls and birdsong.

Here in Sussex we are hard put to find virgin forest and Stoneywish closes for the winter at the end of October, so I cannot invite you to 'bathe' here for a while, but I thought I could take you on a mental shinrin-yoku tour of the pinetum we planted a decade or two ago. The veteran of this pinetum is a Sequoia Wellingtonia (FACT) brought as a seed from the Sequoia National Park in California (FACT) 40 or more years ago (FACT). Originally planted in Ditchling churchyard, it was rejected out of fear that, like the pines which had fallen on the church roof in the storm of '87, it might prove dangerous in the future (FACT). Inspired by this specimen, which came to us as a gift, we bought other trees whose native homes

around the world were under threat: Swamp cypress from Florida (FACT), Monkey Puzzle from Chile, Dawn Redwood from China, Cedar of Lebanon, Cryptomeria from Taiwan, (ALL FACTS). Over the years some have failed and others have thrived and are beginning to outgrow from their infant forms and assume their inherent greatness. NOW FORGET ALL THAT. We stand under a low spreading oak at the entrance to the pinetum. A hedgerow, heavy with haws and sloes and berries of the guelder rose encloses this area on three sides. A sandy path leads straight ahead but we choose instead the narrow, clipped, grass path which winds between the trees. The longer grass to either side is heavy with recent rain. The scent of wet leaves, wet blackberries assails us. A bird the size of a hand, with white flashes on its wings, flies out of the hedge and skimming past, too fast for recognition, buries itself in the dense foliage of a cypress ahead. In a mature forest the branches would close over our heads. Here we have to go to the trees. This one, with a sizeable, knotted trunk has spread its lower branches wide; the leaves are feathered, like yew, but pale, delicate, and beginning to acquire the rosy-golden tints of

autumn. These leaves release a herbal scent when crushed. Next, a russet-tinged tree with fine needles reminiscent of curled seaweed. This one smells of lemon! (Limonene for the text-book fact-lover we left at home! Up ahead is a scots pine whose pungent terpenes bring the unmistakable scent of Christmas). On our right, a primeval candelabra of a tree, armoured with shieldshaped, spiny scales. There a dense cavern of branches encircling a trunk that glows red and amber. The ground underfoot is soft with dark debris. Two fat green cones, the first the tree has borne, sit quietly swaying, gestating the seeds for future giants. When the wind picks up, the trees sway together, making their own music. Golden birch leaves spin down and settle on the grass. The long, blue-green fringes of a delicate pine exude astringent and tonic scents... There are more to explore... The longer you do this, the more time you require. It is like gin tasting. All the intoxication with none of the cost! Trees inhabit a time-frame so much vaster than our own, we can capture moments of eternity just by spending time with them. Sensing the sheer physical power of a tree can take your breath away and yet, ironically it is trees and plant life which give us life-giving oxygen. They also sequester carbon, bringing back to earth the elements which

drive the natural cycles of the planet. These are facts too, but of a different order. These are truths we can feel with our fingers. I once laid my head against the trunk of a young ash tree and was astonished to hear a literal roar of water inside. It was spring and the sap was rising. No wonder our spirits rise in spring. Everything is levitating. At the end of forest bathing, the Japanese like to sit and make tea from the beneficial leaves around them - spruce needle tea is full of Vitamin C (FACT). But we don't need to know that. We just need to feel this sensation of the forest flowing through us. When all around are calling on us to be calm and patient, tolerant and life-affirming in our affairs, what better example could we have than the way of the forest? When fears about the future with all its problems are giving us high blood pressure, the trees offer a simple solution. Be with us. Be still. Feel the pain you inflict on us when you hurt us. Accept the bliss we offer as your birthright. My Japanese is non-existent, so I have done the unthinkable and Googled: Tanoshi! I think, means enjoy! Rosemary Pavey

CROHN'S DISEASE I have recently received the Autumn issue of 'Insider' the quarterly magazine from CICRA (Crohn's in Childhood Research Association) and have been reading interesting and promising news in the search for better treatment and for the cause and a cure of this serious illness.

The particular article is under the heading CD-Treat and tells of ongoing research, part-funded by CICRA - to replace the liquid diet (EEN) which is often used as the initial treatment for children and young people with active symptoms of Crohn's Disease. This liquid diet can require feeding directly in the stomach using a tube passed via the nose and taken for 8 weeks without any other food.

A new dietary therapy that works as well as the liquid diet but does not involve stopping all normal food would obviously be more acceptable and appealing to most people with Crohn's Disease. CD-Treat is an exciting prospect as research continues to bring this about.

PRIVATE LIVES BY NOEL COWARD 20th to 23rd

November. Since May we've been busy preparing for our Autumn production 'Private Lives' and I'm pleased to report that, following the auditions in August the play is now fully cast with two people returning to the Ditchling stage and a newcomer, as well as someone you will have seen in our last two productions.

'Private Lives' premiered on 18 August 1930, at the King's Theatre in Edinburgh, directed by Coward and starring Coward as Elyot, with Gertrude Lawrence as Amanda. After successfully touring for five weeks, the production opened at the new Phoenix Theatre in London in September 1930. Coward disliked appearing in long runs, and the London run was therefore a limited three-month season. It sold out within a week and was still playing to packed houses when it ended on 20 December 1930, this despite the struggle Coward had to obtain the Lord Chamberlain's approval for the piece to be staged at all.

In the thirties it was considered too risqué with the relationship between Elyot and Amanda being explored in depth when, as a previously divorced couple, they find themselves honeymooning with new partners, rather unfortunately, in adjacent suites of a French hotel. Theirs is a passionate, volatile, funny and poignant relationship and they come to understand they cannot live apart — made still more moving as they seem unable to live to-

WELCOMING RATTY In the low lying area between Chichester and the sea, volunteers are reducing the risk of flooding by restoring ditches and ponds. At the same time they are creating wildlife habitats, including those of the endangered water vole, Kenneth Graham's much loved 'Ratty'. Intrigued? Come along on Thursday, 21st November to the Green Room, Adastra Hall when HKD Transition is holding its AGM. Refreshments served from 7.30 for a 7.45 pm start.

The speaker is Jane Reeve, Project Manager of the FIOW Project (Fixing and Linking our Wetlands) on the Manhood Peninsula. She will be sharing with us their challenges and successes, focussing on their flooding and biodiversity improvement work and illustrating her talk with film, a few exhibits – and a stuffed water vole. It is a fascinating story. Since 2015, volunteers, some with expert knowledge, others with a passion for the environment and willing to learn on the job and get their feet wet, have been working through this huge wetland area. Parish by parish, they use land management strategies to encourage water to flow away to the sea, thus lowering the risk of flooding. At the same time they provide a new home for many species - including Ratty, the water vole, who is sometimes so keen that he moves in before the volunteers have finished the job.

Jane's presentation will be preceded by our AGM. There will be a lightning review of the past year's work including good news on cycle routes, work on flood prevention which culminated in the now much admired rain garden in Adastra Park, stream clearing and monitoring, meetups on subjects as varied as encouraging hedgehogs to buying local food. Outdoor and children's events included a moth breakfast and a bat walk, as well as the very popular Ditchling Apple Day and Christmas wreath making. Will Jane Reeve's presentation spur us to new

efforts to reduce flooding in our villages and raise awareness of the effects of climate change? We look forward to hearing your ideas on 21st November.

LOCAL COUNCILLORS MEET TO DISCUSS

Past experience with the Beacon Centre shows that if we lose a service it is nearly impossible to get it back, so in the meantime please show your support for our libraries. There are two simple ways you can do this. Firstly, write to the Cabinet Member responsible for libraries explaining why Hassocks and Hurstpierpoint libraries are so important to our villages, to Cllr Jacquie Russell, WSCC, County Hall, West Street, Chichester, PO19 1RQ or email her on jacquie.russell@westsussex.gov.uk.

Secondly, please continue to, or start to use Hassocks and Hurstpierpoint libraries and encourage other residents to do the same so that we can demonstrate how valued they are. Thank you.



TALK If you're a guy who waits until something is seriously wrong before going to the doctor, you're not alone. Local Urological Surgeons, Simon Woodhams and Dan Magrill open up about Men's Health.

Movember, not only creates a fun way to raise money and awareness for men's health issues, it also starts conversations about these issues. But there's still a fair way to go. The biggest challenge is to not only get men to spot symptoms, or to see their GP, but to talk about it openly. It's nothing to be ashamed of.'

Dan continues, 'It's not the easiest thing to talk to your doctor about but early detection of conditions along with raising awareness in Men's Health is important. It's understandable why men shy away from issues with their urinary tract, lumps on the testes, erectile dysfunction or prostate but, like most illness or disease, we need to know more about these problems, and although the more we search for them, the more cases we find, it does help us get closer to helping people live longer and improve their quality of life. The earlier we spot symptoms, the greater the chance of finding curative solutions for them.

'Symptoms don't always mean bad news and that if men visit their doctor early on, they might save themselves a whole lot of worry. Many of the signs that people associate with the prostate can be harmless. For example, problem urinating can be caused by the enlarging of the prostate gland, but that does not necessarily mean cancer. Also, erectile dysfunction can actually have more to do with the heart and can precede heart conditions that may present themselves in a few years time. So, it's definitely worthwhile being examined to manage, prevent or treat
