BLACKCAP: HOME FOR CHRISTMAS Sussex is no place for a warbler in winter. As daylight, temperature and their insect food dwindles, blackcaps, whitethroats, chiffchaffs, reed, sedge and willow warblers all evacuate England. Each September their fragile, feathered bodies fly to Spain and sub-Saharan Africa on the promise of warmth, food and, ultimately, life. So finding a blackcap swinging on your birdfeeder in December will be as unlikely as seeing Santa at a midsummer barbeque. But at Christmas miracles can happen.

Blackcaps return to England in April. Cuckoos and chiffchaffs, also early migrants, broadcast their arrival with their monotonous two-note tune but the blackcap lets loose a rich, full-throated, joyous warble; a defiant announcement that he's cheated death for another winter. This colourful song comes from a colourless bird, yet there's something stylish and continental about the blackcap's appearance. Their two-tone grey suit and black beret pulled over dark eyes make them look like some Parisian beatnik. You'd expect to catch one sat in a willow smoking Gauloises and muttering about Sartre. The female bird's beret is a rich chestnut brown; hardly qualifying her to use the name blackcap at all.

The laws of nature clearly state that all European blackcaps must migrate south for the winter. But in the sixties a small gang of nonconformist blackcaps in Germany started a revolution. They headed south-west instead of

south, ending up in England. Mother Nature is not kind to those who disobey her rules and this suicide squad was surely sentenced to a frozen death in our frosty winter. They'll be gone again by the time 'our' British blackcaps return, exhausted and oblivious, in April.

Animal migration is amazing. Each year across Europe millions of perilous journeys are undertaken as birds, bats, butterflies and other wildlife flee hostile conditions. Each year we as our own species have been forced to make dangerous migrations to survive. The paths of refugees and migrating birds will cross as both are forced on journeys over the same treacherous mountains and seas. Let's hope they all find someplace safe this Christmas.

DITCHLING FILM SOCIETY Our Christmas film will be shown on Thursday, 5th December and is called Green Book - the 2019 Oscar winner. Don Shirley (Mahershala Ali), is a cultured, world class African/American classical and jazz pianist who is about to embark on a concert tour in the Deep South in 1962. In need of a driver and protection he recruits a tough-talking bouncer called Tony Lip (Viggo Mortensen), a blue-collar worker who hails from an Italian/American neighbourhood in the Bronx. Despite their clashing attitudes to life and ideals, the two men soon develop an unexpected bond whilst confronting racism and danger in an era of segregation. The period in which the film is set is romanticised with a handsome palette that could have been lifted from an Edward Hopper painting. The film which is a warm comedy-drama was inspired by the true story of a tour and gives one a bumpy but enjoyable ride through the Deep South.

The story is influenced by the Japanese recession, including media reports of how people live in poverty and resort to shoplifting. make ends meet. They are not alone in this behaviour as the younger and the elder of the household are in on the act. However, the unusual routine is about to change from carefree and matter-of-fact to something more dramatic as the couple open their doors to Juni, a beleaguered young girl. The reasons for the family's habit and their motivations come under the microscope and this excellently scripted film is a harrowing look at a working class family in Japan just trying simply to make ends meet.

NEWS FROM STONEYWISH I have spent the afternoon breaking up last year's apple pruning's for kindling and three fat sacks of twigs are now added to our existing stock in the woodshed. This is a pleasant and satisfying job. As Michael says, fire-wood warms you twice, first in the chopping and then in the burning and we are blessed at home with two hearths: an open fire for chilly evenings, and a Rayburn which warms our water and provides us with a cooking range throughout the winter. The first frost arrived two days ago and Michael has been 'wooding' in earnest for some time now, carting and splitting the basketsful of logs which keep both chimneys going. So far, so good. The house has once more acquired that smoky, sooty aroma which lends it a misleading air of antiquity. We sometimes unwittingly acquire the aroma ourselves and are hailed by friends with the greeting: "Oh! You smell like a bonfire!" followed quickly, as they read our dismay, by the doubtful reassurance: "It's a compliment!" However it may be, relying on wood, rather than just playing campfires, comes to dominate one's way of life. There is a wholeness in sitting before a blaze of logs you have grown and cut, seasoned and stacked. You are caught up in one of the great, mysterious natural cycles of the earth. The carbon from this tree escapes into the air, and will later be recaptured by other plants and trees as they transpire and grow. The wood here reduced to fertile ash, will encour-

age next seasons growth when scattered on the soil. It is all somehow deeply reassuring. More disconcerting is the fact that fire like all natural processes, is inherently volatile and unpredictable. Knowledge and skill may help. As Michael never tires of telling me: "you have got to know your wood." And believe me, I do try. Dry oak burns hot; holly and ash will burn green; blackthorn is fragrant; pine and chestnut spit. White willow is all flame and no heat. Alder is too full of water to burn at all. But there's more to it than that. When it comes to cooking dinner, you need a good 'bottom' in your fire. You need the wind to be in the right direction. A downwind with a depression coming will hardly congeal an omelette. And then if the wind is right and the fire is roaring, no amount of knob twiddling will keep the temperature down. You need to be on hand to open the oven door before everything inside burns to a cinder! There is never a dull moment. And I regret to admit I have often got too engrossed in what I was doing, or gone out without attending to this demanding fire-baby and come back to find it dying or dead, at which point I have to confess to a hungry farmer that supper will be an hour or two late. But would I change this nuisance for modern convenience? Never in a million years. This is what makes winter so delightfully welcome when it comes. Bringing the outside inside and transforming it through the hearth, the crucible of the 'home' into warmth, com-

#### WHY DO WE HAVE CHRISTMAS TREES?

Romans used fir trees to decorate their temples during Saturnalia, a feast in honour of Saturn, the god of agriculture, and the predecessor to Christmas.

In northern Europe, people planted cherry or hawthorn plants, or created pyramids of fruit or candles. Evergreen trees were thought to keep away evil spirits and illness, and were put up during the winter solstice, the shortest day of the year, to remind them that the spring would return.

Another predecessor was the Paradise tree, a fir decorated with apples to represent the Garden of Eden on Adam and Eve's day, which fell on December 24.

It is thought the first person to bring a tree indoors was the German theologian Martin Luther. Walking through

a forest, he was so taken by the beauty of stars twinkling through the pines that he took a tree home and attached candles to each branch.

Germans decorated their trees with edible goods and glass decorations. Tinsel was originally made in Germany from thin strips of silver. Electric lights were first created in 1895 by Ralph Morris, an American telephonist.

Christmas trees made it to Britain in the 1830s, and in 1841, Prince Albert set up a tree in Windsor Castle. In 1846, the Royal family was sketched standing around their Christmas tree, after which the practice became very fashionable.

CHRISTMAS CARDS. In England it was a gentleman by the name of J.C. Horsley who designed and sent the first Christmas card to his friend Sir Henry Cole. A thousand copies were put on sale in London, which bore a picture of a family party with the words "A Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year to you!"

**DEWPONDS** – Basil Hargrave, Ditchling.

It was right on the top of the hill that the dewpond lat from which the water had to be fetched. But how long ago may that have been? Well, we really don't know, for this is a case where a few hundred years or so make little difference. We do know, however, that the dewpond on the top of the hill – on top, say, of these rolling Sussex Downs – is of great antiquity. We may make bold to assert that even in pre-historic times, when Neolithic races roamed along the Downs, the dewponds were there. The Downs were the principal habitat, the hills being not only the natural highway of the period, but, broadly speaking, the only habitable part of the country. For the weald below was a dense and impenetrable forest, abounding in danger and difficulty wild beasts on the one hand, engulfing morasses on the other – and men had perforce to maintain themselves and their flocks on the Downs, daring only to enter the weald on an occasional hunting expedition.

Yet water was as much a necessity of life then as now, and whence could it be obtained? The answer is, from the dewponds. No wonder, therefore, that we are inclined to look upon dewponds with a feeling akin to veneration, for though, of course, only a few can occupy their ancient sites, some we may well believe, are of untold age. But it is not only for their antiquity that dewponds are remarkable. Their mere existence on the height – unfed, yet never failing, as Kipling tells us – is more or less a marvel and a mystery. How are they replenished? There is no spring to feed them, and he ordinary rainfall is quite insufficient to account for their not drying up in summer. Yet even in a drought they have a good supply of water - enough at any rate for the large flocks of sheep which are daily pastured on the hills. There have been various theories put forward

in explanation of the phenomenon and the name "dewpond" is indicative of one which is still widely held. According to this theory the dewpond replenishes itself by the condensation of dew. The water in the dewpond, it is supposed, remains at a lower temperature than the immediately surrounding atmosphere by reason of the bottom of the pond being made a non-conductor of the heat which the earth stores up from the day's sunshine. As a consequence the pond condenses upon its surface the moisture held by the warm air, much in the same way as a glass jug, when filled with cold water newly drawn from the spring or tap and taken into a warm room, may be seen to be quickly clouded on the outside with a dense mist.

The mean by which this insulation from the earth's heat was accomplished are very simple, and might easily have been used without any scientific knowledge of the result. A suitable depression in the surface of the ground was selected, and enlarged or deepened if necessary. The bottom of this was thickly covered with dry straw, which was coated with a layer of puddled clay – pockets of clay are frequently found in the chalk of which the Downs are formed. The whole was then made compact and even by drinking round and round it a broad-wheeled wain to which a yoke of oxen were harnessed, and with the first rainfall or - as in later times – with the emptying into the cavity a few barrels of water, the pond had begun its existence. It was left to fill itself, and so long as the bottom remained intact, free from the growth of weeds and rushes, it would not fail, even when the ponds in the weald were dried up. Thus the dewpond justifies the statement that Jack and Jill went up the hill to fetch a pail of water."


