

women) living all over Mid Sussex. More than ever in these difficult times men, and their partners, need help in dealing with concerns about prostate cancer, so we are therefore actively encouraging more people to join us. Between us, our members have experienced most prostate cancer treatment options available from the NHS, and are happy and willing to talk about our experiences to help inform other men with prostate cancer worries, however personal or embarrassing these concerns may seem.

Mid Sussex Prostate Cancer Support Group is run by a small, dedicated committee. Regular meetings are held where men can compare treatments and any ongoing side effects, and to generally encourage a positive attitude to dealing with the disease. Speakers at our meetings include a wide range of professionals from the NHS, for example Oncologists, Urologists, MacMillan nurses and Radiographers. These speakers are mostly from local hospitals, and give details of current treatment options and new ones being developed. Other cancer support organisations such as PCUK and Tackle also support our knowledge base. Our most recent meetings have been held in the privacy and comfort of members' own living rooms via Zoom, and have covered topics such as treatment options, proton beam therapy and erectile dysfunction. *cont.*.



Well, such things being pretty much washed out too for the time being, I invite you to join me in imagination by the Rayburn here and settle yourselves comfortably as the light fades behind the lime tree outside the window. The blackbirds have finished their last minute mutterings, the geese are quiet, the chickens all gone safely to roost. Here there is a sense of sanctuary, with new bread rising on the stovetop, the strident ticking of an old cuckoo-clock, wafts of cooking, shadows picked out in lamplight and the embers and echoes of conversations past, which any chance observation can revive, quick as memory.

Tonight, the subject is horses. Never having had much experience of horses, I have been trying to


win the trust of the two Shetland ponies which in summer live in a little enclosure in the farm centre, and in winter enjoy the greater freedom and rougher grass of Bernie's Field, a paddock just behind the Pinetum. Pebbles is brown, with a strawcoloured mane and tail, the other, which for want of another name I have come to call Luna, is mooncoloured, shaggy and mischievously fond of rolling in the mud to camouflage herself in the colours of the season. I go down once a day with morsels of apple in my pockets and call them over. They are adept at feigning deafness. Even though we have been best friends the day before, they make a canny assessment of the scene. Have I got anyone with me? Do I come with an ulterior motive? Is the treat I am waving at them a genuine gift or a decoy? Perhaps I have a head collar or rope hidden behind my back. Perhaps I have some dastardly plan to drag them off for hoof-trimming by the farrier. One or another of the pair will finally amble across and standing at a distance, reach out her lips to take the fruit I offer. After the third piece she will let me touch her nose. The other may approach at this point. We put our heads together and have a silent chat. Gradually I am permitted to stroke her forehead or the soft spot behind her ears, and she will lean up against the fence and push with her full body weight, flirting, rubbing her flank and watching me the while. Finally they will

return to their private world. The grass is sweeter there. I am impressed by the innate wisdom of their wariness. Their friendship cannot be bought cheap. At the slightest unexpected move, they skitter away and a primordial instinct self-preservation, lightning swift, replaces the unhurried deliberations of their minds when in repose.

When Michael's family came to Ditchling, horses were an essential element of farming life and Michael's father, 'Peter', had great affinity with them. Long after other farmers had embraced mechanization, Peter kept his horses, for the love of working with them. Caroline, Michael's youngest sister inherited the gift and worked rearing and training horses for much of her life, but Michael preferred to be with his cows and his equine encounters tended more towards comedy and disaster. In the early days, cart horses did all the heavy work at East End Farm, pulling waggons and powering the harrows, ploughs, binders and reapers and rollers which were needed to till the fields and produce the food for livestock. One of

these horses became a casualty of war. As Peter and his brother Tom were ploughing one day in Sharface field, German planes appeared and swooped low overhead, spitting gunfire. The men hurled themselves into a nearby ditch and saved themselves, but the poor old horse was hit and had to be put down. There are later black-and-white photographs of Michael's father sitting on a horse-drawn binder, with Prince, his dark bay to the fore and of Michael's mother sitting proudly astride the same animal outside the farm's flint barn. Life was good, but life with animals is always something of an adventure.

Prince had his own capers, which were fodder for fireside tales. Once as he was working in Spatham Field, (now the Stoneywish campsite), he was startled by the sound of a brass band, attending a military funeral in the cemetery nearby. At the first trumpet-blast he took off with Peter and the roller in tow and crashed through a ditch into the adjacent sewage works. This was the horse which also made the celebrated pig-bin rounds of the village in what

must have been Ditchling's earliest food-waste recycling service. As a teenager, Michael kept his own pigs - enormous hogs which lived out in the hovel across the paddock and would rear up on their hind trotters and peer over the wall of their styes when they thought food was coming. In order to feed his pigs, Michael instigated a household scraps collection service and went from door to door with horse, cart and pig-bins, loading up leftovers and peelings, later to be cooked up into 'swill'. The outward journey was sedate enough, with a leisurely amble round the empty streets, but as soon as the horse's head was turned towards home he would set off at a trot, increasing in speed until, by the corner of East End Lane, he was going at a regular gallop. Michael and Caroline, would arrive home breathless, standing erect in the cart and hanging onto the reins like Roman charioteers.

During one round, Michael being on his own, he was invited into his Grandfather's house for a cup of tea, and left the cart unattended in the High Street. By the time he re-emerged the horse had wandered off and he had to scour the village to catch up with him. This was Ditchling in the 1950s. By the time I came to Stoneywish, in 1992, there was a splendid Shire horse here called Mr. T. At over 19 hands high, he was then thought to be the tallest horse in England and he was the inseparable companion of Charlie, a diminutive, rough-coated donkey. When the blacksmith came to trim the feet of this pair, Michael would steady the animals by their head collars while I held the buckets of oats which were to distract them and keep them quietly occupied. Mr. T was a gentle giant and the first three feet would be an easy job. I remember the acrid smell of the hoof parings and the sound of

SUSSEX SEARCH AND RESCUE From time to time the team are called out by Sussex Police to assist in the search for a vulnerable missing person suffering from dementia. One of the first questions the police may have for the family or carers is "Is the Herbert Protocol information available?"

The Herbert Protocol is a form that carers, family or friends of a vulnerable person, or the person themselves can fill in. The initiative is named after George Herbert, a war veteran of the Normandy landings, who lived with dementia. He died whilst 'missing', trying to find his childhood home.

It contains a list of information to help the police if the person goes missing, it may include any medication required, places previously located, and a recent photograph. This vital information may just hold vital information as to the potential whereabouts of the missing person.




So, some of the new residents have asked me if I could supply a little history of the names. Each month will I aim to just do that, starting with Diplocks Mews named after Charly Diplock.

NICHOLAS CULPEPER - THE COMPLETE HERBAL HERO Just over 400 years ago, in 1616, a legend was born; a rebel who partnered up with Mother Nature to revolutionise British medicine. The herbal hero, the botanical bad boy, the father of alternative medicine - ladies and gentlemen, I give you Nicholas Culpeper.

Culpeper did his growing up upstream in Isfield, just north of Lewes. The country lanes and starry Sussex skies were his classroom and the hedges and the heavens taught him botany, astronomy and astrology. He learnt about love too. In 1634, Culpeper and his Sussex sweetheart planned a secret Lewes wedding and a speedy elopement to the Netherlands. But tragedy struck when his lovestruck lady's carriage was struck by a lightning bolt en-route to the ceremony. She died instantly.

There's no cure for a broken heart and Culpeper left Sussex to start a new life in London. He threw himself into his work as a lowly apothecary's assistant, cataloguing medicinal herbs on Threadneedle Street. At this time, medicine was only practiced by elite physicians. They would charge exorbitant prices for their secret remedies and would not even demean themselves to talk to patients, instead requesting a sample of urine to make their diagnosis. Culpeper believed medical treatment should be available to all - not just the privileged.

Setting up his own practice in a poorer part of London, Culpeper started treating forty patients a day with herbal cures derived from English plants. Then he dropped his botanical bombshell. Culpeper published an incredible tome that instructed people how to pick their own remedies, free of charge, from the hedges and meadows. The book was 'The English Physitian' (1652, later enlarged as 'The Complete Herbal'). His book promoted and preserved folk remedies at a time when physicians and priests were discrediting village healers and preventing them from passing along their traditional knowledge. **LEO HOUSE - AIMEE'S STORY** Fifteen years ago, Marie and Martin welcomed their beautiful new baby girl, Aimee, to their family. After an easy pregnancy and normal birth, they were over the moon to bring their perfect, healthy little girl back to their family home in Eastbourne.

Their world was turned upside down, however, when Aimee had a seizure at just four months old. By nine months old Aimee was diagnosed with Dravet Syndrome, a rare form of epilepsy that affects ever y area of her life.

A happy little girl, Aimee "lives in her own little bubble" according to mum Marie. "She is so cuddly, loves school and playing with her car and train toys." But her condition means that Aimee suffers seizures on a weekly basis, often having six to eight fits in the space of a few hours. Aimee is mobile, but unsteady on her feet, she can communicate but is unable to speak and has a severe learning disability. She is also tube-fed and has a strict medicine routine to control her condition.

For the first four years Aimee would have a seizure ever y seven to ten days. It would last up to an hour

and result in her being hospitalised for four to five days at a time, putting a massive strain on family life.

Looking for some respite from the demands of caring for a child with such an unpredictable condition, the family were referred to Leo House at Home. They star ted receiving regular visits from one of the Community Nurses, who takes care of all of Aimee's needs whilst the rest of the family enjoy activities that are usually out of bounds for them.

Marie explains, "I would never usually go to the cinema because I would be terrified to turn my phone off for two hours and focus on anything other than Aimee. But with Kirstie, our Community Nurse, I can do just that. She knows Aimee and us so well. I know she will look after

her with the same care and attention that I would." Due to Aimee's complex medical needs, the family were shielding at home for months when the COVID-19 pandemic struck. "It was really hard for us. We have been working from home, tr ying to take care of Aimee and her medical needs, it has

been really intense. But we have had regular contact from Leo House at Home and they really have been a lifeline for us. We know that there is always someone at the end of the phone if we need them." When the family came out of shielding, they began having visits from their Community Nurse, Kirstie, again, "recently, Kirstie has been taking Aimee out and about for the day when she visits. This is because my husband and I have been working from home, so it gives us a little bit of time to get our heads down and work."

"It really is fantastic knowing that we have the support of Leo House. We have been given the opportunity to build a really strong relationship with our Community Nurse, something that doesn't often happen with other care providers."

Leo House was established by Brighton Lions Club to help life-limited children, young people and their families living in East and Mid-Sussex as well as in Brighton & Hove. Leo House suppor ts children and young people with a life-limiting condition from birth to 25 years of age and their fam-

MID SUSSEX DISTRICT COUNCIL have notified Towns and Parishes that the Mobile Refuse collections which were suspended earlier this year due to the coronavirus pandemic, have now been ceased permanently. The decision to cease the provision of this service was supported by the following information:

Mobile Civic Amenity collections do not allow for waste to be kept separate and recycled or reused; therefore, not meeting the objectives of the waste hierarchy which was incorporated into UK law via the Waste Regulations (England and Wales) 2012. The waste collected at the Mobile Civic Amenity Site can be removed from households using other services; including the MSDC bulky waste service and garden waste collection service.

There are two Household Waste Recycling Sites (HWRS) within Mid Sussex, where residents can also dispose of any additional waste items. Enforcing social distancing measures at temporary sites is difficult and MSDC need to ensure the services provided can be controlled to support Government
