THE GARDEN RETHINK: IMPROVING BIODIVERSITY IN OUR VILLAGES WITH NO MOW MAY Hurst Rethink and HKD Transition invite the residents of our villages to make our gardens more nature friendly this spring by not mowing our lawns in the month of May. By coming together en masse to take part in what's known as 'No Mow May', we can collectively make a real difference to local wildlife.

In the UK, we have lost nearly 7.5 million acres of flower-rich meadow and pasture since the 1930s, and now only 1% of our countryside provides flowers for pollinators.

However, there are 15 million gardens in the UK and our lawns have the potential to be a major wildflower nectar source -a staggering 200species are known to grow on lawns. In fact,

incredibly simple changes in mowing can result in enough nectar from common flowers such as daisies, dandelions, buttercups and clover for ten times more bees and other pollinators. More bees and other insects also means more food for creatures further up the food chain - so by encouraging those at the bottom, we benefit many more. Our local campaign in Hurstpierpoint & Sayers Common, Hassocks and Ditchling supports a national survey run by the charity Plantlife called 'Every Flower Counts'.

In 'No Mow May' we simply ask that you leave your mower in the shed for the month of May, then record what flowers you have on a sample of your lawn at the end of the month on the Plantlife website

www.plantlife.org.uk/everyflowercounts/. By doing this you will get your very own personal nectar score which shows how many bees your garden can nourish. It's a great thing to get the whole family involved in.

We're working with local schools and community groups to encourage take up of No Mow May and Plantlife have agreed to give us a BN6nectar score to show how many bees our gardens have fed during May! Discover all the details on our website, **www.hurstrethink.org** If you don't want to leave your whole lawn, just a patch is equally fine, just think of it as a loan to the wild residents of your garden. We look forward to seeing the results. *Charlotte Snook*

the NHS, and following the formal AGM, Dr Miriam Winn (GP) and Denise Simpson-Banks (Practice Business Manager) gave an enlightening presentation on how the Practice absorbed the massive task of setting up and manning the clinic at Clair Hall while continuing to care for their patients' medical needs. Behind the Scenes at the Practice - Issues Faced by the Practice in 2020 during the Covid-19 Pandemic

At the beginning of 2020, the situation escalated over a weekend, and five days before the official order came through from NHS England, the decision was taken to close the doors of the three surgeries. New regimes for telephone triage, video calls, a Hot Hub for treating those with COVID symptoms, adapted ways to look after very unwell patients whilst also protecting the staff, were quickly introduced, fine-tuned and adapted as the situation changed - sometimes within a few hours. Not long after, came the additional challenge to set up what has proved to be the very successful vaccination programme at Clair Hall, despite

the pressure and challenges associated with the complex and uncertain delivery of the vaccine.

Numerous changes to the surgeries were required, involving much physical work to make them safe and accessible for patients that had to be seen; and to allow for more routine appointments to be carried out.

Some of these changes continue to be in place, for example, taking blood samples can now also be done outside, under a tent or with patients remaining in their car for those who are not comfortable with entering the surgery building.

Looking ahead, there is a positive message. New techniques and skills have been developed using the latest technology, and these will be invaluable tools for carrying out the partners' plans for extending and enhancing care for all their patients in an unpredictable future.



But this same principal of increase goes for all the other elements in Nature when they are allowed free play. The dawn chorus here grows more complex, day by day, as spring progresses, elaborating from winter's broken calls into tendrils of sound which grow in tandem with plant tendrils and

These processes currently defy mathematical computation, operating at levels deeper than the manipulable molecular dimension, deeper even than the scalar dimension of thoughts and impulses which our human technologies seek to harness for good or ill. As vulnerable, as besieged and damaged as our Earth home seems to be, it still – thank Heaven! – knows things which we do not know, manifesting intelligence at every level, and belying our common conviction that we live on a soulless lump of rock. Otherwise life here

would have long since ceased to exist. I read today that the planet is now exposed to radio and microwaves competing with its natural frequencies at a rate 200 million times greater than that of 100 years ago. Our dying ash trees, our failing populations of birds and insects, our own immunity crises, bear testimony to the fact. And yet, wherever we hold off, hold back in reverence – the vitality floods back. Do we really need to be generating this kind of lethal power in the world? We could be part of the natural fabric, not the pathology which tears the fabric apart. We are still invited to try, to stand in reverence and receive the free gifts of life: love, energy, strength, which connection with one another and the whole cosmic community bestows. Wild creatures know this as their birthright.

Looking at an iron plough on display in the Reserve the other day, friends of ours marvelled at the strength that would be needed to hold the handles straight and cut a furrow behind a horse. It would require a modern body-builder on a diet of high protein powder and an intensive fitness regime to do what poor farm hands once did on little more than bread and an occasional slice of bacon. Where did their energy come from? Michael drove a hand



plough in his youth. Dick Morley's father and Bunny Taylor were local champion ploughmen. Folk literature tells us that not only did ploughboys make an art of their punishing work, but took pleasure in it and sang as they went. But then all people who are truly connected to the Earth are inspired to sing. Think of Wordsworth's 'Solitary Reaper', or the people of all the world's indigenous communities who have kept alive the traditions of living and working together as one. Here in Britain singing and whistling were once spontaneous and ubiquitous. Singing and dancing revels welcomed the return of Flora in Spring. Singing helped the cows let down their milk. It helped the crops to grow. It brought the harvest home. Shepherd boys piped to their flocks. Women sang over their spinning. Fish were sung into nets. Babies were sung to sleep. If we could only ground ourselves in a genuine Earth connection once more, we might be astounded by a release of energy and joy, experiencing negentropy for ourselves and for one another. Literal revival. We might even start to sing and dance again, adding missing voices and smiles back into the universal festival.

What better news for Easter? Or for our beleaguered Earth home? We do not need technology to





#### SUSSEX MUSEUM CURATOR AND LAWN MOWER HISTORIAN APPEARED ON

**BBC TWO'S GARDENERS WORLD** Clive Gravett, curator of the Museum of Gardening housed within South Downs Nurseries, Hassocks, has been helping and advising the BBC in the production of a film on the extraordinary history of the lawn. The Museum of Gardening opened in March 2016 as a joint venture between Tates of Sussex and Clive's charity The Budding Foundation which supports local children in need, many interesting, unusual and unique horticultural tools and machines are exhibited and with the gradual lifting of covid restrictions Clive is eager to re-commence his popular talks/presentations to horticultural societies and other groups.
