I run Kitchen Carousel. This year we didn't start until end of February. Then we had to get cracking. You can see the results on our website. We made the first kitchen for Mrs W in Hassocks. Windows out walls out. Cleverly designed corner with huge drawers ... one of my signature designs. Then, in a small L shape space we fitted a pull-out custom larder, a tall oven, a washing machine, dishwasher, sink, an integrated fridge, shelves and other stuff. The tops were Corian. A brilliant worksurface that you can re-polish at any time. Next job was Mrs C the jar collector... So, Mrs C got a huge custom corner larder and a tall fridge and some more of my other specialist corner drawers which, I have to say, everyone loves to bits. The one of my other specialities...a huge larder just two tins deep! Then we did Mrs W in Lewes...a long galley kitchen with bespoke painted doors and an Oak larder and a custom laundry cupboard to house away the washing machine and a movable island/table and chunky Oak free-floating shelves.

The thing is... every kitchen is different. A successful project starts with good design. Usually it takes a few plans and a few revisions and a few drawings but I don't rush anyone. What's the point of rushing? Our waiting list is now around August/September, so if you would like to talk about your kitchen project you will need to start early. We don't make promises we can't keep. Our fitting takes longer than anyone else. I notice other kitchen companies seem to promise they can complete a major kitchen project in a week! I wish! Genuine kitchen fitting is not just a trade it's an art. We stay small to stay on top. Kitchens are complicated little things. Fortunately, or unfortunately, depending on your point of view I have been designing kitchens for rather a long time. So, if you want a brand-new kitchen or just a simple clever refurbishment then do give me a call and I'll see what I can do for you. Most people seem pleasantly surprised ... and so far every single one of my clients who has had a kitchen is happy to show the finished project to my prospective clients. That, I think, is what makes me happiest and lets me sleep at nights. I hope your new 'unlocked' world brings you as **much joy and freedom as possible. This is our website:**

I remember we took the Brownies to London on two occasions - once to see The Changing of the Guard from inside the palace railings and another time we went to London Zoo. For



many of the girls it was their first train ride. I now live in North Devon where my husband was born but I have friends in Hassocks and have happy memories of the happy years when I lived there.

HASSOCKS RAINBOW UNIT-MEM-BERSHIP CAN NOW START AT 4! What a terrific nostalgic photo in Talk About last month from Pam Marks! Featuring her Brownie Unit in 1967, Pam explained she started 1st Keymer Brownies because the waiting lists were too long for the other village units.

Hassocks has a long history of Girlguiding. "Geographically", Hassocks joins with Keymer and Ditchling to form one District called Beacon. Currently, there are two Brownie and two Guide units in Hassocks and one Brownie and one Guide unit, which opened only last month, in Ditchling.

Pam Marks' story behind her starting her Brownie unit is replicated in Girlguiding the country over: volunteers step up to take on





leadership roles because units are threatened with closure when leaders leave, or because they see the numbers on the waiting lists are so great that girls are missing out on some wonderful adventures and friendships.

Hassocks Rainbows (for girls age 5-7) closed at Christmas on the retirement of the leaders. Recruiting in a pandemic has not been an option but it would be fantastic if two or three volunteers would offer to re-start Hassocks Rainbows for the Autumn term! From October, Rainbows are allowed to offer places to 4 vear olds, too. There would be enough interest to have two units if we could recruit enough volunteers! Maybe a group of mums could get together to talk between themselves about how they might be able offer this opportunity to their daughters and come forward as a group? There is a fabulous meeting venue with its own grounds, lots of support for the training, and a warm welcome from the other Hassocks leaders is guaranteed. Weekly meetings usually last just an hour but what enthusiasm and appreciation they generate from the youngsters.

We thank Richard Thompson for the following letter:- Dear Editor, Your photo of Clayton Cricket Club players raised some interest among former members of the club, myself and Mick Knight. Mick was club Captain and Club Secretary in the 1980's and 1990's.

Most of the players shown in the photo were before our time, but we did play along side two of them, Ted Wilkins and Harry Knight. Mick writes 'Ted is 5th from the left in the back row, and there are 3 Mottrams, Bill, Bob and the legendary Eric, plus of course my Dad Harry Knight in the front row complete with the inevitable pipe.'

The club was founded in 1909 and survived until the early 2000's, when it was merged with a team from Brighton.

Ted Wilkins, a hard-hitting batsman and slow bowler, played well into his 60's, and he was reputed to have taken over 1000 wickets after the 2nd World War by the time he finally retired in the mid 1980's.

I believe there were three generations of the Knight family who played for Clayton,





Harry's father, Harry himself and then Mick and his brother Richard. They were all fine all-round players.

For many years up to 1978 the Club President was the cricket writer, Alan Ross, who lived at Clayton Manor. He writes about the Club and its characters in his autobiography Coastwise Lights.

He records 'The same names appeared year after year, sometimes with devastating results. In 1947 and 1949 Clayton won 19 of its 26 Matches.


lining.

Miss Caulfield draws attention to the 80% increase in reports of dog attacks on sheep. All dog walkers should be aware of the laws relating to their responsibility to control their dogs.

It is a legal offence to allow your dog to be loose in a field where there are sheep. It is also an offence to allow your dog to chase or attack farm livestock. Dogs doing this may be shot by a farmer and the dog owner has no right to a recompense. Miss Caulfield does not mention that this applies to cattle as well as sheep. Miss Caulfield is not correct in saying don't walk across fields which are planted with crops. Most footpaths do in fact legally cross such fields. What is important is that walkers should stay on the legal line of the footpath and not wander or deviate to the side.

but what's inside that counts. The Glow-worm knows this. First off we need to get one thing straight – she's not a worm. Glow-worms are beetles, except she doesn't look much like a beetle - more like a squashed woodlouse.

She may not look like much but she knows that she has a certain something that is more alluring than all the brightly coloured feathers, petals, fur and scales that others use in their desperate cries for attention. When the colours of the day start to fade she undertakes a dignified climb to the top of a blade of grass. She positions herself carefully, turns on her lovelight and shines.

When scientists explain this phenomenon they use words like 'bioluminescence' and discuss the 'oxidation of luciferin' – but these boffins and their fancy talk ain't fooling me. I know



magic when I see it and to look upon Glowworms shining on a warm summer's evening is just that – magical.

Of course the Glow-worm is not glowing for our benefit – there's a special someone she's trying to attract. I've been referring to the Glow-worm as 'she' because the female is the one who does the glowing. The male looks like a different species altogether and is Glowworm by association. Much smaller and beetle-like in appearance, he has bulging eyes which are protected under a see-through rim on his tough beetle-body – imagine a tiny Marty Feldman in a suit of armour and a sun visor and you're not too far off.

On warm evenings he flies over the grass looking down for a female's glow. When her signal registers on his radar he dives, crashing to the ground near her. He then looks up

through his visor to locate the female hanging over him, before scuttling the short distance to his new partner.

This anazing little animal has inspired poets through the centuries. William Blake's Glowworm lit the path for the 'Troubled wilder and forlorn' while in the poem 'Among All Lovely Things My Love Had Been' William Wordsworth woos his sweetheart with a Glowworm. But surely the most epic verse ever written about a Glow-worm is this anonymous poem: "I wish I were a glow-worm, a glowworm's never glum, 'cos how can you be grumpy, when the sun shines out your bum?" We thank Dick Morley for the following letter:-I was interested to learn in the latest Talk About the origin of Davey Way because that name was part of my family folklore. My mother, who was born in Hurstpierpoint in 1901, had one expression whenever the subject of local deaths came up and through the generations would return to memories of her childhood. For example, she would predict "Old Davey's going to get him soon" or "Old Davey is out on his bike with his tape measure, making sure he will be first on the scene." I need to say that this expression was confined to our family and Mum was very strictly decorous beyond our four walls especially because Mr Davey was a much respected member of the village.





As usual, nostalgia is infectious, so perhaps another aspect of my mother's childhood may not be widely known in Hurst. She was born opposite St Laurence School where one of the playground games was simply Marbles but was known as "Couchies". I imagine that this is how it would have been spelt. The large building dominating the road was Mr Couchman's (spelling?) Brewery where lemonade was bottled in the old-fashioned way. It was forced under pressure into new empty bottles which already had a small loose glass ball inside which would rise up to the neck of the bottle making the contents airtight. Presumably empties were returned to the brewery for re-use but any that were cracked were set aside for recycling, probably by the wholesalers rather than the Rag and Bone man. Local children valued the small glass stoppers and had no need to save up their Edwardian pennies to buy proper marbles. I never asked whether the owner gave the glass stoppers to the local children or whether they pinched them from the pile of dud bottles. Dick Morley


