Dear Village Voice, in issue 274 the photo that showed the WI group from 1944 said the gentleman second from the right was Mr Paisley, it should have said Mr Pacey.

He with his wife Mabel and daughter Peggy (pictured) were our neighbours for over sixteen years. Bob Pacey lived next door to the Red Lion Pub now a private house. He was a carpenter at Hurstpierpoint College, but he also wound the Church clock which was done manually by winding weights on cables quite heavy work. My father Bill Gaston did it for Bob if he was unable to do it.

The photo is of my mother in our front garden leaning on the fence post talking to Mabel, with Tamplins written on the wall. They were good friends.





SEPTEMBER IS GOLD! The village is set to turn GOLD this month as HassocksGoesGold raises awareness of Childhood Cancer and much needed funds for research to combat this cruel disease. As many of you will know my own daughter Pearl died in 2017 from Ewings sarcoma and until our family was turned upside down by Childhood Cancer, I had no idea how common it is or how poorly funded. The chemotherapy treatment that she endured was not un-

usual in being designed for only for adults. Most childhood cancer drugs are not licenced for children, but they are given them because there is simply no alternative. As children's bodies are still growing, they need stronger treatments than adults and many children die from the cure before the cancer.

The medical staff we encountered during Pearl's 11-month treatment were on the whole fantastic but without better treatments being available there was simply nothing that was effective enough to save her. It breaks my heart every day. It is a situation that must change. Childhood Cancer

kills more children in the UK than any other cause, even road traffic accidents.

Some Childhood Cancers (there are many different types) have good outcomes. There have been breakthroughs in adult cancer that have translated well to Childhood Cancers. But with the majority of cancers in children being so different to adult cancer, much

more research for new treatments is needed. Currently less than 1.4% of cancer research money is spent on Childhood Cancer, a fact I find shocking. Pearl was so much more than a cancer statistic. She was, and still is, an inspiring and energetic force. Kind, wickedly fun and a delight to be around. She had so much to give to the world and in creating HassocksGoesGold I feel I am helping to further that energy even though she isn't around to do it herself.

We thank Susan Mottram for the following letter:-Having read the article about the businesses in Keymer Road by Tony Sharp, I hope that I can fill some?'s

Regarding the South side, yes, the Co op, the Dairy, Lloyds Bank, Ayling & Strudwick, where Sainsburys is now and where Humanity at Heart were followed by Rocking Horse. I don't recall the Fish shop, but the Greengrocers were Eastwoods, who were also florists who later became Munro's florist. The Butchers was Rookards, then later Smith's. The Gas showroom was where Bowley's is now, I can't remember the first solicitor? The corner half of that unit in between the corner of Downsview Road was a Woodsland Store, then a sweet shop called Deckers.

Across from that was the General Post Office, the sorting office behind and the GPO telephone exchange? Next was the Garage and filling station.

On the other side of the bridge was Marchant and the bakers, Acres at one point.

Across the other side of Parklands Road, was the "original" supermarket, Masters & Tulley, but in my time Keymarkets, they moved into Orion Parade when the Cinema was knocked down! That was then Rayford Electrics, (Ray Horney) then Lavells moved

from the other side of the road. Next to that was Deanne's a ladieswear shop, that had a cafe above at one point! Next door my memory lets me down, but then Louis shoes, where Hair Emporium is, Shaffer was where QD Stationery is now, Bennett's Ironmongers where Tim Fai is, and Princes men's, ladieswear and school uniforms! Not sure what was in the western half of the corner shop, Miss Bates and her wool shop only had the half to the East!

The cinema took the whole of what is now Orion Parade!

North side - Up at the station, where Station Garage is, was the Southdown Motor Services Bus Garage, that could hold four buses! (Latterly only two were "stabled" there). On the corner of Woodsland Road was the Coal Office, then the Estate Agents Bradley & Vaughnan? Next door was Kent's Stationers, the cafe and Gents Hairdressers I don't recall? The unit where the Kitchen shop is, was Batchelors. I recall a pharmacy, but not the name, also I recall the Deli.

Then Ladieswear shop was Mary Wall, then Kadarwear. Then Barclays Bank.

Across the road from the Bank was/is the Infant School, which was the only school until Downlands Secondary School was built about 1960? Windmills

Junior School was built about the same time, but only had four classrooms.

After passing the URC, formerly the Congregation Church, there was Brook Stores, traditional service! Next together was the Butchers, various names, then Lavells, who as I said previously, moved across the road. Then Point Appliances had it, before Mansel McTaggert.

From the corner of Grand Avenue, there was the Midland Bank, which became HSBC, next to that was Selby's Chemist this was where the kebab shop is, in between it was Unwins Off Licence.

Next door, where Boots is currently, was a Barber's, with a Ladies Hairdressers above.

Next to that was the National Bank, which became Nat West, then the Pet shop, and Dry Cleaners, Deux Amies hairdressers and another Sweet shop! Now Child Help.

I am sure that people older than me will remember other names, and the Hassocks Past & Present did a similar project a while ago?

LET'S TALK... RUBBISH We love talking rubbish at the Hurst Rethink. It's one of the favourite subjects as our team of volunteers gathers every week to sort the crisp packets and sweet wrappers that people have dropped off to our Terracycle bins. I'm sure we'd rather be doing something else but for

the time being we know that our effort is appreciated by many in our community who are loath to chuck plastic packaging in the bin.

Reducing waste is the one thing we can all do to improve our local environment and the good news is that this is going to get a whole lot easier over the next few years.

Hurst Rethink and the Parish Council had an enlightening meeting recently with Colin McFarlin, Volunteer Waste Prevention Advisor at WSCC, where we discussed some important and imminent changes to how our household waste can be recycled.

One of the main drivers of change is an old favourite, taxation. From 1st April 2022, plastic packaging that doesn't contain at least 30% recycled material will be subject to a new Plastic Packaging Tax (PPT). This has really boosted the market for recyclable plastic. Where does a lot of this plastic come from? Supermarkets? And who can now make lots more

money from it...you guessed it... supermarkets. Last month we saw announcements from both Sainsburys and Co-op about increased recycling of soft plastics in store. This time next year you'll most likely be able to take most of your plastic packaging back to where you bought it - making our Terracycle collections defunct. We sincerely hope so because it's about time the supermarkets did more to contribute to a more circular economy.

Another key change is the introduction of food waste collections from West Sussex County Council (WSCC), proposed for 2022. Around 40% of the rubbish in our black bins is food waste. WSCC is currently trialling food waste collections in the Adur District Council area to determine the fine details of how collections will work such as frequency. Once the results are in, we can expect to see a full roll out. Just think, 40% less waste going into our black bins! Finally, a subject close to many of our hearts...litter. We've witnessed a lot more litter on our streets in the last 18 months, partly because the pandemic has encouraged use of disposable items. We're working with the Parish Council on a litter plan to try and reduce the amount of litter in Hurst - and encourage people to take their litter home. Details of the plan and campaign launch will follow in the next few months.

NEWS FROM STONEYWISH Long before Stoneywish opened its gates to the public, the farmyard acted as a magnet to a wide variety of visitors. There were the neighbours calling for eggs and Christmas chickens, and dear old Miss Kitson from East Gardens, who waded through the mud at the bottom of the yard to beg an occasional barrow-load of compost from the manure heap. Then the professionals; Mr Driver, the corn merchant, who came to buy wheat and sell cowcake, and Mr Turner, who came to kill the pigs and once flung a proffered meat knife at Michael's astonished father, growling in disgust. Can't use that bloody thing. It's as blunt as Old Harry! "Mr Bourne brought the 'thrasher' in the autumn and Michael remembers the excitement of hearing the great steam engine rumble down East End Lane when he was a boy. Mr Bourne drove the engine and Mr Small, who was even stricter than the pig-sticker, supervised the threshing itself. Mr. Small, formally attired in Victorian style (waistcoat, tie, and bowler hat) fed the wheat into the drum. Each man in the threshing team had his allocated part to play, some dismantling the corn stacks, others hooking up the sacks to catch the wheat and woe betide the one who handed up his bundle of corn stalks the wrong way round or fumbled with the sacks and disrupted the smooth running of the machine. The children raked out the chaff that fell beneath and swept it into

a heap. Michael's Uncle Bob once started the steam engine when it stood idle and, in a feat of adolescent daring, ran it to the bottom of the yard, where it stuck fast in Miss Kitson's mud. Ructions must have followed!

Another, great excitement for Michael and his sisters was the delivery of the barrel organ, the day before the Fair. This barrel organ, which played a vital part in the village festivities, was brought from London, and lodged overnight in the Top Yard and the farm children had the fun of grinding out tunes on it before it made its official public appearance. The arrival of the barrel organ meant the end of feverish weeks of preparation as legal families and business competed to build the most elaborate floats for the Fair Day procession. It also brought the giddy promise of Harris's swing boats and merry-go-rounds in the North Star Field.

The farmyard was a good place to find material for a float

On one occasion the Alfords dressed as gypsies and set out in style on a cart decorated with a campfire tableau. For the occasion Michael, now a bit older, had felled a tree and set it up on the cart, for rural effect. Soon after turning into East End lane this tree became entangled in the telephone wires and had to be ignominiously felled a second time. But the genuine gypsies were good friends to Michael and taught

him how to collect and sell scrap metal and he soon built up a sizeable spoil heap beside the barn.

This, in turn, attracted a new visitor, for Rowland Emett, the cartoonist and kinetic sculptor, lived just down the road Emett was always on the look-out for the quirky items he incorporated into his machines and when he was not in the Hassocks Hardware shop, examining the egg-whisks and feather dusters, he was often hovering about Michael's pile of scrap, scavenging for old wheels and pipes and bits of propellor, these were clearly identifiable in his early sculptures. In time, Michael became Emetts gardener and odd-job-man and the gentle genius, who described himself as 'the Ditchling tinkerer', is celebrated today in a mini-museum, affectionately dedicated to him on the Reserve.

Three large oil paintings show the farmyard as it was in the old days. The barn stands, dwarfed by massive elm trees, the pond, later separated from the farm, holds the cowstalls and haystacks in reflection. The artist, Ethel Rawlins, who lived in a cottage in Field Way, just a short walk away, would arrive with her paints in the 1940's and sit amidst the ducks and chickens to capture a world that was soon to charge forever. Unable to raise the money to buy these paintings when they came up for sale, Michael offered to do Miss Rawlins' garden, until he had paid off the debt. Add to these visitors, the tramps who occasionally took a night's lodging in the barn and the swallows, which arrived every year to fill the building with their chattering, teaching their young to fly from beam to beam before they went wheeling out into the blue beyond. Add also a succession of friends and

Michael's museum is now open, providing glimpses of the farm and surrounding villages in their many incarnations.

ASH DIEBACK is a serious disease that is killing Ash Trees across Europe. Young tree can die quickly once infected. Older trees can be slowly killed by a yearly cycle of infection.

We have been steadily removing the worst affected trees in the wood since 2018 but now the disease has taken hold here, so we are taking action for the safety of our visitors and neighbours by removing all ash trees with significant decline next to footpaths and properties.

Although the work may look drastic, please be assured that it has been carefully planned with consent from the Forestry Commission and in line with the Woodland Trusts ash dieback Position Statement https://www.woodlandtrust.org.uk/publications/2019/06/ash-dieback-position-statement/

We are only removing ash trees where we have to. Ash trees out of falling distance of footpaths and properties and those showing the most significant sign, of resistance to the disease are being retained and monitored.

The works start in September and are taking place outside of bird nesting season. We will aim to avoid the wettest periods to minimise the impact on the soil and ground flora where possible. Timber will be extracted, and branches cut up to avoid smothering the woodland floor.

The majority of the wood's trees, including oak, hornbeam. hazel. wild cherry, hawthorn and silver birch are unaffected by the disease and will maintain habitat for wildlife while their saplings will gradually fill the gaps where ash used to be.

Thank you for your support and understanding. We hope this reassures you that our management decisions are centred on the best long-term interests of trees and woods. and the people and wildlife that depend upon and benefit from them.

That wood will remain open throughout the duration of the works, but some footpaths will be closed or diverted with signs and barriers to maintain safety while the works ore taking place. We apologise for any inconvenience caused.

DEATH'S-HEAD HAWK-MOTH In August I was sent a photo of a giant caterpillar seen in an Iford garden. The colourful caterpillar, garish yellow with flamboyant blue chevrons and spots, was shuffling along on its stumpy legs like a miniature conga-line in search of a party. The caterpillar would have buried itself in some soft Sussex soil and, within its cocoon, would have undertaken an amazing transformation. Around November, a completely different beast will be emerging from the Iford earth and into the night skies, a moth. But, with a 12 cm wingspan and ornate patterned wings, this is no ordinary moth. Its beauty should be admired and respected if it wasn't for one small thing. Stamped on its thorax is the spectral image of an eyeless human skull, an eerie façade that has given it its name, the Death's-head hawkmoth.

The moth's baleful birthmark has, for centuries, struck fear into the hearts of superstitious humans who have seen it as a messenger of the Devil. And, according to legend, this rare moth seems to have put in regular appearances throughout history. Even learned naturalists once claimed that the moth was a "foretelling of war, pestilence, hunger, and death to man and beast." Legend has it that the appearance of a number of Death's-head hawkmoths signalled the start of the French Revolution in 1789. The moth appeared in the bedchamber of King George III; a visitation that allegedly tormented the crazed monarch and sped him to his demise in 1820.

The Death's-head's notoriety has continued to seep through the centuries in art and literature. It appeared prophesying doom in Thomas Hardy's 'Return of the Native' (1878) and was an instrument of evil in Bram Stoker's 'Dracula' (1897). In the surrealist film 'Un Chien Andalou' (1929) it gave life to Salvador Dali's nightmares. In 1968's English horror 'The Blood Beast Terror' Peter Cushing was on the trail of a monster that was half-woman and half-hawkmoth. In 1991 the moth was seen perching on the lips of Jody Foster on posters advertising 'The Silence of the Lambs'. In the film its cocoons were placed inside serial killer Buffalo Bill's victims as a grizzly calling card (the hawkmoths that appeared in the movie were a different species to the ones that appeared in the original story; only a minor point but it did ruin the movie for me somewhat).

Like all moths the Death's-head hawkmoth is harmless. It is a largely African species which some years undertakes an amazing migration north, arriving on extremely rare occasions in Sussex. Of course, its links to death and destruction are just superstitious claptrap. But with a Death's-head on the loose in Sussex this Autumn I'd keep your windows closed, just in case.
