

ADASTRA BOWLING CLUB 1922 - 2022 the next time you walkthrough Adastra Park just stop outside the Children's Play area and look over the hedge at Adastra Bowling Club pavilion.

The club was formed in 1922 and only had three rinks (half of the present size), plus a wooden pavilion. Only gentlemen played bowls and most wore jackets, ties and hats (trilby or flat caps) and most of them smoked pipes or cigarettes. Lady members were admitted in 1937 as players and members. The new green was laid in 1938 with Cumberland Turf.

The green was extended and now has six rinks instead of the original three. The brick built pavilion was built in 1986. How times have changed with no smoking in or around the green and all players dressed in white or grey trousers/skirt. I wonder what the next 100 years will bring!

Adastra Bowling Club will be holding open days on Saturdays 7th, 14th and 21st of May from 10 am to 12 noon when new players will be invited to participate and join the club. If you wish to come along there will be bowling coach to assist you. All equipment will be provided but you will require flat soled shoes or trainers.

In the morning, 12 children took part in a netball festival and in the afternoon, 10 children participated in a hockey festival. The emphasis was on fun and skill development. The sessions were brilliantly organised by the Downlands Sports Leaders and Mid Sussex Active. The children enjoyed practising their skills and showed lots of enthusiasm and team spirit during the group activities. It was lovely to see our wonderful Year 4s making the most of some welcome spring sunshine!

We also took part in Children's Mental Health Week. This year's theme was: Growing Together. means change and how that can sometimes be a bit worrying. Our thoughts then turned to the move to secondary school and the changes we would face there. Everyone agreed that, if you can, you should always share your worries with someone you trust. Year 3 have been enjoying learning about and retelling different Greek Myths. We have been curious about the roles that these play in history and the messages that they told. We learnt about the events in the story of Theseus and the Minotaur and retold the story in our own words. When reading King Midas we considered whether it would be good to have the 'Golden Touch' or even the power of turning everything into chocolate! We used conjunctions in our writing and made it sound fantastic. We were fully immersed in the myth about Perseus and Medusa. Our classrooms became Medusa's eerie cave and we thought about what we could see, feel and hear. We put ourselves into the shoes and wings of Icarus and his father Daedalus and imagined how it would feel to be able to fly. Finally, we took a peek into Pandora's Box. We thought about our favourite things that we would like to find in a special box and used amazing adjectives to describe them.

comes from and then where does it all go? These are the questions our Year 4 learners have been researching. We have explored the science behind the water cycle thorough some excellent books: 'The Rhythm of the Rain' and 'Once Upon a Raindrop' and have even had a go at creating a mini cloud in a glass jar. To show their excellent knowledge and understanding, we've had a go at becoming tour guides, leading water droplets on a wild and wacky journey through the stages of the water cycle.

In Computing for Year 5s, we have been designing and creating our very own video games. The children began by thinking about existing games and came up with a criteria for 'What makes a good video game?'. They then planned out their game and recorded the algorithm as a storyboard or flowchart, annotating the design elements, the moving parts and the areas of challenge. In DT, Year 5s have been working with the Lego kits. We thought about what we could use these robots for and the children were interested in making one to explore the planets in the solar system!

Continuing on from the pencil sketching skills we learnt in the Autumn term, Year 6 have been discovering how to effectively use watercolours. Children were given the task of creating a pencil sketch of London during the Blitz, and then creating a countryside watercolour piece as a contrast to this.

In March we had Book Week and on Thursday 3rd March was World Book Day 2022. The children had a range of exciting activities to engage in both in and out of school. Children were invited to dress up as their favourite characters from the literature they love and there was a best dressed winner from each class who won a brand new book as a prize for their efforts. 

REPAIR CAFÉ - NOW MEETING MONTHLY!

Repair Café Hassocks was started by the HKD Transition group in 2020. In the first year 22 volunteers were recruited to plan and operate the repair cafe, including 15 repairers with skills and experience in mechanical and electrical, woodwork, textile and sewing and other repairs as well as 7 other volunteers who help with organising and running the repair cafe.

The project was supported by start-up funding from West Sussex County Councill and Hassocks Parish Council. Small donations were also made by many repair café users.

We originally planned to hold a café once a month but due to Covid restrictions we were not able to hold inperson repair cafes until September 2021. We operated a successful 'remote' operation before then, with repair requests made online or by phone, and items delivered to our volunteer repairers to work on at home.

The in-person repair cafes once started have been a great success, doubling the number of repair requests. Everyone clearly enjoyed the conviviality, tea and cakes, as well as the chance to meet and talk to the repairers.

In our first year, we had 201 items delivered for repair - of these an astonishing 84% were successfully repaired. These are all items that would have ended up in the landfill, but instead will serve another day. Not everything can be repaired, and the main obstacle is usually that parts are not available. But our repairers can work wonders (often with a significant investment of their time as well as know-how).

Now, after another pause due to Covid, we have restarted monthly sessions to coincide with Hassocks Market Day.





COMMON PIPISTRELLE I spend way too much time in graveyards (especially considering that I'm going to spend an awful lot of time in one in the future). But they are great places to look for Pipistrelle bats. At this time of year, adult Pipistrelles are emerging from their winter hibernation and taking flight. Above Sussex, the night sky is a battlefield of deafening cries as Pipistrelles swoop and swirl, plummet and pounce at their insect prey.

The acrobatic anarchy overhead goes unnoticed by us humans. Our hearing is limited and when it comes to night vision, we're as blind as, well, something with really bad eyesight...in fact anything but a bat. Bats have excellent vision. But it certainly isn't their best sense.

Echolocation is one of the animal world's most incredible superpowers. A Pipistrelle shouts, the shout hits something and bounces back. This echo is instantly analysed in an amazing brain and tells the bat how far away the object is and whether it's a mosquito, a moth or a mansion. To get the maximum information from their echo, Pipistrelles yell at high frequencies (45 kHz, we can only hear up 20 kHz). And these shouts are loud; pneumatic drill or jet fighter loud. Up to 110 decibels in some species. A bat would deafen itself if it heard its own shout. So Pipistrelles have to disengage their ears, then shout, then turn their hearing back on, listen for the echo, analyse, then start all over again. All at the rate of 10-15 times a second. This gives bats an amazing, multilayered awareness of their surroundings. But it's tricky (and impolite) to shout when you're eating, so once a moth is in the mouth the bat has to chewshout-listen-chew-shout-listen to avoid a collision.

There are 17 different species of bat in Sussex. Our smallest - the Common Pipistrelle - is also the one you're most likely to see around your gardens. Back in the 80's there were just four TV channels, two types of videocassette and one species of Pipistrelle in Britain. But in the 90's, scientists discovered that some Pipistrelles were echolocating at higher frequencies (55 kHz); a Montserrat Caballé to the Common Pipistrelle's Freddie Mercury. These are the Soprano Pipistrelles. There's now a third: Nathusius' Pipistrelle. By affixing lightweight metal rings to this species' wings, researchers have discovered that these bats are migrating to Sussex from as far away as Latvia. An amazing journey for an amazing animal. sussexwildlifetrust.org.uk
