










The Mill at Albourne with James Webster-Wickham



> Huge thanks to the staff members and volunteers who supported the trip and took great care of the children around the clock, helping make the trip such an unforgettable experience for every one of them.

> Year 3 have thrown themselves into their English learning and have been enjoying writing both in school and at home. We have been blown away by the enthusiasm and engagement they have shown and the writing, as a result, has been amazing. The children delved into their 'Meet the Greeks' topic and showed a real interest in life in those times. Over the last 2 weeks, the children have used famous Greek myths as inspiration for their writing. They have designed their own Greek god or goddess and written character descriptions of them using fantastic, ambitious vocabulary as well as writing setting description for the perfect Greek myth settings. These pieces of writing have engaged the children and have been a fantastic opportunity for them to showcase all of the writing skills they have learned this half term.

Year 4 have been learning about symmetry in some





of our maths lessons. They explored horizontal, vertical and diagonal lines of symmetry using the Numicon shapes on a baseboard. The children challenged each other to complete different symmetrical patterns. There were lots of fantastic discussion and everyone really pushed themselves to make sure they had finished it correctly.

Year 5 have been busy writing poems about awareness of deforestation. They looked at, and tried to replicate, a range of different poems: kennings, free verse and strict verse. The book we used for our focus was called 'The Kapok Tree,' which explored the differing perspectives of rainforest animals and how they felt when their homes were destroyed. Each child chose an animal from the rainforest to write about and learnt how important it was to see this from the animal's perspective. This links very closely to one aspect of our curriculum intent where we ask children to become global citizens, thinking about significant issues facing the globe.

The Windmills children are heavily involved in many sporting activities and competitions. A group of Year



5 girls took part in a Tag rugby festival in April and despite the challenging weather all the pupils were brilliant. Not once did they stop trying hard, they smiled the whole time and they really enjoy it. It was also lovely to see some old Windmills girls there who were supporting running the event. A range of other sporting events including athletics, cricket, tennis and golf are coming up during the summer term. We are looking forward to a very sporty summer.

The 1st Hurstpierpoint used materials provided by South Downs Nurseries in Hassocks, including a range of succulents, compost, gravel and the necessary pots. The gift was arranged by the Budding Foundation which works to help children and young people across Sussex.

"The girls just loved making their Easter gardens", said Helen, a volunteer leader at 1st Hurstpierpoint Girls Brigade. "They enjoyed learning about how to pot succulents and look after them at home. Thank you for the generous donation which made this possible."

The members also managed to make some extra gardens to give to the Group leaders as Easter presents.

It was lovely to see how happy the girls were with their Easter gardens, we are always delighted when young people enjoy learning about horticulture and the environment they live in. **<u>GROWING MINDS GERMINATE</u>** Children learning about seed germination and the structure of plants have been helped in their studies thanks to a donation from their local garden centre.

Windmills Junior School in Hassocks have been given all they need to teach this area of the syllabus. Year 3 students can now each raise their own seeds from scratch, hold and inspect their seedling, close up, before planting it outside.

South Downs Nurseries donated some pots, seeds, compost and bedding plants to the village school.

We are always keen to support the local community and what better way than to encourage young children to discover an early interest in plants.

Items donated included multi-purpose compost, plantable seed books, radish and marigold seeds, approximately 100 green pots from the onsite nursery, and some bedding plants of viola, marigold, busy lizzie, nicotiana, and dianthus.



GHOST MOTH A few years ago, as the sun set over the South Downs, I was wandering through a wood on a twilight hike. Through the trees I noticed about a dozen figures decked out in brilliant white gathering in a small clearing. I hit the floor and buried amongst the bracken, watched as other white figures joined them. Each individual slowly started swaying, swinging hypnotically like a pendulum suspended on an invisible wire. The whole silent scene felt eerie, otherworldly, ancient. I was spellbound and barely breathing, scared I would be discovered and this mesmerising performance would end. As some of the figures swung fixed to their stations, others oscillated wildly, whirling and crashing into each other. The light was fading fast and as my surroundings dissolved into shadow the swaying white figures seemed luminous against the gloom. Then, as the full moon rose and illuminated the glade, the action slowed, the figures retreated and I was left alone in the gloaming. The ritual I had witnessed was the dance of the Ghost Moths: elaborate courtship behaviour performed by the males on warm summer evenings across Sussex. That moonlit glade had been temporarily transformed into a miniature moth disco where these incredible insects pirouetted, pranced, swaggered and strutted in an attempt to attract a female. More 'Saturday Night Fever' than 'The Wicker Man'. And, like tiny Travoltas, the male Ghost Moths know that to stand out on a crowded dancefloor you need a flashy white suit. Their wings are whiter than white and look as though they have been hand-painted with Tipp-Ex.

The female Ghost Moth has a more subdued wardrobe and wears pale yellow wings with elegant orange swirls. Males also have another trick up their sleeve (or in this case their trouser legs). Their hind legs contain furry scent-brushes, which release pheromones into the air like an overpowering aphrodisiac. Once the ladies are lured, it's the individual moth's dancing which seals the deal. It can be murder on the dancefloor and scuffles start as the males try to assert their positions. It's a behaviour known as lekking and the dominant dancers will lead a lucky lady of the lek into the surrounding shadows. In days gone by the moth's mysterious, ethereal waltz was interpreted as something supernatural and it has been suggested that the dance of the Ghost Moth gave rise to local legends of fairies and Will-O'The-Wisps. If anything, the reality is just as magical and spellbinding to watch.

DITCHLING FILM SOCIETY We are showing two films in June - on Thursday, 2nd June our film will be Petite Maman who is a heartbreakingly hopeful fairy tale for all ages. Eightyear-old Nelly (Josephine Sanz) has just lost her beloved, maternal grandmother and her parents go to her mother's childhood home to clear it. Nelly's mother (Nina Meurisse) is deeply upset by the whole process and leaves during the night without saying goodbye to her daughter. A little later, after exploring the house and then going into the woods to play, Nelly meets a similar aged girl building a treehouse. The girl, Marion (Gabrielle Sanz), is extremely friendly and invites her to help and what ultimately transpires is a tender tale of childhood grief, memory and connection.

Director: Celine Sciamma. France 2021. 72 minutes. Cert PG.

On Thursday, **16th June** we are having a special screening of Final Account - Luke Holland's film to be introduced by Sam Pope, who was the associate producer and editor. It received a standing ovation at the Venice Film Festival and is a documentary masterpiece based on nearly 300 filmed interviews with elderly perpetrators from the Nazi side - an oral history of the 3rd Reich. In the last decade of his life, Luke, a long-time resident of Ditchling, took to the road with a small camera in search of old Nazis in Germany and Austria. Little archive existed about them apart from those held to account at Nuremburg. Fearing memories would be half-recollections or lies. Luke discovered harrowing stories told from clean, well decorated homes by people apparently leading calm lives in ordinary towns, often near the empty shrines of the camps. This is an important film which everyone should see made by an acclaimed documentary-maker. In the film's epigraph, Luke said "perpetrators are not born they are made".

Director: Luke Holland 2021 German-language; British-American 90 minutes Cert PG13.

On Thursday, 7th July we shall be showing Summerland – a lovely, hopeful and rather magical film shot in Seaford and Brighton. Alice, a reclusive writer, particularly interested in folklore, is resigned to a solitary life on the cliffs by the sea in Kent while World War II rages across the Channel. She very reluctantly takes in a spirited young boy, Frank, who has been evacuated from London. Initially Alice has no time for the boy, however, she slowly warms to the new arrival whose innocence and wonder seems to rekindle long, suppressed feelings of affection. Whilst bonding with Frank, Alice starts to revert to her past and her meeting with Vera in the 20's and the pang of first love that now sits like a chip of ice in her heart.

NEWS FROM STONEYWISH There were hawthorn trees blossoming at Stoneywish on the first of May this year. The hawthorn, also known around the country as quickthorn, whitethorn or may, is one of our plant elders in the British Isles, (hawthorn pollen 7,000 years old has been found here). With age comes wisdom and the thorn tree is also one of our great teachers. A diminutive and easily overlooked, shrubby, scrubby hedgerow filler, it is yet so important in folklore and medicine and so valuable to wildlife and to our cultural memory of beauty and poetry, it deserves the highest respect. May Day, with its maypole dancing, music, flowers, and (ahem!) lovers' trysts in the bushes, originally celebrated the arrival of hawthorn blossom - the official end of winter and the beginning of summer. In the Middle Ages, according to the Gregorian calendar, that would have been the 12th of May. Branches of may were cut for the rituals of life and love - Hawthorn was believed to be a fairy tree, whose white magic protected both. And true enough, the tree really does provide a healing tonic for the heart and circulation. The first leaves, soft and palateable, were commonly known as 'bread and cheese'. A tasty nibble for children on the walk to school, or a lifesaver in time of famine. From earliest days the thorn was recognised as a useful barrier for sheep and cattle. 'Haw' comes from 'hage', Old English for hedge (here at Stoneywish we have one field with the name 'Sheep Hag', Sheep Hedge) and



after the enclosure of the commons, when the countryside assumed its familiar form - a patchwork of fields bounded by thousands of miles of hawthorn hedges, these were all pruned and 'laid' manually and annually by armies of 'hedgers'. In here on the Reserve, many of our hedgerow thorns have 'got away', and grow according to their own straggling, whim. Untrimmed and left to their own devices, these may be useless for the purpose of restraining livestock, but they have their own magical importance. Their branches provide safe refuge for birds, a bower for bees in spring, and a larder which will see hungry flocks through lean winter days. They are also, if one can only train the eye to slow down, take pause, and follow the sinuous pathways of their branches, extraordinarily beautiful. We have none which are terribly old, yet they become knobby and twisted quite young in life, if given the chance. And here is a case where old age and beauty increase together. Do not be fooled by the machine trimmed stumps you see by the roadside. These can be veterans too! The Hethel Old Thorn in Norfolk is thought to be 700 years old and in 1755 its girth was measured at 13 feet, while one of its branches was found to be over 7 yards long! The wood of the hawthorn is hard and tough (cretaegus, the latin name, comes from the Greek for strength) - even-grained enough to be used for wood-engraving - fine enough for cabinet-making and fragrant when put on the fire! The fruits can be cooked in hedgerow jams. The flowers were





once made into jellies and wines. A tree of such abundance... However did someone conceive of the idea that to bring the flowers indoors would bring death to the house? One suspects a political motive. An attack on the customs of the past, whichever past that was so long ago, when the blossoms meant life and health...

If it is not too late this year, or certainly next year, celebrate May Day on whatever day you like, by standing under a full-grown hawthorn tree and inhaling the fragrance and marvelling at the bridal sprays of flowers. The thorn tree, along with the apple, is part of the rose family – (the echoes of the theme of love linger on). So don't let anyone tell you this is common scrub and fit to be grubbed out. This is a doorway to a miraculously rich and nourishing world which is hidden in plain sight before us, if only we will take the time to look.

Michael's new exhibition celebrates the life of Mabel Russell, Ditchling's sweetheart of the First World War. Mabel was a star at the Gaiety Theatre in the early years of the 20th century and crackly recordings of her 1916 song, 'A Broken Doll', were heard with great emotion by the frontline troops who had access to wind-up gramophones. Later in life she became a Member of Parliament, the third English woman to penetrate that male enclave! Later again she retired to Ditchling, where her little dog escaped and killed chickens in the Alford farmyard. Michael was dispatched to lodge a complaint. From this unpropitious start began the great love of his life and long after her death, Michael became a Mabel 'groupie', collecting theatre bills, photographs, po8tcards and revues, of her and all her illustrious friends. 



I find myself in a lot of strange situations sometimes and end up not knowing the best solutions to the problem - here's one for you - the mound at the end of our row of shops which is owned by Wilmington Close residents is a magnet for school children, especially late afternoons, and early evenings. Most of the time they just shout and play around but, just lately they have started throwing bottles and being a pain. So, you ask them nicely to stop, sometimes they stop, sometimes they call you names and sometimes they don't but what can you do? Your hands are tied.

However, just the other day some kids on the mound who seemed to be doing nothing naughty spotted a young family pushing a wheelchair and started shouting hurtful words at them which was just the worst thing to witness. The family sensibly ignored them and kept moving, but what would you do or more to the point what could you do? Not an easy one you have to be careful these days, I decided confrontation was not the best answer, it would achieve nothing, but at the same time what they'd done wrong needed to be explained to them.

It's very heart-warming to hear so many families in Ditchling and Hassocks are opening their arms and homes to take in families fleeing the war in Ukraine. I'm not sure of the numbers but I understand it's quite a few, I have nothing but admiration for people who do this they really are a credit to our community.
