

NEWS FROM STONEYWISH -'MIDSUMMER POMPS' Midsummer is being ushered in this year in festive style: bunting and flags flaunt in shop windows and the talk is all of tea parties - a warm-up, in Ditchling, for Fair Day and another opportunity for dressing-up and enjoying al fresco food and games and, if you are lucky, a ride on the swing boats. Midsummer has always been a high point in the year. The sun's apogee was celebrated across Europe in pre-Christian times with bonfires, which were later dedicated to the Feast of St. John and the subsequent Feast of St. Peter and St. Paul. I believe the custom still survives in some countries. As a teenager I remember once attending a midsummer festival, organized in Sussex by WW2 exiles from Eastern Europe. Their St. John's Night revelries included folk dancing in national costume, feasting with traditional beers and caraway cheese and singing songs which had been passed down, for centuries, from generation to generation. I was intoxicated by the blur of ribbons and embroidery and sparks flying as the young men dared one another to jump the bonfire flames. This might have been Britain in the sixteenth century, when, according to John Stow, folk in London decorated their doorways with birch branches and stalks of fennel and lilies and festooned the streets with thousands of pendant glass oil lamps while pageants and processions went by. In the countryside, bonfires were lit and 'jumped' and impromptu banquets

were laid out at which squires and peasants sat down together. Neighbours called a truce on their differences. Midsummer, like the Twelve Days of Christmas, was a magical time. Then, as at Hallowe'en, the veil between the seen and unseen worlds was believed to grow thin. With sap high in the trees, insects busy, birdsong luxuriant, flowers abundant, the fret and effort of fledging fledglings, weaning lambs and setting all the world's helpless babies on the path to independence - these tasks all but accomplished - time appeared to stand still as the sun rested a few days at its zenith. Who could be outdoors on a midsummer night and not be intoxicated by the beauty of the moonlight, the scent of honeysuckle, the song of the nightingale? Shakespeare celebrated just this spirit of enchantment, conjured by the effervescent power of Nature, in his play A Midsummer Night's Dream. For people of Shakespeare's day, who spent their waking lives outdoors under the sun, the longest day brought together Earth energies of light, life and love, and revelry burst from them as naturally as bubbles from champagne. Disapproving of spontaneity, the moral guardians of the Reformation had something to say about this, and gradually the people's midsummer bonfires and merrymaking were extinguished. For a while they clung on as a 'sanitary' practice, to smoke and so protect the fields from pestilence. Then they gave up the ghost. This seems a pity. But the greater pity is





that today we live so much by artificial light, we are no longer as vitally tuned in to summer's lengthening and shortening days, (or to the magic they bring) as our ancestors inevitably were. Light and dark and the rhythms of the Seasons have to be experienced first hand. And Earth Magic is a sensation best savoured when the busy rational mind is temporarily stalled. Turn off the satnav and the iphone. Forget plans and agendas. In the world of Shakespeare's comedies, forests are magical places where people lose their way and find themselves. Identities are mistaken and destinies discovered. Outer confusion leads to inner transformation. According to all forest myths, to be lost, is to reach the threshold of enchantment. If our modern day summer revels can reinstate the camaraderie and spontaneity of the old festivals we shall have reclaimed something of inestimable value. But there is more... Beyond organised parties lies the great feast of life itself. If we can spend enough time under the sun, or close enough to Nature to feel the common energy which binds creation together, then we may stumble on the real magic of Midsummer. For it seems to me an awakened sense of kinship is the only way we can ensure a future, not only for mankind, but, more importantly, for our non-human cousins and neighbours, all the living forms and energies which share our planet and which have no hope of survival until we honour them as part and parcel of ourselves. And, happily for us, the key

BURGESS HILL RADIO HAS A NAME <u>CHANGE</u> Burgess Hill Radio, the Ofcom licenced community radio station covering central and south Mid Sussex, is rebranding and from 30th May will be called Mid Sussex Radio.

The station, which is based in Burgess Hill, has been broadcasting to most of Mid Sussex since October 2018 on 103.8FM and the change of name reflects that their wide range of music, interviews, local news and chat can be heard not just in Burgess Hill but also in Haywards Heath, Cuckfield, Hurstpierpoint, Hassocks, Ditchling and Chailey reaching over 100,000 potential listeners. Programme Director Steve Bird said,

"The sound of the station won't change, apart from some new jingles, because our listeners tell us that they like our current mix of music, they like our presenters and they don't want us to change."

Mid Sussex Radio, like it's predecessor, will be funded by on-air advertising, donations and grants where possible, and the hire fees for their Roadshow and Outside Broadcast Unit which is fully equipped for broadcasting from events all over Mid Sussex, providing PA, presenters, music and technical support to fete, fayre and fun day organisers.



Sales Director Jerry Bradford said,

"We've been very fortunate to have the support of some great local advertisers but some potential advertisers outside Burgess Hill have said they feel marginalised. The new radio station name should change that perception and we hope to gain new advertisers now that we're called Mid Sussex Radio"



This national initiative, from Deafblindness UK, is designed to make sure that even more people are 'in the know' about deafblindness.

Deafblindness is more common than people realise – around 400,000 people in the UK are affected. Everyone is affected differently, some might need to adjust settings on their TV or turn up the volume on their phone, others might need assistance dogs, canes and more formal care.

A deafblind person won't usually be totally deaf and totally blind, but both senses will be reduced enough to cause significant challenges in everyday life. According to the NHS, these problems can occur even if hearing loss and vision loss are mild, as the senses work together and one would usually help compensate for loss of the other.

During the week, Deafblindness UK run various events, activities and campaigns to raise awareness of dual sensory loss. 4Sight Vision Support provides free support and specialist information to blind and sight impaired residents throughout West Sussex. Staff and volunteers are experienced in assisting people with







HURST RETHINK - OUTDOOR LIGHTING AND WILDLIFE - SHEDDING LIGHT ON THE PROBLEM When we think of light pollution, the first things that probably spring to mind are cities, lighting up the night sky visible from space; or the dazzling light of stadiums and airports, to name but a few. These are now known to be having a devastating effect on insect populations, as flying creatures in their billions are drawn to the light. Confusing it with the natural light of the moon, their navigational senses are fatally disrupted. Frogs, birds, bats and other nocturnal creatures are also impacted by outdoor lighting. This is important because insects are key to human survival, responsible for pollinating fruit and vegetables and as food for birds, fish and mammals.

We are now realising the harmful impact of uncontrolled bright light in our own outdoor spaces on wildlife. This wasn't a problem until fairly recently - outdoor lighting was predominantly of a lower intensity – yellow-toned sodium lights, or candle flames. In recent years, with the increasing use of high intensity lighting in LED installations for example, night flying insects are irresistibly attracted and die in unsustainable numbers as they flutter around the billions of 'artificial moons' put in their path. Clearly we have to rethink our outdoor lighting choices. Since artificial light in gardens disrupts natural behaviour for a range of wildlife, it's important to retain some dark areas and also question whether you really need lighting. The trend for lighting up gardens as extensions of our living space may seem an inviting one but needs to be done with great care.

How does your garden glow? When installing outdoor lighting, awareness of the impact on wildlife is key. Dimmer lighting such as warm white has been shown to be less harmful for example. Outdoor lighting installed sparingly and not left on all night can make a big difference. Security lighting kept in sensor mode. Lighting that is controllable rather than products that do not switch off in the hours of darkness are best. If we avoid flood lighting our outdoor spaces we can help our struggling wildlife. *Charlotte Snook*

OLDLAND WINDMILL was built in 1703 to provide stone ground flour to the two local villages of Keymer and Ditchling. The first photograph we have was taken when the mill was dressed to mark Queen Victoria's Golden Jubilee in 1887. The Mill continued to work commercially until about 1912 when it was abandoned.

In 1980 the then Hassocks Amenity Association (HAA) obtained ownership of the mill and commenced restoration. By the early 1990s dismantling the mill was well underway to identify where repair work was needed (see the second image). This work was put in hand, and the original milling machinery restored and refitted. The first flour was ground in 2008 after a break of nearly 100 years!

The opportunity of Queen Elizabeth's Platinum Jubilee was taken to replicate the much earlier 'dressing' as can be seen in the third image. May the mill never again suffer the indignity of being abandoned.

## STEVE'S BACK PAGE GOSSIP

I must admit I did thoroughly enjoy all the platinum jubilee celebrations, Trooping the Colour, the concert, and the parade. You must agree that when it comes to these sorts of celebrations, we are world leaders, nobody does it better and as for the queen with Paddington that was priceless, but we must move on to another one bites the dust. Yes, Sharni Williams Hair or the Pink Palace as I called it has closed its doors and left Hassocks, but I bet you anything it won't be another hairdressers or cafe or charity shop. Mind you mon dieu I reckon if someone set up an all proceeds to Ukraine Charity Shop I imagine it would do rather well. Lovely Jubbly as Del Boy would say, but we shall have to wait and see, it's in a good position next to Budgens supermarket with parking at the rear so watch this space. If I hear any rumours, I will let you know.

"My God it's still up" now that's something I don't get to say much these days but yes, the Gazebo on the side of Bella and Meg's is still erect, it would seem there has been a stay of execution so for the time being it can stay as it is for all you coffee aficionados who enjoy sitting outside watching the world go by this can only be good news for all concerned

Now for a bit of ancient history in 1960 when I was 12 years old, I can very clearly remember waking up one morning and feeling not at all right, to be very honest, I felt like death warmed up, which in actual fact wasn't far from the truth. Mum could see I really wasn't well and took me to see Doctor Price who was based in Blackwater, he was an old school Doctor who had a stock cure for everything which was to take an aspirin. To him it was the wonder drug, but obviously it didn't work, and I got worse and worse and in sheer panic, my father phoned the Doctor who agreed to do an emergency home visit.

Now as luck would have it, Doctor Price was on holiday and the locum was a Doctor Evans who had just done a course in tropical diseases and immediately diagnosed I had Weils Disease, which can be a killer and in those days often was. In this day and age caught early the survival rate is high. I was blue lighted to the Royal Berkshire Hospital in Reading where I was in Kempton Ward. It was touch and go for about a week. They seemed to treat it in those days by lots of blood transfusions, rather than the antibiotics which they use now, the proper name for what I'd caught from rats' urine is Leptopirosis. In a lot of cases, it only causes a mild illness but, in some people when a more severe form of Leptopirosis occurs this more severe form is commonly referred to as Weils Disease, so called after Doctor Adolf Weil who first described the disease in 1886. Thankfully due to the wonderful care I received at the royal Berks by all the Doctors, Nurses, Sisters, Matrons, yes you had them all in those days and all decked out in their respective uniforms and how beautiful they all looked too. I made a full recovery; I was very lucky if Doctor Evans hadn't been standing in as a locum the outcome would have been a lot different - amazingly when I first arrived in Hassocks with a new wife in 1972. I went along to the local doctor to register, the first thing he said to me was are you the Edgington listed in the medical journal for surviving Weils Disease. I was pleased to say I was that man.

Before I go Thank You everyone who wished me 'Happy Birthday' and some who even bought me a little present, that really was very kind. I promise not to make such a fuss about it next year when I hit 71. Steve
