**NEWS FROM STONEYWISH** A month or so ago, I picked up a fascinating little book about the history of our local Commons. There were useful dates in it and maps outlining the former extent of the land and thinking that this would be useful for an article one day. I put my purchase in a special place. Of course. that was a fatal thing to do. It seems that all memory of the 'special place' has vanished and after hunting high and low, here I am, on the deadline day for 'News from Stoneywish', having to 'wing it' unaided. But why an interest in Commons? Commons these days are mostly dog-walking facilities where a few wildlife enthusiasts count adders and butterflies and erect information boards. A mere hundred years ago they were wild expanses containing gypsy camps and tumbledown cottages where folk carried on a handful of specialised trades: charcoal-burning, broom-making, turf-cutting, coppicing, herb gathering, brickmaking... Susan Falkner, in her delightful memoir, recalls the freedom of a childhood spent playing and exploring on the wildlife-abundant Ditchling Common, while her father, Hilary Pepler, printed books on his hand-press close by. As Reeve, he had the unenviable task of chasing the local grazers for their commoners' fees. Michael's family owned the right to graze 7 and a half cows on the Common and these animals were walked to their pasture up Common

Lane, while the farm children ran ahead, closing the garden gates of the houses in North End in case the cows wandered through. Go back another century or two and the size of the Common was greater still. Ditchling and Chailey, linked by Middle Common, adjoined St. John's Common in Burgess Hill, with Clayton Common flanking the villages to the West. These formed part of the last trackless wastes of Britain: rough land, too poor for crops, with unmetalled coach roads linking isolated wayside inns, the haunt of smugglers and robbers, and, as Jacob's Post in Ditchling attests, adorned with cautionary gibbets. Earlier still, such places furnished the Civil War with its battlegrounds and held memories of the legendary wildwood which once covered the country. Roman outposts were sparks of civilisation in a vastness where wolves and wild boar roamed free. As progress marched on, the wild retreated. Divide and rule has been the conqueror's best tactic. The assumption of a right to control has seen the countryside parcelled up into lots for sale at an ever-increasing rate. But what is interesting is that each wave of 'enclosure', has had a corresponding effect on the ecology of the human landscape too. The land, which is still, by the way, imbued with the magical ability to reweave webs of furze, stonechat, mayfly, adder and oak, given half a chance, is but one half of the picture.



the old herbals reveal, each plant offered a specific pathway to the energies of the stars, and thereby to a wealth of legend. Trees had their own calendar in Celtic lore and their own alphabet. Flowers carried emotional messages. (Think of Shakespeare: "There's rosemary, that's for remembrance.") The creatures of the forest were also sacred truth-bearers. We could hardly imagine life steeped in the depth and richness of this inheritance – of living among the Living. As history has unfolded, power-hungry rulers and 'educators' have annexed more and more of it, splicing off areas, debarring areas, demonizing areas, till only the odd poem catches echoes of it, and who passes on poems these days? In his foreword to The White Goddess, Robert Graves puts the case more plainly: "'Nowadays' is a civilisation in which the prime emblems of poetry are dishonoured. In which the serpent, lion and eagle belong to the circus-tent; ox, salmon and boar to the cannery; racehorse and greyhound to the betting ring; and the sacred grove to the saw-mill. In which the Moon is despised as a burned-out satellite of the Earth and woman reckoned

as 'auxilliary State personnel'. In which money will buy almost anything but truth, and almost anyone but the truth-possessed poet." In our lonely world of numbers and fearful predictions we live with dwindling belief in anything but the increasingly mad decrees of the power-brokers who act in our name. But to reverse this process, extend and restore the human commons. might be the one life-enriching, world-changing endeavour left open to us. As the visionary writer and agro-ecologist Pierre Rabhi noted, we too have been 'enclosed'. We live our lives in boxes, from the incubator to the coffin. We make our homes in boxes, work in boxes, travel in boxes. Our minds are absorbed by 'the box'! William Wordsworth, and Blake before him, saw 'enclosure' as a fatal condition, for man and land alike. I am sorry I lost the book with the maps and dates in it. I could have written a perfectly acceptable article about local history...

Instead, a call to action! What would happen if people reclaimed their common-land birthright, like the 'Diggers' of the 17th century? Not as eco-activists in a literal sense, but as individuals determined to see the world as a joined-up place to *live* in, rather than a plot to perish in. Is it possible for mankind to choose an alternative to the world as Real Estate and the plasticised monotony of Disney? And if so where might such a revolution begin? The answer must be in the heart-mind, of course, for this is where 'enclosure' began and there is nowhere else that is truly ours, or more astonishingly able to make vital connections. There are stonechats and lizards and gorse flowers sleeping in our souls, too, just waiting to return. And then, what miracles might not follow?



GRASS SNAKE "Go wild in the country, where snakes in the grass are absolutely free." I can still remember Annabella Lwin, of new-wave pop group Bow Wow Wow, singing those words on Top of the Pops back in 1982: a clarion call for early eighties urbanites to get out into the wild.

Annabella was ecologically correct. There are indeed free snakes out there, a fact that still thrills me each time I encounter one slithering through Sussex. As a child I thought snakes were exotic creatures, which hung off African jungle branches in Johnny Weissmuller Tarzan movies to convey a vague sense of something sinister. But there's nothing sinister about the Grass Snake; the commonest of Britain's three native snake species. Mesmerising eyes, gorgeous sleek scales of olive-green and a series of stripes along their flanks. For a cold-blooded reptile they sure look hot. A key identification feature is that yellow collar encircling the back of their head. Grass Snakes have been rather short-changed when it comes to their name; they're much better at swimming than they are at sitting in the grass (a bit like Johnny Weissmuller, who performed better in the water than he did on dry land). You'll find Grass Snakes gliding through wet ditches and dykes or even in your garden pond as they hunt for their favourite food: frogs and toads.

These amphibious feasts really pile on the pounds, so

when their snakeskin suits become too tight, they slip out of them to reveal a larger, shiny set of scales underneath. They undertake several costume changes each year and can grow to an impressive size – two or three feet is typical but there are rumours of sixfoot long monsters out there. Of course they're nothing be scared of. If threatened they either pretend to be dead, hiss a lot or, according to my reptile book, "release a pungent, foul-smelling substance from their anal gland."

In July the female Grass Snakes excavate a chamber in a mound of decaying vegetation – a compost heap is perfect. Inside, she lays 5-20 leathery eggs and the heap's heat and humidity cooks them to perfection. Set your egg timer for ten weeks and you'll return to find pencil-sized baby snakes emerging into the world

I guess not everyone followed Bow Wow Wow's advice back in 1982 because when leading my wildlife walks I'm always amazed at how many adults have never seen a snake in Britain. But it's never too late to go wild in the country.



OLDLAND WINDMILL was built in 1703 to provide stone ground flour to the two local villages of Keymer and Ditchling. The first photograph we have was taken when the mill was dressed to mark Queen Victoria's Golden Jubilee in 1887. The Mill continued to work commercially until about 1912 when it was abandoned.

In 1980 the then Hassocks Amenity Association (HAA) obtained ownership of the mill and commenced restoration. By the early 1990s dismantling the mill was well underway to identify where repair work was needed (see the second image). This work was put in hand, and the original milling machinery restored and refitted. The first flour was ground in 2008 after a break of nearly 100 years! The opportunity of Queen Elizabeth's Platinum Jubilee was taken to replicate the much earlier 'dressing' as can be seen in the third image. May the mill never again suffer the indignity of being abandoned.

The one question 1 get asked more than any other, apart from how come with so many cats they all seemed to get on? - and just in case you didn't know a group or pack of cats is called Clowder - anyway, I'm always asked how come my cats fur is so soft, that's because I'm oil obsessive. I put it in everything mostly vegetable oil occasionally olive or fish oil, but in every single meal they have raw egg and a variety of vitamins and minerals and I have found that fleas are less likely to inhabit their coats - with the coat all silky they are a lot easier to groom and I always use a wide tooth comb, it doesn't pull and you're less likely to put them off. This time of year I get a lot of phone calls about sick and injured birds and we are lucky enough to have a group of volunteers locally who are willing to help and do what they can to save a whole variety of wildlife, but now because of the latest strain of bird flu sadly any bird found injured or otherwise has to be put down. It's really heart breaking for all concerned. If you find an injured bird just take it to your local vet, do not take it into the surgery, inform the vet you have an injured bird in your car and they will come out and assess it. This is all you can do, however I picked up a baby seagull just recently, there were plenty of people out there willing to put it down, but rightly or wrongly I had a different idea. He didn't seem badly injured just exhausted and a bit thin, so why not give him a chance, so here he is Jonathan Livingstone Seagull looking a lot better and certainly not a bird flu candidate. Let's hope eventually he'll fly off into the wild blue yonder and survive in this rather turbulent world.

Before I go just a little bit more gossip, the now repossessed hairdressers which is next to the dancewear shop is quite likely to become some kind of dance studio, though it's not written in stone yet - watch this space.
