BRIGHTON CONSORT - REFORMATIONS

Brighton Consort, who are well known for their concerts of early choral music, will be returning to Hurstpierpoint in November with "Reformations – beliefs that changed a continent". The programme will include two large, three-section pieces: the Miserere by Josquin des Prez, composed in 1504, and William Byrd's Infelix ego, published in 1591 with text written a century earlier by the radical Florentine priest Savonarola while he was languishing in his prison cell. These works will be interspersed with music by other famous composers of the 15th and 16th centuries, including Isaac, Palestrina, Tallis and Lambe.

The performance of this truly great choral music will take place on Saturday 26th November at 3 pm in Holy Trinity Church, Hurstpierpoint. HURST RETHINK The Queen's Green Canopy - a chance to celebrate the life of Elizabeth II Earlier this year Hurst Rethink launched a campaign to encourage locals to join in a nationwide tree planting initiative called the 'Queen's Green Canopy' to celebrate the Queen's Jubilee. We hoped to see around 7,000 trees planted in Hurstpierpoint - one for each resident (approximately!). With the passing of Queen Elizabeth II in September, this campaign has gained extra significance. As a nationwide initiative created to mark the Platinum Jubilee, the OGC was due to conclude in December – the end of the Jubilee year. However, as the official tree planting season in the United Kingdom is from October to March, the initiative will now be extended to include the full tree planting season, beginning in October 2022 and concluding in March 2023. This extension is in accordance with the campaign's Patron, His Majesty the King. Hurst Rethink are proud to be part of creating a living legacy with over a million trees planted in Her Majesty's name across the nation during the first planting season, October 2021 to March 2022. POLECAT For most of us, our only encounters with British mammals are spotting them on the roadside as we hurtle past at 55mph. I'm sure many people these days believe that lying motionless on a road verge with its feet in the air is natural behaviour for a Badger. Our road trips may be macabre safaris, but roadkill can tell us a lot about the state of our island's mammalian fauna. Hedgehogs, a squashed staple on the roadkill menu a few decades ago, are now hard to find flattened on the highway, reflecting their dramatic fall in numbers in the wider countryside. And recently an unfamiliar corpse has appeared on the tarmac: the Polecat. Before being killed by cars, Polecats already had a long history of persecution in England – mainly for eating poultry and notoriously stinking to high heaven. To Shakespeare, and many others since, 'Polecat' was an insult. The species was exterminated from Sussex around 1890. Indeed, the entire English population was banished to the wilderness of Wales. Yet we were happy to welcome their watered-down, domesticated form – the Ferret – as cuddly pets and ruthless Rabbit hunters.

After a century in exile, purebred Polecats are making a comeback. This re-colonisation was the basis for a recent investigation by the Vincent Wildlife Trust who requested roadkill Polecat corpses for DNA testing to verify their pure Polecat lineage (as opposed to Polecat/Ferret hybrids). I was soon dodging traffic on the Steyning by-pass and excitedly picking up a dead Polecat. Being mustelids,

Polecats naturally smell, but take my word for it, they smell a lot worse when they've been dead for a few days. Despite discharging a whole can of Glade, my wife smelt that something was up seconds after I set foot in the house.

Putting a dead Polecat in your freezer will test even the strongest of marriages.

Thankfully, after some smooth talking, my marriage is still intact but there are still some fish fingers that neither of us are brave enough to eat. Next morning a package arrived from the Vincent Wildlife Trust containing heavy duty bags, some cool Biohazard stickers and printed instructions for posting Polecats.

After an interesting exchange at the post office counter, my roadkill casualty was posted. A few days later, it was declared 100% Polecat; further evidence that Polecats have returned to Sussex. It's

THE WINDMILLS JUNIOR SCHOOL We have had a great start to the term. Lots of active learning, lots of active new opportunities and lots of singing! Singing assembly and choir are back and it is an absolute joy to hear the children's voices ringing through the hall once again. We are excited to be building on our parent engagement this term by welcoming parents back into the school to attend celebration assemblies and sessions with their children to share learning. Collaboration and a strong relationship between school and home are so important.

Our new year 3 children have settled in brilliantly and have been having lots of fun in maths; learning how to predict patterns, make links between different bonds, number trios and finding doubles. In art they have been expressing themselves through 'doodle art', using different ways of mark-making and a variety of patterns to create their own designs. We were really impressed with the level of focus, perseverance and care that they took.

Year 4 have been learning about Ancient Egypt and have produced some incredible scarab beetle artwork through carefully studying the different body parts to demonstrate accurate proportions in their

sketching. In geography they have been learning about the River Nile and naming the different parts of a river. The children enjoyed a practical session making replica rivers from tin foil so they could discover for themselves what makes a river flow. Year 5 recently spent a week doing some work based around the 'Room of Requirement' from the Harry Potter books. We have a wonderful outdoor learning environment that we are very proud of which the children all love spending time in. Year 6 were recently challenged to make 'Green Man' faces on the trees using mud, berries, leaves and twigs. The results were astonishing and there was some great teamwork and lots of happy, smiling faces. They also enjoyed making mud balls to throw at targets – everyone had lots of fun and got really messy! The children recognise that spending time outdoors and having these opportunities for practical fun with their friends is also great for their mental health and wellbeing.



Not to mention the children proudly carrying in their miniature gardens.


The judges remarked on the high quality of the entries, across all categories.





"Bringing in the mangels," came his prompt reply. 'Mangels', for anyone not in the know, are mangel-wurzels, (or 'mangolds', in country dialect), a wurzel being a root, and mangel a kind of turnip. These fat, gold-and plumcoloured beets were grown as winter fodder for the cows. In September the leafy tops would be cut off in the field and the roots unearthed ready for harvest. When they were brought in it was the job of the farm children to lob them onto great heaps which half-filled the barn. No wonder the Alfords bred good cricketers! The cows had their mangels served chopped in their feeding troughs as they were milked and on a Saturday, the men would rest from milking and take their refreshment alongside them: mugs of steaming tea and heavenly cream slices, (made and delivered by Mr. Maidment from West Street), the tray balanced on a 10 gallon milkchurn for a table. On dark winter mornings, the cowstalls were lit by oil lamps, and it was Michael's job, when young, to clean the soot out of the 'chimneys'. The cow-stalls were warmed by the breath of the animals. The lamps must have thrown living shadows on the walls - timeless moments, which seem out of reach of our frantic, electrified world.

We are accustomed to moan about the nights drawing in at this time of year. Perhaps the ability to control most things in our environment makes us less adaptable than our forebears, for it seems few of us in the West relish the encroachment of darkness. We react to it by staging the super-illumination of our houses, streets and cities as winter deepens, but I wonder if something important is not lost along the way. In 'indigenous', that is to say pre-digital/industrial households across the world, dark-

ness is still respected by country people. Darkness is another realm, a world of rest from toil, a world where people gather together round a communal hearth and share stories and food and companionship. For the Dagara people of West Africa, darkness is sacred, belonging to the dimension of Spirit. To intrude there with any light other than the storyteller's campfire, is considered an act of disrespect. As fuel bills rise, will we have to stop taking light for granted and relearn the art of living with shadows? Of course nobody wants people to be stumbling about, tripping over things and burning the toast because they can't see what they are doing. But perhaps it is not all doom and gloom. Changing with the seasons, becoming winter people, could possibly remind us of forgotten gifts, making us slow down, take note of one another, and feel the pulse of Nature around us. The Danes cultivate slow, candle-lit, family evenings together, practising their celebrated Hygge, or art of cosiness, which helps them score so well in the world's register of Happiness. Perhaps we too could benefit from blessings of the old Viking Valhalla, or Saxon Mead Hall: comradeship, conviviality, and the delicious sense that the colder and darker it is outside, the more we should gather and share together.

The cosmos for the Dagara is divided between five elements: Fire, Water, Mineral, Nature and Earth. Water cultures are slow-moving, peaceable, respectful of the past and the wisdom of the ancestors. Fire is the furnace of our first origin, bringing warmth and the inspiration of dreams, but in its negative aspect it can cause havoc. Cultures where fire rages out of control are the cultures of progress and expansion, addicted to speed and violence. Goading into an ever- aster pace and seizing ev

erything in its path, this fire destroys nature and brings tension, sickness and war. Malidoma Patrice Somé, who has written so eloquently about the beliefs and traditions of his village in Burkina Faso, makes this plea to us, the fire-culture people who are burning up the world: that we change our focus from the destructive fires of impatience and goal-seeking and nurture instead the kindly hearth-warmth of fellowship and belonging. This seems like sound advice for drivers incensed by the kerfuffles in Ditchling High Street! Perhaps for us all in these crazy times.

Autumn invites a turning inward, a pause in the hurry of life. A self-enrichment. In herbal medicine this is the time to gather roots because the life force of a plant retreats and concentrates below ground as sunlight wanes. There is a return to origins. Creatures which have gorged on summer's bounty, now face a change - the challenge of austerity. Their bodies will survive on what they have laid up for winter. Conserving energy, they will rely on their own coats for warmth and their own hearts' endurance to see them through. And humans? One last thought from the Dagara people: They believe that plants are the wisest things on earth, because they were here first and because they can communicate silently, through pure spirit. Animals come second, because they evolved next and they can communicate in grunts and sounds without the need for words. Humans, the last to arrive, are the least intelligent, because they need language in order to understand one another. The more words people use, so the argument goes, the further they are from their sacred roots. Fact-trading, logic, dialectic are the language of estrangement. Conversely, the language of poetry is a bridge, by which man tries to return to his source. Oh dear! Not much hope for someone who uses so many words to write her QD article! But in a way, though not a poem, this is an attempt to attune to the gentler, wiser values of those who have gone before. There are times when being 'connected' to the modern world feels like



being at the mercy of a persistent nuisance caller, an unknown and invisible pest who wishes to pry into every moment of our lives. Maybe autumn is a good time to put the phone down and seek a different kind of connectedness, with the earth, with our past, and the 'village' of people we can actually reach out to and touch. As for me, I'll just creep off to my chimney corner and dream about cream slices... all friends welcome. And may your autumn dreams come true too!


