

WITH REFERENCE TO THE PHOTOGRAPHS OF THE SCOUT CAMPS, shown in the November issue of the Hassocks in Keymer Talk About, the old cliche of "behind every picture there is a story", springs to mind.

On Thursday, 1st December our film will be Love Actually – a Christmas themed romantic comedy edy drama written and directed by Richard Curtis. The film delves into dif-

THE WINDMILLS JUNIOR SCHOOL October flew by in a flash, with fantastic learning and some really important events. We had a great first half term! The children have enjoyed a harvest assembly and as part of this made donations to the local food bank. Our families were so generous and we couldn't believe how much we collected and the food bank were incredibly grateful. This teaches the children such important lessons about working as a community; with those that can supporting others who have less.

10 of our year 4 children took part in a Netball skills festival run by Mid-Sussex-Active (MSA) and year 9 Downlands students. MSA run two types of events; festivals for children to experience a new sport and competitions where we put in a team. This was the first netball experience for some of our children. They had a great time and demonstrated fantastic attitudes to learning something new.

12 children were selected from across year 6 to be trained how to be sports leaders. Children were given the opportunity to put themselves forward for the role and then the teachers selected from these. The selected children are outstanding role models and are committed to supporting others. Well done to all those who were selected. They took part in an active training session where they learnt games that they could then adapt for the younger children.

This month, Year 3 have thrown themselves into their English learning and writing. They have used 'The Stone Age Boy' as inspiration for their writing. We imagined the pictures had all been lost for the book and the children had to paint the pictures by using their words. This took hard work and some good planning by the children. They also enjoyed their first exploration of our fabulous outdoor learning space and made a 3D map of the area by making use of the natural resources around us. They took part in a game of 'Leaf Bingo', using images of leaves, flowers and trees from the woodland they had to see how many they could spot. Great fun was also had making berry paints and creating art using totally natural products. Year 4 have become expert embalmers and have been learning how to mummify dead pharaohs! As no dead pharaohs were available, they practised their new skills on teddy bears, giving clear and precise instructions verbally and in writing. Some of which were very gruesome, for example;

"Get a sharp metal hook into one nostril and wiggle it around to break the connection with the head. Pull it back out (with the brains)".

Meanwhile, year 5 have been learning all about Mountains. They started the topic by learning about the different types of mountains and how they are formed. The children then learned what the key features of a mountain are and how to show a mountain on a map using contour lines. The children were tasked with creating a mountain out of playdough. The tricky bit was then creating their own contour diagram of this mountain using card. They turned out brilliantly! They finished the topic by collaborating on Google Docs to create a shared information poster all about the famous mountains we have here in the UK.

Year 6 have been studying 'The Invention of Hugo Cabret' by Brian Selznick this half term. The author is also the illustrator of this brilliant book and we set the challenge of recreating some of the drawings. FOX Christmas is almost here folks and it'll soon be time for that fella in the red coat to come sneaking around. Yep, your neighbourhood Fox is on the prowl and shortly after Santa has finished pulling presents out of his sack, your local Fox will be busy trying to pull half a turkey out of your bin bag.

Foxes have lived among us for centuries and, just like Christmas, they're celebrated in folklore and myths all around the world. Whether the story belongs to the Greeks, Japanese, Celts, Native Americans, Disney or Roald Dahl it is always the same – the Fox is portrayed as cunning, slippery and devious. I prefer intelligent, adaptable and resourceful - and it's these traits that have helped the Fox to survive in the modern world. It was the modern world that transformed the Fox's wild woods into endless agricultural fields, towns, cities, tower blocks and cul-de-sacs. Traditionally, in the face of development Britain's wildlife has silently been displaced and died. But where others fled destruction the Fox, like any shrewd opportunist, saw a brave new world of golden opportunities where the dustbins overfloweth and where the streets are paved with cast away kebabs and finger-lickin' chicken.

And for me this is the chapter in the Fox's story that does indeed seem mythical: that in urban Britain there are wild dogs living among us. I can look out my bedroom window and see a relative of the Wolf, Dingo, Jackal and Coyote casually sauntering across my lawn. It's a touch of the Serengeti in suburban Sussex. Studies undertaken by the University of Brighton have estimated that there are 20 Foxes per square kilometre in the city. Of course, tradition dictates that some



people do not like Foxes. As I child I always viewed the Boxing Day hunt as the antithesis to Christmas; a reminder that amidst this season of goodwill there are still people who are proud to dress up in costumes in a public celebration of their cruelty.

It's in the bleak midwinter that Foxes are at their most vocal. The blood-curdling, human-like scream of the vixen sounds like something from a Hammer Horror film. This foxy lady is only fertile for a few days and her scream advertises her availability and sparks bowwows, barks and bickering from amorous dog Foxes. Her cubs will be born about fifty-two days after mating and emerge from their earths in April.

So this Christmas if you've had it with the plastic snowmen, the fake tree and the fake sentiments take a short walk away from it all and out into the darkness. Listen for the sound of wild dogs howling at the moon, the sound of survival. Let it stir something wild in your heart. Merry Christmas everybody and best wishes for 2023.

driven by anxiety and fear of losing out. Not having enough fairy lights or crispy nibbles to go round. Not enough space in the freezer. Not enough oxygen or soil on the planet. The demand is for ever larger batteries, ever-more sophisticated gadgets to buy us time, provide us with the security we crave. Spares for tomorrow. Even though such inventions encourage society to consume more, waste more, and continue the age old practices of exploitation and plunder which started the problem in the first place. Can anyone now remember a time when we were not in a state of emergency? Not needing to be somewhere else? Not under stress? And the thing in shortest supply, of course, is Time - Time, the antagonist, that eats our days, steals our lives and stalks us with stopwatch in hand.

I would like to propose the existence of a different kind of time. A time which is not a human artefact. Which has no agenda beyond sustaining life on earth. supplies. The Sampo is a kind of cosmic clock. Its top represents the beauty of the sky and as the stars revolve they bring the blessings of a simple life; sustenance, craft and domestic happiness. Beneath its pillar, (the World Tree), its roots are buried deep in the earth. This Sampo, so the story goes, is one day stolen and lost at sea. Only fragments can be recovered and though Ilmarinen, the blacksmith, sets about welding the pieces back together, the new Sampo he creates is missing some of its old magic. It no longer forms a causeway linking all parts of the cosmos. As I see it, this second mill is more like an agricultural calendar and its workings are subject to the vagaries of the weather. Sometimes it brings plenty, sometimes scarcity and it requires much labour and skill to keep it turning. Over the centuries, the system has been abused and overthrown. Today we are left with substitute, mechanical technologies which ape the bounty of heaven but leave the world poorer than before. In its latest incarnation, Agriculture has all but lost its links with Nature, and become an industrial 'science', producing food which people are afraid to eat. The 'super-fast' Sampo has turned the Feast of Life into an angst-fest, spewing out short-lived luxuries but leaving behind a trail of destruction, debt and redundancy. Today's global, industrial mill grinds ever faster in order to produce more for less. And its distribution of wealth is unequal. What is its real purpose, one might ask, and then again, what powers it? Whose food, whose money, whose skills go into it? Is it even possible that this pseudo-Sampo has become a devourer of life, rather than a provider? A slave-driver rather than a gift-giver? And do we have to dance to its tune? Here are insights by two indigenous thinkers who say 'No': First, Martín Prechtel, on the question of haste: "All these people saying we need to do something quick - it's the "quickness" we need to do

something about. Otherwise life is a constant emergency with no time to live, no future. This is what makes the unregulated toxicity of the whole mess."

Second, Pierre Rabhi, an Algerian-born visionary, who devoted the last years of his life to restoring lands in the chemical- and drought-ravaged Sahel. In his book, 'L'Offrande au Crépuscule', he contrasts the expansive and easy-going 'natural time' of his African-peasant students, with the frenetic clock-watching of the West. People from both cultures work hard but in drastically different ways. "It is unusual", says Rabhi, "to see an authentic peasant hurry." (My translation). Does that sound familiar? Our own Sussex peasants were once characterised by their refusal to be 'druy' by overseers. True peasant folk the world over, like their animals, move in step with the rhythms of the cosmos: the rising and setting of the sun; the seasons of growth and decay. They do not consume time and their time does not consume life. Indigenous time is the unfolding of life. They *make* time by singing it in their songs, fashioning it with their hands, giving birth to it through their children. For them, the Western mantra of 'time is money' has no practical meaning. As Rhabhi notes, their time is an internal vastness, hard for us to imagine. It may not be easy for us, as outsiders, to step into this space or understand how precious it is to those who live there. But it might do us good to try. Somewhere, between the cultures of old and

new, I feel there must still be holy, common ground, where seekers from either world can celebrate kinship and sanity together.

When life gets too crazy for words, perhaps we should all slow down and remember the first Sampo. It might be the best thing we can do for our beleaguered planet. And for ourselves. We can step out under the sky at any time to reassure ourselves that there will be no shortage of stars this Christmas. And never mind the Economy. 'Economy' does not mean making a profit or scrimping and saving. The root of the word 'economy' means 'housekeeping' and keeping a good house, means simply opening the door and inviting people in and making beauty and sharing the good things you have, however humble they are. Who knows? If enough people try it, we might even get the heavenly mill working properly again! For year upon year I have made myself ill, trying to keep up with the Christmas Rush. This year, I say: 'Down with it all'! The Roman mid-winter festival of Saturnalia was a time of rest and merriment. A celebra-

tion of the Golden Age before Saturn/Chronos/Old Father Time was kidnapped and clapped in irons. So this Christmas I wish you the bliss of a little idleness, time to tuck into your figgy pudding and listen to the whispers of the trees and may you find therein much Peace and Joy!

History of Christmas Cards

The first Christmas card was created and sent in 1843. A man named John Calcott Horsley printed the first Christmas card for Sir Henry Cole, the friend who had given him the idea.

Sir Henry Cole, a wealthy British businessman, wanted a card he could proudly send to friends and professional acquaintances to wish them a "Merry Christmas."

The card depicted a typical English family enjoying the holiday, and people performing acts of charity. An important part of Victorian Christmas spirit. A thousand copies of the card were printed and sold for one shilling. This is reportedly the first Christmas card to be produced and sold to the public.


