

ever examination results with a Progress 8 score of +0.59. This in effect means that our students achieve over half a grade higher in every subject than similar students across the country. The report also emphasises the strength of our community, our expert teachers, the fantastic behaviour of our students, the warm and trusting relationships between our students and our staff, our strong pastoral care, and the range of opportunities available to students. It also recognises our work on character and how it is developing our students into successful learners.



GREAT SPOTTED WOODPECKER My New Year's resolution is to try and be more positive about the future - but I already feel like banging my head repeatedly against a tree. Standing out in the street this morning, I heard a noise that reassured me that I'm not alone.

The drumming of the Great Spotted Woodpecker is a familiar sound throughout February, surely earning this striking black and white bird the reputation as one of Britain's most famous drummers along with Ringo Starr and Phil Collins. The bird's drumming serves an important function because the Great Spotted Woodpecker realises it can't sing and doesn't attempt to. Sadly, the same can't be said for Ringo Starr and Phil Collins. Instead, its drumroll is a percussive proclamation that hammers home the message to other male woodpeckers to stay away from its territory in the treetops. It also serves to drum up support from female woodpeckers in the

vicinity who may be looking for a pied partner.

This 'song' may not be as sweet as the melodies sung by the Robin or Blackbird but it still gets its message across. Indeed, the drumming can carry the bird's message across half a mile of countryside, with a male broad-casting up to 600 drumrolls a day. Each drumroll consists of up to 10-16 beats, typically in a one second burst. Of course, if I did attempt to take my frustrations out on a tree in a similar way, I'd suffer some form of concussion - but woodpeckers are specially designed to avoid this by having shock absorbent tissue between the base of their bill and their strengthened skulls to cushion the impact.

Their incredible beak is more than just a drumstick, it's also a pickaxe which allows them to chip away at trunks to excavate their own nest hole; and a chisel with which the woodpecker prises open tree bark to find food. That mighty beak is a formidable weapon too,


which sends other birds on the peanut feeder scarpering pretty sharpish. And Great Spotted Woodpeckers are becoming more greatly spotted, as it is a British bird which is actually increasing in numbers. The pecker's population leapt in the seventies and nineties, with some estimates stating they have increased by 300% over the past five decades. The availability of dead wood thanks to Dutch Elm Disease and the availability of peanuts thanks to British bird lovers being among of the reasons for this increase. See, I ended the article on a positive note, maybe I won't break my New Year's resolution after all.

Well done to me, I'm feeling upbeat about the future. Now to put the kettle on, put my feet up, and turn on the news...

NEWS FROM STONEYWISH On the threshold of this New Year there is not a lot to report from Stoneywish. Except that the blackbird is gorging himself on the last of the frostsplit crab apples in our garden and that there seems to be a spirit of revolt abroad amongst the local pigs. The boar at Stoneywish, being housed in his winter quarters in the paddock and growing tired of his confinement, let himself out for a walk the other day and discovered a feast of fallen acorns just a few yards from his pen. Since then, he has been breaking out on daily basis. Michael has found him several times, sated and fast asleep under the big oak tree, tempted him back to his run with a bucket of food, and secured the fence once more. But when the longing for acorns comes upon him, the wily boar simply unpins the wire with his powerful snout and lets himself out again. And who can blame him? Then, a few nights ago, young Mike was called out to some neighbours who found a stray pig in their garden. However, this pig was not from Stoneywish and this one, a renegade from a neighbouring farm, had no intention of placidly following a bucket and I believe had to be sedated before it could be got home! Is this simply a case of the grass on the other side looking greener, or are pigs smarter than we think and know there should be more to life than boredom and pig nuts?

This New Year, one might be forgiven for looking with a wistful eye over the fence to freer and more affluent times. Hemmed about with injunctions and warnings about every conceivable matter, we find life squeezed into a smaller and smaller space, where almost everything once deemed pleasurable is now taboo. If we can't break out and console ourselves with forbidden acorns, what can we do? A line from Dickens runs in my head these days: "It was the best of times. It was the worst of times." Are we fortunate or unfortunate? Have our Christmas pleasures been curtailed or intensified? And what of the future? Dickens was one expert on Christmas and Louisa May Alcott, author of 'Little Women',

was another. "Christmas won't be Christmas without any presents!" is the most famous line she penned. Louisa churned out sentimental Christmas stories by the dozen for childrens' magazines, counting the dollars they made with canny calculation. She was hell-bent on being a breadwinner for her impoverished family, for she had known much hardship in her youth. With a philosopher father who was quite incapable of providing practically for his family, and a capable and intelligent mother ground down by domestic chores; with siblings to clothe, feed and educate, and a powerful awareness of the social evils which every Alcott fought against, Louisa turned her hand sewing, house-maiding, to teaching, nursing, ing - whatever would bring in the cash. The winters were bitter in Vermont. They often lived on charity food. 'Little Women' was autobiographical. Louisa's journal entry for Christmas 1860, shortly after the death of her sister, reads: "A quiet Christmas, no presents, but apples and flowers. No merrymaking for Nan and May were gone and Betty under the snow. But we are used to hard times and as Mother says: 'while there is a famine in Kansas we mustn't ask for sugar plums." Yet the Alcotts had a vital inner resilience. They had imagination and when they could not change their immediate circumstances, they willed their hearts into a better place. "All the philosophy in our house," Louisa wrote, "is not in the study; a good deal is in the kitchen, where a fine old lady thinks high thoughts and does kind deeds while she cooks scrubs." The 'high thoughts' goes with 'simple living' and is a buried quotation from Dorothy Wordsworth, who also knew a thing or two about freezing at Christmas! These women seem good companions for the present time. They are feisty, passionate and inspired. They despaired and they picked themselves up again. What would they do with our January Blues?

I decided to draw up for myself a random list of Resolutions, or New Year gifts, such as can be found in their writings, to fortify the spirit

In 'Doctor Zhivago', Yuri's father-in-law prophetically says to him that the freezing penury of peasant life with his family might prove the happiest time of his life. The Victorian philosopher J.S. Mill famously asked the question: which would you rather be, unhappy Socrates, or a happy pig? Is it better to face uncomfortable truths or bury one's nose in acorns?
