BRIGHTON CONSORT'S NEXT PER-FORMANCE. Brighton Consort has attracted quite a following in the local area in recent years, with a number of performances in Holy Trinity Church, Hurstpierpoint. Followers of the choir will therefore be interested to know that Brighton Consort's next concert will be a collaboration with the University of Sussex Chamber Choir. The two choirs will be presenting a programme entitled "Roots and Branches", which will take place at the end of February in the Meeting House of the Univer-

sity campus at Falmer. The performance will illustrate how choral music from the 16th century Renaissance period still flowers in the present. The centrepiece of the programme will be the famous Mass for Four Voices by William Byrd (1543-1623), which will be sung by the combined choirs. THE WINDMILLS JUNIOR SCHOOL It has been lovely to see the children and staff get off to an enthusiastic start to 2023 after enjoying the Christmas break!

Looking back to the end of last term, year 3 were busy ensuring that their topic books captured some key learning about the Stone Age and Iron Age history that they have been studying. We have been using drama to inspire the children and to embed key knowledge before retaining it by recording it.

Year 4 opened the doors to parents to explore their Ancient Egyptian Museum. Each class had a time slot to showcase their Ancient Egyptian singing, dancing and music before taking them on a tour of the galleries and workshops. These celebrated and presented their learning across the curriculum—including IT projects researching The Nile, writing describing finding Tutankhamun's tomb, the mummification process as well as incredible artwork. We have chosen an extremely interesting and diverse programme of films for 2023 and are looking forward to welcoming you back and enjoying them with us.

Our second film of the new season will be on Thursday, **2nd February 2023** and is entitled Olga.

Olga is a rising star Ukrainian gymnast (played by Anastasia Budiashkina, herself a former member of the Ukrainian national team) whose shot for glory coincides with the 2014 Ukrainian revolution. When her mother's job as a journalist critical of the incumbent president, Yanukovych, places them both in immediate danger – a superb, visceral scene shows a deliberate, targeted car crash from the point of view of the terrified teenager- Olga is exiled to Switzerland. Her late father's Swiss nationality allows her to

compete on the Swiss team, but Olga's heart is in Ukraine, and is repeatedly broken by the scenes of brutality emerging from the Maidan protests. Budiashkina turns in an impressively textured performance, nailing the nervy uncertainty of not quite fitting in and the saturating grief of watching from afar while her former world falls apart. The power, athleticism and beauty of her gymnastics now have a new choreography of guilt and rage.



BRIMSTONE It's around about now that I start getting a bit bored of winter. Don't get me wrong, I enjoy a bit of bleak beauty: bare trees, frosted landscapes and all that. But now I need something to get my heart racing. Send me a sign – some life in the graveyard of winter, a promise of those dynamic spring months ahead, a flash of colour. In February my light at the end of the tunnel is an oncoming butterfly.

On sculpted, vibrant yellow wings the Brimstone makes his elegant entrance into the New Year on those bright February days when you feel the warmth of the sun on your face. Its distinctive yellow wings have given birth to a legend – that this 'butter-coloured fly' inspired the word butterfly. This claim may not entirely be true. Also untrue is the notion that these February Brimstones are the first signs of the year's new life. Because by the time Brimstones appear in February they are already on their last (six) legs.

Fresh Brimstone butterflies emerged from their chrysalises in late summer, so by February they could be seven months old – and in butterfly years that's ancient. Admittedly almost all of that time they've been asleep in a hedge, sheltered from the storms under Holly and Ivy. Yet despite the worst winter weather they always emerge immaculate in the spring. They must be made of Teflon.

When they awake the (bright yellow) males search for a mate, they mate, the (pale yellow) females lay eggs and then both die. Still, an adult life of over ten months earns them the title of our longest-lived butterfly. An insect OAP

The Brimstone's caterpillars feed on the leaves of Buckthorn and Alder Buckthorn, unobtrusive shrubs which, like the butterfly, are widespread across Sussex. When I first became the proud owner of a garden it was only a matter of days before I evicted the gnomes and planted an Alder Buckthorn. The follow-

ing spring I was excited to watch a Brimstone laying her tiny skittle shaped eggs and I studied the caterpillars as they hungrily defoliated my tree. It's funny, people often complain to me about caterpillars eating their plants — especially cabbages (the food of Small and Large White caterpillars). Why people are concerned is beyond me. Cabbages are horrible. The only reason I would ever plant a cabbage is for the pleasure of watching something else eat it.

The first Brimstone sighting in February doesn't exactly mean that spring is starting but it's certainly a sign that winter is starting to end. And right now, that's good enough for me. Either way this yellow butterfly is a welcome messenger of what's to come — the first sulphurous spark to ignite the blaze of spring.



NEWS FROM STONEYWISH Three weeks ago we woke to snow. The hoar frosts of the previous few days had prepared us. We dug out mittens, socks, vests; abandoned the idea of driving anywhere and set off with buckets to feed the animals early on foot. In the pre-dawn half-light, the snow glimmered like a new page, already scribbled over with animal tracks. These tracks are inscribed on the land every night, like a message written in invisible ink. We are scarcely aware of them. But the snow acts like lemon juice, bringing the text to light. Here one could see where a cat had skirted the chicken run, his tracks crossing over those of a hopeful fox. Down by the ponds were plentiful rabbit trails and smaller prints, perhaps a squirrel checking his larders in case the freeze persisted. There were bird signatures in the farm centre, the free birds, crows, robins skirmishing for dominance over scatterings of corn; red-



wings darting from the cover of the hedgerows. Only the chickens hate to set foot in the snow. They sit on their perches all day with their toes tucked under their breast feathers and prefer to starve! They have been mollycoddled by their mistress (who also likes to tuck her feet up) though their defeatist attitude, apparently so decadent, has a practical rationale. They are saving energy. Aren't we all advised to do that? This pattern continues for several days. We traverse the farm dispensing feed, morning and afternoon. At noon, the sun brings a brief thaw and the snow on the orchard trees melts and congeals in lumps of ice the size of pigeons' eggs. In sunshine these dazzle like brilliants on a chandelier – an effect I have never seen before. But then the weather reveals the hidden structure of things in many ways. The trees in the pinetum each have their own way of responding: the delicate needles of the Himalayan pine, droop, offering no resistance to the snow, the redwood shoulders its burden with muscular stoicism, the monkey puzzle is a pagoda of ice, the cryptomeria stoops, bent over like a Sherpa. After a week, there is a change. We are greeted one morning by a red sky which blazes in the east for more than an hour, bloodying the snow and casting a baleful light on the frozen ponds. The sun passes straight into cloud and by afternoon, rain is washing the snow away. My lifelong delight in watching the weather is often tempered now by anxiety. Seeing the cross-hatchings of chem trails

which so often seem to prefigure some meteorological disaster or other, I am no longer a happy sky-watcher. But this snow has proved a blessing. Though it made hard work for us, it brought the Christmas card concept of winter actually into our lives. I had been painting snow for a card design and suddenly it was under our feet and the frost was nipping our fingers and there were golden maple leaves trapped in ice and the croak of a heron crossing the moon – and the world reminded us that poetry is still alive. Now, after a week of dismal slop, the sun has shown its face again and is setting behind a screen of pastel clouds. The weather reports are full of doom and gloom once more. NASA's eye view of Earth is of a marbled bubble about to burst. Our weather has become a narrative of grim Necessity - trial by fire, trial by water – there is a Judgement Day ring to it, reminiscent of other brimstone narratives. But knowing about something is not at all the same as knowing it. If the authorities are right and there are ice storms ahead, do I want to experience more cold morning exhaustion? No, no I want to stay in bed, like the chickens. But if it snows, will I get up and help Michael again? Yes, yes! Because it offers a chance to feel LIFE raw and kicks consciousness out of its lazy corner. Like snowfall, such direct experience reveals a hidden and forgotten world. Under its influence, the comings and goings of the innumerable unsuspected feelings and thoughts, written in invisible ink in our lives, are exposed to view and we see a

sympathetic magic at work. We are not data in a seismic equation. But sparks of life, each precious, each capable of responding to beauty and the vital frequencies which create coherence in Nature. This is the power of poetry and it shows us a view of Earth which I believe is more true than anything one can project from outer space. This view will not provide a practical cure for the planet's ills, but it could open a few hearts and nothing is going to get better until that happens. In the depths of a brutal winter, the poet Coleridge, huddled over his dying fire, put quill into frozen inkpot to pen one of his finest poems. Frost at Midnight was written in February 1798, while Europe, in the grip of war, endured the miseries of a mini-Ice Age, yet the poem gleams out from that waste of dark and cold, like a candle flame. An ashflake, fluttering on the fender during the poet's night vigil, becomes catalyst for a reverie about solitude, loss, hope, and the power of beauty, which, like the frost outside, works miraculous transformations through a 'secret ministry'. There is too much in the poem to make a reduction of it here, but the blessing which concludes the work seems to me to be just the view of Earth we need if we are to find an antidote to Judgement Day nihilists. It is a

plea for peace. Be still enough, quiet enough to receive. Here, surely, is a better kind of weather advice and one more likely to inspire the reverence needed if we are to continue to be part of Nature's pattern. In a New Year loaded with dismal warnings, I wish Coleridge's blessing could be heard, inviting people to turn an ear instead to the 'eternal language' of the living world:

"Therefore, all seasons shall be sweet to thee, Whether the summer clothe the general earth With greenness, or the redbreast sit and sing Betwixt the tufts of snow on the bare branch Of mossy apple-tree, while the nigh thatch Smokes in the sun-thaw; whether the eave-drops fall

Whether the eave-drops fall
Heard only in the trances of the blast,
Or if the secret ministry of frost
Shall hang them up in silent icicles,
Quietly shining to the quiet Moon."

Has she finished? Yes! Thank goodness for that. Let's have a cup of tea! Rosemary

From January 2023 the Repair Café will be alongside the village market at the Age Concern Centre on Dale Avenue. Bring items for repair between 9.30 am and 11.30 am. We try to complete simpler repairs that morning by 12.30 pm. More complex tasks can be taken home by our repairers for pick up later. No need to book, but if you're not sure we can work on something please email, phone or message us on Facebook.

In our second year the Repair Café received 246 items for repair: a wide assortment of household equipment like vacuum cleaners, radios, toasters, clocks, mixers and food processors, along with jackets, shirts and coats needing zips and buttons, toys, wood furniture and ornaments. Thanks to generous donations we covered all our costs and ended the year with a small surplus.
