**NEWS FROM STONEYWISH** This is the month of cherry blossom, so I am off to Japan for a spot of hanami, or cherry-blossom viewing - not going first class of course, but the cheap-skate way, via imagination's 'flying carpet' and the amazing poetry the Japanese have written about their cherry trees since time immemorial. Today, my books tell me, hanami is still one of the biggest festivals in Japan and families flock from their homes to sit and have picnics under their beloved blossoms. This is a communal event and part of the intoxication of it all, besides the saturation in beauty, is the freedom of laughter and companionship, not to mention a tradition of getting tipsy on rice wine. But blossom viewing can also be done alone. The philosopher-poets of old, impervious to the cold, (which I read is bitter at this time of year in Japan), would walk for miles or wait for hours, for the perfect moment – viewing a certain tree by the light of the moon and then celebrating the experience in gossamer-light, *haiku* poems. Indeed, the *sakura*,

or ornamental cherry has inspired an entire literature of its own, exploring themes of transience, love, wonder, longing, the eternal now, inwardness, simplicity – through a miracle of flowers a whole world away from the hightech speed of Japan's modern culture. As 'the world' cranks up yet another gear in its quest for impossible certainties, solutions, explanations; for more data, more feedback, more professional analysis... the quietness of cherry blossom offers another way. And one which has cast me under its spell. To immerse oneself completely in an activity which may be uncomfortable, if not actually injurious to health, and which has no obvious profitable use is quite alien to our modern sensibilities. To be drinking *sake* (thimblefuls of rice wine) and doing nothing while the world goes to perdition is surely irresponsible in the extreme. Or is it? I could try and justify hanami in ecological or practical terms: it protects the trees, and the trees are essential for this bird to nest in, or for that bug to live in. Perhaps

the bark is good for coughs. Perhaps sitting under blossoms lowers one's blood pressure. Is the tree capturing carbon? Moderating temperature? Retaining soil? All of these things are no doubt true, but somehow miss the point, for the Japanese variety of cherry was not planted for practical use. Jesuit missionaries arriving in the 16th century were shocked and disappointed to learn that the time-honoured sakura trees bore no edible fruit. What was the point of a cherry one could not eat? Sitting out in the frost to watch petals falling did not speak to their practical minds. And probably does not speak to ours. We could savour it for a moment or two on television, perhaps, or buy the book, or even go to the garden centre and purchase a tree and then photograph it. But that is not *hanami*. *Hanami*, as I understand it, is entering the world of the cherry – joining souls – being with it, and sharing its beauty in rain, in frost – before the buds come out, when the petals are falling, in the moonlight, at dawn – slowing down – refining one's Removals

ability to perceive. The seventeen syllable haiku poem requires the same attention. How much can you say with seventeen syllables? Can you capture this eternal moment? Once having started, I have found the practice totally addictive. I now live in two worlds. My distracted, demented, always late, angry mind lives in the world of tax forms, parking machines, automated telephone systems, and ripples out into a troubled world of endless need and strife. My angry mind is the mind which inflicts and suffers stress, which craves security and will go to war for it, which will sacrifice other parts of the planet to protect my own. Haiku mind remembers that all our lives are embedded in something much vaster, stranger and older than we normally acknowledge and that the natural world which we think we manage, is in fact attuned to rhythms and meanings which do not need us and take little account of us. Simply to slip into this world for a moment is to receive its medicine. There does not need to be any more profitable rea-

son. Children do it instinctively till we educate them out of it, for the deliciousness of cherryblossom spaciousness and calm is intoxication itself. And when the cherry blossom is over, then there are all the secrets of summer to come, the secrets of the ants on your doorstep, the pigeons on your roof, the pine tree you pass on the way to the shops, and then leaves falling, rain falling, reflections in puddles... Writing haiku is an exercise in paring things down – saying less, meaning more. Finding haiku moments in the day requires the same discipline: finding fullness in simplicity. But in haiku world no moment is like another. One is suddenly in the presence of thousands of other beings, all in living communion with one another, and not a mobile phone in sight! Here one need never be bored again. Never feel lonely again. Of course, living in a state of wonder will not put food on the table or pay the mortgage. It is not a 'fix' for life's difficulties, but it can transform us and help us pass the gift of joy and contentment to others. For people trapped in poor places, ugly places, hostile places, busy places, it could make all the difference between sadness and joy. From here we can perhaps begin to deal with our furious mundane world with greater sensitivity and wisdom. Japanese arts such as calligraphy cultivate a four stage pattern which they sum up as jo, ha, kyu, zanshin. These words describe the movements of a

kabuki dancer, or the brushstroke of the calligrapher and form a kind of breathing pattern which may be roughly translated as 'slow, faster, fast, stop'. Ever feel that life is taking off at a gallop? The 'stop' is the vital release before one's lungs burst. Lives, seasons, empires, whole worlds pulsate to the same inevitable rise and fall. Just now Spring is taking off and bolting through its faster stage. The leaves are already on the trees. Apple blossom is in bud. Birds are on their nests. The wild rush towards Summer hardly spares a backward glance. One day we will wake to realise that the freshness of Spring is over. A pause. Then the young creatures which have been born, slowly find their feet and begin a new accelerando towards maturity. Autumn. Haiku world is a moment's pause before the dance resumes; a way of removing one's shoes in reverence before the mysteries which surround us. Every day, or a hundred times a day. Stopping. Looking. How would life feel? How would our relationship with our world, with ourselves change? Before sleep, on waking, suddenly I feel hungry for another 'moment'. It's cheaper than chocolate! And brings such a feeling of well-being. Surely blossom viewing should not just be for cherries. I urge you to find beauty and share it wherever you can. Let's try it. Imagine! The world might then find us beautiful too.







<u>HAWTHORN</u> You could set your calendar by it. Around the first day of May, our ancestors would step outside to find foamy white clouds erupting across the Sussex countryside; the Hawthorn was

b l o o m i n g , spring was turning to summer. The sight was so visually stunning and so linked with the arrival of May that Hawthorn became the only British plant to be named after the month in which it blooms. Well, the name Hawthorn is

derived from the Anglo-Saxon *hagathorn* (*haga* meaning hedge). I'm referring to that other name for Hawthorn: May.

Unlike the impetuous Blackthorn, which flowers in March before it's even bothered to grow leaves, the Hawthorn is more dignified. It waits until it has clothed itself in undergarments of lobed leaves before it dons a resplendent gown of exquisite white flowers. This stunning costume and perfect timing meant Hawthorn took centre stage at May Day celebrations and it partied with Green Men, Morris Dancers, Maypoles and May Queens. 'Gathering nuts in May' actually refers to 'gathering knots of May' to make May Day garlands and decorations.

Then, in the middle of the eighteenth century, tragedy struck. I don't know about you, but I get thrown into disarray twice a year when the clocks change. My life would have gone into meltdown in 1752 as our whole calendar changed from Julian to Gregorian, and we lost an entire 11 days. In this new timeline, Hawthorn now found itself late for the party, blooming around 12th May.

It wasn't the first time Hawthorn had been cast aside. Superstitions dictated that bringing Hawthorn indoors led to misfortune – even death. This could stem from

the fact that Hawthorn blooms release trimethylamine, which gives the flowers that unpleasant smell of cat's wee and attracts pollinating insects. It's also a chemical formed in decaying tissue and

> reminded people of the smell of Black Death – and nobody wanted to be reminded of that.

I remember at primary school being taught 'Ne're cast a clout 'til May is out'. I translated this gibberish into the fact that you should keep your warm clothes

on until the end of May. I've only just discovered that 'May is out' refers to Hawthorn blooming. My clouts could have been cast weeks earlier.

But the world has changed since I was a nipper – we're warming up. For a temperature-sensitive plant like Hawthorn, the blooming times are changing again. Hawthorn is responding to climate change by flowering up to two weeks earlier than it was thirty years ago. It has crept back to bloom around May Day and is now more commonly seen flowering at the end of April. So, this May Day, cast your clouts, get out into the great outdoors, and welcome the return of the real May Oueen.
