HURST PLAYERS Hardly had "Daisy" finally "pulled it off" at the Players Theatre in Hurstpierpoint in the first week of July before the Players had begun work on a totally different but equally rewarding production of "The Father".

This is Hurst Players contribution to the 20th Anniversary of the Hurst Festival and will run from **16th to 21st September** at 7.30 pm each evening. It is the English translation of "Le Pere", an award-winning play by the French playwright Florian Zeller, premiered in 2012 in Paris. Our production, written by Christopher Hampton, is directed by Bob Sampson. Briefly, Andre, a persecuted man, refuses to tolerate his circumstances any longer – his favourite watch is stolen by an unnecessary "helper" while his scheming daughter, Anne, tries to remove him from his beloved flat. But is all as it seems? The Father is a darkly humorous and poignant tragi-comic mystery, offering an unsentimental and emotionally intense portrayal of the impact of dementia on

HORSE CHESTNUT Far, far away in the southeast corner of Europe, the Balkan Mountains tower over the landscape. ground battles. The conker tree had conquered the continent. Here in this new world the curse of the moth had been lifted and the Horse Chestnut flourished

Meanwhile, the tree's nemesis, not a particularly strong flyer, remained imprisoned in the remote valleys of the Balkan Mountains for centuries, more myth than moth. Then, one day, the modern world arrived. Construction workers building roads through the mountains were unwittingly building the perfect means for the moth to escape and spread. Now all it needed was a lift. So, the moth stuck out its six thumbs and hitched a ride.

Incredibly, the moth, just 5mm long, was able to disperse by grabbing on to passing vehicles. And so, like the ferocious Thracian tribes, the moth rode into battle. Screaming along highways, motorways,

and autobahns Volvos. Citroens. Fiats and Fords. The ancient battle spilled out from the Balkans the moth was chauffeur driven to every Horse Chestnut tree in The Europe. Horse Chestnut Leaf Miner moth was first discovered, identified

and named in Greece in 1984. Twenty years later, in 2004, an innocent motorist pulled off the A27 in to the University of Sussex car park, unaware they had brought a sinister stowaway into Sussex. Since then, every Horse Chestnut in Sussex has been moth-eaten. Look to the leaves and you'll see the great Balkan battle raging right on your doorstep. Sussex Wildlife Trust is a conservation charity for everyone who cares about nature in Sussex. Founded in 1961, we have worked with local people for over half a century to make Sussex richer in wildlife.

The education is funded by the local authority and the last OFSTED inspection was 'Outstanding'. A high percentage of children are non verbal and the children have minimum of 1 to 1 support. Chailey offers an enormous range of activities - riding is particularly beneficial. it really is a very special place and it was very clear that Joy was very passionate about all that is achieved there. NEWS FROM STONEYWISH The other day I came across a phrase by the philosopher/scientist, Rupert Sheldrake, which has stuck in my mind ever since. It runs: "Nature is memory". How do seedlings know which forms their leaves should take? How do young cuckoos navigate their way to Africa? What is that inexplicable thing, innate wisdom? Oh, easy! I hear you say. DNA, of course. That answers everything. But even when we have captured DNA and decoded it and snipped it and spliced it and patented it and reaped the profits, the mystery still remains.

How do identical twins start out with identical genes and then express them quite differently? How does a hybrid plant suddenly rediscover its original blueprint and revert to its wild form? And if there is such a thing as latent memory in all living things, what does that memory consist of and how can we find the key to it?

In an age when losing one's memory is a universal fear, and when the natural world seems to be unravelling around us, the idea of an embedded, or indelible wisdom offers a welcome grain of comfort. The form of DNA spirals, embodying the patterns of growth and evolution which occur throughout the universe. Our modern DNA, I read, is practically identical to that of our earliest ancestors, though we consider ourselves to have evolved into something vastly superior.

In fact, some people believe we are evolving so fast we will soon be able to dispense with Nature altogether and continue as partial robots or 'transhumans' thanks to technological enhancement. At the same time, many others view this prospect with dismay and feel that they are being held hostage in a grotesque dream. One thing that genetic inheritance naturally defines is a species-appropriate lifestyle.

All around us Nature is doing its thing. Thrushes sing thrush songs. Bees collect nectar. Fish swim.

Unless they have to adapt to challenges in their environment, they seem pretty much content to be what they are. Only progressive humankind is dissatisfied to the point of pushing beyond all physical limitations.

In the new Anthropocene, we find ourselves strangers to the world which gave us life. Is it possible that despite Satnav and GPS, we have somehow lost our way? Did our magnificent brains somehow outstrip our prehistoric DNA in the drive to be all, know all, control all? We know there is something not quite right with society today. Have we forgotten who we are and what we are really capable of?

Certainly, it is hard to believe that evolution intended us, as a species, to be on the brink of self-extinction, plagued with chronic illness, anxiety and rage. Paleontologists tell us that our huntergatherer ancestors suffered less stress than us, ate a better diet, worked a fraction of the time, and had a bone density which indicated superb physical fitness. If not trodden on by a mastodon, or clubbed by his wife, a primal caveman could live healthily into his seventies without need of a dentist and was able to withstand extremes of cold which would make us moderns simply die at the thought.

Do we have the secrets of such resilience, buried in our DNA today? And what would happen if, instead of violating our planet in the pursuit of total domination and self-satisfaction, we set about rediscovering what it really means to be human – belonging to Earth? According to my dictionary of Indo-European language roots, the following English words come from a single precursor, 'dhghem', meaning 'earth': hominid, homo, bonhomie, human, humane, humble, humility, humus, homage, and many more. The form '(dh)ghm-on-' means 'earthling', from 'earth' + 'man' and gives rise to another ancient word, 'guma' for man, which in modern English becomes 'groom', as in

'bride-groom'. What would it be like to recover this original blueprint for existence - to return to our species-appropriate gift of adapting and evolving as true social animals, being grooms who take care of earth and one another? Would we find life more rewarding with simpler technology? (The 'techne' of the Ancient Greeks meant skill – human dexterity – rather than reliance on machines – forgetting how to do things)? Would we do better looking for small solutions?

We put this to the test at Stoneywish last week with a piece of experimental archaeology. One of my neighbours had the brilliant idea of firing some pottery in a clamp-kiln in one of our fields, using Bronze Age technology. She had been on a course where this was done successfully and was keen to try it again. She knew another potter who would join in and she very kindly invited me to make some pots with her to go in the kiln. On the appointed day I arrived to find that the site had been meticulously prepared. Michael had provided earth for external insulation. A hearth had been cleared. There were stacks of carefully selected kindling and firing wood, sticks for a wigwam structure, wilted dock leaves to thatch any gaps and short logs to create a 'raft' or platform to support the pots as they baked. Amongst the pots were four exquisite 'fertility' figurines which my neighbour's friend had made - a tribute of love to our 'earthling' heritage. All proceeded in an orderly and methodical way. The wood and kindling were carefully stacked, and the tinder 'authentically' lit with sparks from a flint and striker. The fire flamed and died down to ashen coals. Charcoal was added. Notes and photographs were taken... Then a worm of doubt crept in. Were these embers really hot enough to bake clay? Would the charcoal catch? Would it be better to err on the side of caution and add a little more wood, and then fan the fire to be properly sure? At this point the ancient ghosts of Spatham Field must have begun to grin to themselves. We were no longer safe and impartial scientists; we were on an adventure, relying, as all true pioneers do, on hope and intuition. We had set off into uncertain territory and the rest need hardly be told. By now the embers were *fierce*. Time, we thought, to complete the job as quickly as possible. On would go the raft and the pots, then up would

go the wigwam of sticks, the blanket of dock leaves, and the soil to seal the whole. After that, all that would be needed was a little careful tending and patience until the next day when the kiln, having cooled down, could be dismantled.

Of course, fate had decided otherwise. The heat we had created was so intense that the raft began to smoulder as soon as the pots were stacked and before we could complete the wigwam, the whole thing went up. A diminutive inferno, two feet high! We were suddenly transformed from detached researchers into primal beings, hopping up and down, stamping out the sparks that wriggled in the grass, cowering from the heat and wondering whether our eyebrows would survive! Fire ripped through the structure and before the blackened rafters fell, the pots inside began to explode. One after another they burst sending hot sherds flying. Our aspirations went up in the smoke. The experiment had turned into a disaster and there was a sense of grief, especially for the little Venus figurines, which had been crafted with such love. Yet at the same time I felt that something exhilarating and wonderful had occurred.

Always fascinated by fire, I found myself swept up in a surge of Promethean excitement. I *loved* the pots exploding so dramatically to teach us a lesson, as though they too were vibrant, alive. Then, as the flames subsided once more, a new miracle unfolded. There, beneath the ribs of the fallen roof, like forms from a miniature Pompeii, the bones of the pots began to emerge from their pyre. There lay one of the figurines, a black Madonna now, sleeping on her bed of ash. Here, miraculously complete, was a tiny thumb-pot, which had been hastily fashioned, like a dough-boy, from the last 'nob' of clay. Later it transpired that all the Venuses had survived! But though I have to caution you, in the interests of health and safety NOT to try this experiment at home, it brought us a taste of a richer, grander, more immediate and fulfilling reality.

We had learned something about ourselves and the deep history which is our hidden inheritance. The whole experience felt like a gift from the very elders we had reached out to touch, who, wiser and more skilful than us by far, had been intrigued by our endeavours and had smiled kindly on us in the end. Will we try it again? You bet!

A couple of days after the Talk About came out that familiar ping on Nola's phone bought news from the property managing agents, the Landlords were prepared to offer us a new five year lease but at a take it or leave it offer of a new annual rent of £35,000. We were paying £27,000 per year, a rise of £8,000 a year. The euphoria of getting a new lease soon turned to shock at the seismic increase. My first thought was, are they getting Hassocks and Harrod's confused? My second reaction was why are rich people so greedy, we've got nothing, they've got a lot, but always seem to want more. Maybe the powers that be can do something about it, then you'd have a lot fewer empty shops and businesses. As history shows the rich will always get richer, off the back of the poor, who always get poorer, and it will never change, no matter what political party is in power. I'd like to take a moment to thank several elderly ladies who phoned me to commiserate and offer help, there'd been cus-

I know it's a hill to climb but with your support we can do it and if you really want to help me and haven't got any pets then I'll let you put a few pennies in the cat's donation box everything that goes in there helps the cats with all their needs food, vets etc. I love you all, you've been amazing and so have all the hugs. You cannot know how much they have helped, let's hope life can now get back to some sort of normality. I live in hope.
