NEWS FROM STONEYWISH This Hallowe'en, the 'in thing' seems to be spiders. People have festooned their hedges and the fronts of their houses with yards of gauze and laid out giant cobwebs in their gardens along which monstrous spiders are merrily cavorting, quite putting any pumpkins or witches' brooms in the shade! Are spiders the scariest thing since Harry Potter? Despite the terror which they often evoke, the old belief was that spiders did more good than harm and that it was therefore bad luck to kill one.

My grandmother would go through the terrible ordeal of catching a daddy-long-legs and carrying it outside, rather than break this rule. And I have to confess that I have made a truce with ours at home. If they will eat up flies in the kitchen, I will tolerate a web or two. It is a curious thing that the more you observe a creature you fear, the more you can become captivated by its complexity and virtuosity until

the fear is replaced by wonder and respect.

At this time of year, the garden is full of spectacular orb webs. These are made by fat-bodied garden spiders, the 'heavyweights' of Britain's 600 different species. So, what is in a name? Our word 'spider' comes from Old English 'spithra', meaning spinner. And 'cobweb' comes from 'cop', or 'attercop', the Medieval term for a spider. As for 'Arachnid', that derives from the Greek myth of Arachne, a woman who rashly challenged the goddess Athene to a weaving contest. This was never going to end well, and poor Arachne was turned into a spider.

An abundance of gossamers or spiders' webs on an autumn morning was supposed to predict a fine day, perhaps because they are at their most visible when shimmering in low sunlight. Certainly, the skill and patience required to construct a web is considerable, for the spider must ensure that her handiwork is sticky enough to capture her prey, without getting stuck to the threads herself. Orb-webs are actually constructed twice: first in a non-sticky silk, which the spider painstakingly eats and replaces with gummed silk,

having first oiled her feet so that *she* can move about with impunity. She recycles her web, if necessary, simply by eating it and spinning it anew. Perfect economy! Garden spiders are pattern-builders and connectors, and the spirals of their web-forms mirror growth patterns to be found at every level of creation, from sub-atomic spinning particles, to swirling galaxies.

As participants in this cosmic dance, we humans are also adept at weaving. Textiles, baskets and fishing nets are only some examples of our practical skill, but we also excel at crafting figurative webs: webs of intrigue and deception for 'trapping' the unwary; webs of communication for sharing knowledge, and imaginative tapestries.

Since the dawn of time we, spider-like, have been weaving tales and spinning yarns to enthrall and captivate one another. The greatest of these the primal myths - and all true works of the imagination, tap into hidden deeps where the secrets of creation lie. The frivolous merely entertain, and the manipulative, like the daisy compass-patterns once scratched onto the walls of Medieval churches, suck the mind into distraction and addiction. (Do you know anyone hooked on computer games?)

When I was a child at school we used to spend hours drawing these daisy-wheels and colouring them in,



Asibaikaashi, or Spider Woman, was, in Indian mythology, the 'grandmother' who took care of infants and adults. As the Ojibwe nation dispersed over a wider area, Spider Woman found it harder and harder to take care of everyone, so the people made webs on her behalf. These dream-catchers were said to entrap nightmares in their strings. The nightmares would be held overnight and then 'released' when daylight came. Good dreams, however, could climb up the pendant feathers attached and slip through the central hole into the sleeping mind. So negative and positive turn out to be a matter of perspective.

Is the spider a predatory, Hallowe'en monster, or a caring grandmother, watching over the cradle? Are



webs for our entrapment or our protection? In the fluid dimension of the quantum universe nothing is ever just one thing. A light particle can also manifest as a wave. Reality is not a solid mass, but rather a potential. And in this life, we are not the only observers. *Everything* is dynamic and intelligent and interactive, so the way we see things can hardly be separated from the way they see

us. To have any idea whether you should trust a storyspinner, (or an advertiser, or a politician!), you need to know how they see you. Do they really want to help and protect you, or do they want to eat you for dinner? We might ask the same question of ourselves. How do we view our fellow passengers in life? How do we perceive the plant nations, the two-leggeds and the four-leggeds of the animal world, the swimmers of the deep, the insects, the rocks, and our own human brothers and sisters? Do the webs we weave bind us to them in mutual respect? Or do they enable us to predate on all without a thought? Does the way we view the world affect not only our own dreaming, but the actual physical structure of reality itself? If so, we have the potential, through finding our own creative depths, to become co-creators of the future. By choosing to belong to positive or negative, dream or nightmare, we construct the world we desire.

The naturalist John Muir anticipated Einstein by observing: "When we try to pick out anything by itself, we find it hitched to everything else in the Universe." We are all in this soup together. We can't outlaw spiders and save thrushes. We can't reject certain lifeforms without sending parts of ourselves into exile with them. We can't exploit or cull at will, without invoking the same fate for ourselves. Sufficiently weakened in this way, humankind will have no choice but to give up on natural life and exist merely as an encryption in some AI memory bank. This seems like a pretty bad dream. But there is another possibility...

In his field journal, John Muir, still an unbroken child at heart, inscribed his address as: "Earth – planet, universe." Everything belonged. In Hawai'i, the

practice of Aloha cultivates connection, from person to person, community to community and from each individual to the myriad creatures and entities which surround them. This breathing from the heart, draws humankind and the 'ten thousand things' of creation into one dynamic whole. It acts like the mycorrhizal mycelium of the forest floor, nourishing and distributing resources - like the invisible strings of 'dark matter' which bind together the particles of the quantum world. Without such cohesion, everything would fall apart. We are not individuals but multiverses: accretions of whole nations of microscopic life-forms, of star-dust, of cosmic energies, all wildly communicating with one another.

The Ancient Hindus depicted this miracle of All-in-One, One-in-All, 2,500 years ago, in the dazzling image of Indra's net. Above the palace of the sky god Indra, (says the Avatamsaka Sutra), there stretches a net of pearls, each one reflecting all the others, (just like the raindrops in a spider's web! or the molecules on a strand of DNA). 



SUSSEX WILDLIFE TRUST I'm scrambling through the woodland undergrowth, anxious, sweating and clutching a 2 kg pouch of white powder and a spoon. I may look like some Colombian cocaine smuggler, but I've got the perfect excuse for the police: "I'm researching my parish magazine article". I've been writing articles Sussex parish magazines for many years, and I've received some lovely comments from many people – thank you. It's nice to know they are being read and enjoyed.

When I was a kid, I would read loads of wildlife books with names like 'the amateur naturalist' (not to be confused with 'the amateur naturist', a mistake you only make once). Each book promised to make you a wildlife detective and was filled with tips on tracking mammals in the countryside. Most British mammals are nocturnal and, after centuries of persecution, all of them are understandably rather wary of humans. We hardly ever see them. Yet these invisible animals leave behind tantalising clues which let us know they really exist droppings, nibbled nuts, pellets. But the biggest giveaway of all are their footprints.

Primitive mammals (such as Hedgehogs, Stoats, Badgers and you) are plantigrades. We stroll about on the soles of our feet and have five toes. When we run, we use our toes and the balls of our feet. For the mammals





who spend a lot of time running and jumping this basic mammalian plantigrade foot has evolved and adapted over time. Some animals have lost a toe (Foxes, cats, dogs, Hares) while the real gymnasts, such as deer, leap around on two toes, and horses race on just one toe enclosed in a hoof. Like Sherlock Holmes with a foot fetish, you can examine each footprint's formula of toes, claws and pads to deduce just who has been sneaking around at night.

My books told me that, once you find a footprint, the best way to capture it is to make a cast – which explains why I'm crouched here in the undergrowth excitedly mixing up plaster of Paris powder and pouring it into a footprint in the muddy woodland floor. I've always wanted to do this since I was a kid but, well, I guess life got in the way. Now, sat proudly on my desk, I have my first footprint cast: a Badger (with five toes, a wide pad and obvious claws). And somewhere out there is a Badger completely unaware that its footprint has created a deeper enjoyment of wildlife and inspired someone to preserve it. Which now I think about it, is all I have hoped for from these articles too. I hope I've made an impression. Wishing you all a Merry Christmas and best wishes for 2025. Michael Blencowe
