

AN UPDATE ON TEDDY

We are delighted to share that our son Teddy is now 15 months off treatment for neuroblastoma, and his most recent scans show he is still cancer free!

I am sure many of you will remember Teddy from our fundraising campaign in 2023, when Hassocks and the surrounding villages banded together to help out family raise £270,000 to enrol him on a trial in the US. Teddy made three trips to Penn State Children's Heath in Hershey, Pennsylvania where he is under the care of the incredible Dr Sholler - a worldrenowned expert in Teddy's cancer, and the pioneer of DFMO. We then received the brilliant news that DFMO is being made available in the UK! The plan will be for Teddy's care to stay under the guidance of Dr Sholler's team without having to travel back and forth to fill prescriptions.

Teddy himself is coming on leaps and bounds, and he can now often be seen whizzing around the village on his scooter. He still has a lot of physical difficulties to contend with, and a small army of specialists at various hospitals, but on the whole his life is a lot more normal than it was a year ago.

Our family continues to benefit hugely from a number of charities supporting children affected by cancer and other life-threatening illnesses, including Rainbow Trust and Chestnut Tree House Children's Hospice. We are hoping that once the dust has settled in our lives - it's taking a while! - we will be able to start an annual fundraising event in Hassocks to raise money and ensure they can support more families in the future.

NEWS FROM STONEYWISH What a wonderful word 'crepuscular' is! If there were a verbal equivalent of wine-tasting, then 'crepuscular' would register as a deep, luscious, full-bodied, aromatic word. You can roll it round your mouth. Let tongue and lips sample its delights. There are hints of birdsong in it and the lingering fragrance of sun-warmed leaves and flowers. It mellows and develops a counterpoint of dusky tones – the waning warmth of day, the coolness of stars which creep in unannounced as the blue drains out of the sky... Dear Lord! you think, how long is she going to ramble on this? Well, there are some things in life which can only be savoured slowly. A good wine is one. And dusk is another. You cannot rush them. They will not be rushed. Both will deliver their deliciousness only when the senses are still and fully-focussed. And, by a miracle, this evening before May Day is warm enough for sitting outside without shivering. It is as yet too early for summer's 'biting things' to be abroad. Apple blossom glows in the gathering darkness and as the blackbirds and thrushes and wrens fall silent, a trio of nightingales start to sing down on the Black Swan Pond. Leastways, I think they are nightingales. I do not have the 'app' on my phone which will listen for me and give me a visual graph of the melody. I have to confess I don't want one. I don't want anything to come between me and this moment – these bursts of rapturous sound, issuing from the cave of foliage around me. I don't want any data - or naturalist's jargon - not even the cultural thrill of lines from Keats – tidbits of Greek mythology - songs or sayings, though of course, now I have said that they all come busting in like a crowd of hooligans. Just now I am watching this bat dive through the apple tree before me, hot on the tail of some large insect. It's not a pipistrelle, for they are smaller and move so fast the eye can hardly follow them. This bat is bigger, slower. Does he catch his quarry? He is looping the loop, round and round above the tree and the pallor of the sky glimmers through his wings. A squabble breaks out between geese gathered on the Big Pond and their cries ripple out through the leaves. Up in the meadow a stray lamb cries and the mother answers. If I stay longer, will there be owls? The fox that checks the hen-run every night? Visitors, welcome and unwelcome, in this place I foolishly think of as 'mine'? Twilight is a time of transition. A whole world, normally hidden, comes to life. High above, a new moon with upturned horns slides into view like a Sami sledge, but the shadows down here start to press close about

me. Suddenly I feel out of my element. Familiar birds have found sanctuary for the night – have fallen silent one by one and now something inside me is urging me to go indoors and seek the safety of lamplight and all the familiar things with which I make myself feel important. Too much reality is an unsettling thing. I no longer feel significant in the dark. Recounting this moment tomorrow, I will be able to re-fashion it as I please, but the longer I sit here, the more I feel the world is trying to claim me and that makes me feel vulnerable in a quite alarming way. My narrow perspective is blown away. I am no longer distinct or special – a miracle of Darwinian evolution – a co-creator of the new digital universe. I am merely a rather blind and uncertain creature, stumbling up the garden path, hoping that I do not fall in the pond along the way! Later, I remember the words of Martin Prechtel:

"In the forest you're the guest, not the trees. In your garden you're the guest, not the gophers, aphids, squirrels or deer." Also, this: "In real cultures, you're a cell in the body of the land and all the living bodies of that land are the cells that make up your body." Was that how Keats's nightingale reminded him of Death? By inviting him to lose himself – his sense of identity, culture, purpose, in a rapturous sublima-

tion? We progressive humans do not want to be claimed as kin by Nature. Nature is something we see as materially inferior – less permanent, less conscious than ourselves. At worst we assume the role of conquistadors towards her. At best we appoint ourselves as guardians. We have raised the barricades of science and theology and technology specifically to preserve the advantage in all dealings with this *idiot savant*. Of course, our hearts know that such impertinence will not do. Sooner or later, we *must* acknowledge we are not up to the job – Prechtel again: "Nature does not die when we kill Her off. We die when we kill off Nature." Because we already are intrinsically part and parcel of the world which gave us life, any damage inflicted is inflicted first and foremost on ourselves. And dreaming of posthuman immunity will not save us. Man and his machines may both be devoured by their own cannibalistic ambitions. But the point is that real bliss comes when we allow ourselves to feel small and lost in our familiar world. The strangeness is there on the doorstep, if only we take time to look. The beauty is waiting to speak to us if we can put down our distractions and listen. Twilight is magical because it is a crossing place. But one can feel disorientated and ready for adventure in any place. To cultivate the Art of Surrender is to discover such a place in one's own heart and find that there are nightingales of one sort or another singing there all the time. As Prechtel says: "Magic is what happens every day."

For this First of May the 'may' is in bloom – night air heavy with its scent. There are also the fragrant white flowers of woodruff. We steep the woodruff in glasses of white wine to make the old German drink *Maibowle*, which is to be drunk specifically on May Day. So, a toast to Spring Magic! Down with busyness and botheredness and trying to push the world round – and welcome sweet companionship and repose!

BRINGING NEW LIFE TO OLD - REPAIR CAFÉ HASSOCKS One of the many rewarding aspects of volunteering with the repair café is when people come in with something that they can't fix and go away with something they can use. Sometimes we're repairing items that have a story or sentimental value – perhaps it belonged to your mother or grandmother, or it's a toy you had as a child and want your grandchildren to enjoy. Sometimes it's something as simple as the lid of your favourite saucepan!

Our amazing repairers can work on many household items, including:

Mechanical and electrical — vacuums, toasters, kettles, radios, lamps, clocks.

We can PAT test electrical items to be sure they are safe to use.

Wood — picture frames, chairs or tables with wobbly legs.

Garden tools — replace handles for forks or spades, repairing cords for hedge trimmers, lawnmowers.

Treasured objects that need to be delicately glued like statues, toys.

Textiles — repair or replace zips, sew up seams, holes or tears, replace buttons.

Sharpening — knives, scissors, garden tools In partnership with Spire IT we can also help with laptops, phones and tablets that are not working as they should.

We're at Age Concern on Dale Avenue every fourth Saturday (village market day) except August and December. Bring items for repair between 9.30 am and 11.30 am and we'll see what we can do. Items must be clean, and if a part is needed you need to pay for it. Not everything is repairable: sometimes we can't get spare parts or can't even open the item for repair, but last year we successfully fixed over 70% of items we worked on.

We're a free service but welcome small donations to help cover our costs (room rental, insurance etc). Are you good at fixing things? We welcome new people to join our friendly team of repairers. It's rewarding to bring new life to things, and people are very appreciative. It's also an enjoyable social experience, chatting with people, enjoying tea and cake, and being a valued part of the community.

SWARD WARDENS: THE INCREDIBLE ROLE OF DUNG BEETLES There's a subject we're not great at talking about in the UK; poo. However, there's a group of creatures that are far more celebratory of the topic, with their diet testament to their appreciation. Aptly named, dung beetles eat poo. And they are amazing.

You are likely to conjure the image of Heliocopris, giant dung beetle species which reside in Africa and Asia, manoeuvring huge droppings kindly deposited by some of the Earths spectacular megafauna. Although these beetles don't match the size of the one that rolled a football into the 2010 World Cup opening ceremony, they are hefty for a beetle, reaching lengths of up to 7 cm.

Our dung beetles are more diminutive, but no less vital. The UK is home to around 60 species, which are split into three groups: Aphodiines, or the 'dwellers', sized 3 - 13mm who live directly in dung, Onthophagus, at 4 - 11 mm; 'tunnellers' who tunnel up to a metre below the dung, pulling down small amounts to lay their eggs in, and the largest 'tunnellers' at 8 - 26 mm, the Geotrupes.

Mostly, they consume dung of herbivores and omnivores. The ultimate recyclers, dung beetles are ecosystem engineers, meaning they modify their environment to provide services to other species with whom they share the ecosystem. In the case of dung beetles, this is a poop removal service.

Not only do they improve grazing pasture by clearing grasslands of waste, but they also recycle vital nutrients, keeping soil healthy. Tunnelling aerates the soil and prevents compaction, which in turn mitigates against flooding. Whilst this waste processing

keeps down the population of flies, the beetles also remove parasites living in the dung. The beetles are, in turn, prey to others, such as birds, bats and Hedgehogs. It's all rather harmonious and, as nature does best, it's a perfectly symbiotic relationship.

Yet, like most of our native wildlife, dung beetles are in trouble. Largely this is due to modifications in agricultural practices; changes in land-use and an increase of pesticides, whether this be directly onto fields or via livestock ingested worming medicines. These chemicals disrupt the brilliantly balanced natural process, especially when used large scale and preventatively. Landowners can support dung beetle populations by reducing pesticides; more dung beetles mean fewer parasites, so by protecting these species a free service is being retained.

We owe a lot to our dung beetles and must protect them. They're a critical part of our ecosystem, yet many of us don't know they exist here or appreciate their unglamorous and thankless work. To be frank, without them we would be up to our knees in poo. Metaphorically and literally. Kerry Williams

When England held Aquitaine, this captivating dance found its way to the English Royal Court, becoming a prestigious form of entertainment by Tudor times. Stately homes often boasted their own Morris "Sides," with dancers adorned in splendid costumes, jingling leg bells, and flourishing richly decorated hankies to entertain their guests. Over time, Morris dancing spread throughout the provinces, blending with local music and dance traditions. Today, there are four main regional styles: the Cotswold style from stately home villages, the Welsh and English Border style, East Anglian Molly dancing, and the North-West Step and Clog dancing, influenced by the industrial heritage of spinning and weaving machines.

THE MID SUSSEX BRIDLEWAY GROUP is a small voluntary dedicated team that has been established since 1978 centred in Mid Sussex we cover much of East and West Sussex, an area which includes over 140 miles of bridleways.

At a Local Level we have a strong network of members who have detailed knowledge of the Bridleways they use, and the problems associated with them.

At a regional level we represent users of bridleways in discussions with Councils and other organisations.

At a national level we are affiliated with the British Horse Society, Bridleways and Byways Trust and the Open Spaces Society.

Can you answer the following questions: On the bridleways you use Is the surface in good condition? Are the trees and hedges cut back? Are the gates easy to use? If there's a problem, what do you do? Do you just put up with it? Who do you contact?

In fact, it is the job of the County Council to maintain most Bridleways and Byways, but budgets are very limited. The Councils need to be told about problems and help to solve them. This is where we can all help.

Our members do many works behind the scenes to ensure that our Bridleways are protected from being neglected, destroyed, closed or overlooked due to ever increasing budget restrictions and we welcome feedback and support from anyone who uses these paths whether it's on horseback, bicycle or on foot to report and campaign to ensure that Bridleways across the Mid Sussex area are maintained.

For example, reporting a broken gate or a surface that is eroded or has become unusable due to flooding. Perhaps joining a work party team to cut back overgrown hedges. Put it simply, the more members we have the more effective we can be. If you join us and do nothing else, you will still be helping yourself and others. But better still join us and take an active part in protecting your rights. We need your




