**HISTORY OF ST LAWRENCE FAIR** I'm sorry to spoil a good story but the statement that the fair has taken place every year since the granting of the charter in 1312 "breaking only during World Wars I and II and this [year] with the Covid 19 virus is incorrect. The St. Lawrence Fair had ceased long before World War 1.

Hurstpierpoint Rector the Rev Carey Borrer, commenting in 1873 on an entry in the Marchant Diary for 10th August 1715 recording the Fair, wrote that "In later years the fair was always held on 1st May, but when the change took place I cannot tell. It is now suppressed."

The nearest equivalent in the first half of the 20th century, and which as previously stated raised money for local hospitals, was Hospital Saturday, later known at The Carnival.

The St. Lawrence Fair was revived by the parish church in 1956, initially in aid of church funds.



THE WINDMILLS SCHOOL The first half term back at The Windmills has been very productive – despite the new restrictions imposed on the staff, children and parents. Teachers are finding new ways to teach in interesting and motivational ways within the new classroom environment and the children are obviously relishing the challenge! In science, Year 6 learnt about light, its properties and how it travels. With the help of special glasses, they were able to see how white light diffracts to create the spectrum of colours that make up a rainbow; a symbol that has obviously featured a lot over recent months. Despite the weather changing and the rain making an appearance, each of the year 5 classes really enjoyed spending a day in the school grounds working with Mr Marlow our outdoor learning expert. Thev learnt to use an array of tools, equipment and skills to begin preparing the ground for a wellbeing area - coppicing, lighting fires, creating shelters as well as hunting for mini-beasts of course! All of the other classes will get the chance over the coming term to continue the work already begun with the aim of making this space suitable for promoting mindful activities and to encourage wellbeing and



respect for our natural environment in the dedicated wildlife area. Meantime in the classroom, year 4 were becoming expert embalmers by mummifying a willing teddy bear and conducting a tricky scientific experiment in the form of the mummification of an orange - to be compared over time with a non-mummified orange. We await the results! Year 3 have used a range of methods to

investigate and present the findings of their comparison between their own diet and that of a rabbit when studying food groups. Foods from both diets were sorted in a Venn diagram and the children created bar charts to show the results of their investigations into the sugar content of drinks. To complete their learn-

ing the children used their knowledge to plan a balanced meal using an ingredient from each food group to create a delicious meal they would enjoy eating themselves! Finally, we wish to thank all those who donated towards the cost of our new 'Ninja Course' adventure playground which was installed over the summer break. As well as offering an interesting activity for the children, this area acts as a bright and cheerful welcome when entering the school site! *Sue Bandy*



The friendly forecaster assures you that a depression, approaching with unerring exactitude, is bringing you gales of so many miles an hour, so many inches of rain, temperatures below the seasonal average, pure misery on the roads. There it is. You can see a satellite photograph of the white vortex spinning across the Atlantic. No matter that the sky of the moment is blue; the sun brilliant; the birds singing. You know that something nasty is on its way. Living on a damp and draughty island, as we do - something nasty is always on its way, unless we are having unseasonably fine weather, in which case we are filled with forebodings about the Jet Stream getting stuck again. There is a horrid sense of Necessity about the whole business, so that even if you know a little about chaos theory and the impossibility of predicting anything with certainty, a feeling remains

Armed with a satellite forecast, we cancel our arrangements at the touch of a cell-phone button. Rare now are the soggy picnic excursions of the bad old days, the huddle of friends in crowded cars, juggling steaming mugs of tea while windows fog, obliterating the view. We know better today. We wait for a more propitious day. But something important – the art of adapting and making the best of whatever comes, is eclipsed. And with it the delight of living on the edge, enjoying *experiencing* rather than knowing. Here I take my hat off to the intrepid campers who embrace all weathers on our campsite. And to the ponies and sheep setting their backs, as I write, to the discomfort of an autumn squall. What the weather forecast did not and could not tell us, is how this depression tastes, smells, looks: how massed ranks of clouds appeared vesterday morning on a blue horizon, gilded banners waving; how a wind blowing out of November, tumbled golden leaves along the gutters; the pepper-shot of pigeons or jackdaws hurtling from church steeple and treetop; the sour drip of cold berries in hedgerows...

Modern understanding of life seems set on a trajectory away from the warmth of personal experience towards impersonal data or received knowledge, with value judgements (prejudices) supplied by experts in every field. We are encouraged more and more to see existence from a satellite's perspective. And this 'global' view reduces reality to flat screen images, maps, graphs, equations and finally to the quantum realm of pure supposition. At this level the complex and mysterious processes of the living world can be managed, modelled, predicted and massaged, whether we are talking of the weather, or of blood pressure or of happiness. It seems to me that all this ultimately misses the point, for we are humans, not cyphers. Like the 'experts', I care passionately about the state of the planet, about the health of the nation, about the fate of bees and sparrows. But I also think that a habitual satellite mentality cripples our ability to think and feel like warm-blooded beings. We need sometimes to turn off the forecast gurus and listen instead to the murmurings of the Earth within our own horizon's sphere. Down here the perspective is gentler, more resilient, less manipu-



lated. All things have their own time and reason. We are part of an embracing whole and constantly taken by surprise, by the freewheeling spontaneity of Nature. The neurosis and fear, which saturate the satellite mind, dissipate, restoring our free, ancestral right to knowledge through experience and the poetry and beauty which lies embedded within it. It takes a poet to put it best. If ever you feel that life has been probed, mapped, reduced and packaged till no place any longer seems joyous and free, then you need what Keats called 'Negative Capability', the art of not knowing everything. To rest, as he put it 'in uncertainties, Mysteries, doubts, without any irritable reaching after fact and reason' is to recover an enchanted world where truth is 'proved' upon the pulse and can be dreamt into reality by any unqualified Adam. 'I am certain of nothing,' says the poet in one of his letters, ' but the Holiness of the heart's affections ... 'I live in the eye ...' From this heartbound, earthbound perspective possibility is infinite.

So on this brooding, cloud-bound day, the presentcast goes something like this: the larches are turning golden from their branch-tips down; herons





have returned to the Big Pond and stand, like wet boulders out in the field; the chickens shake the mud off their feet, but prefer to hunt slugs in the rain, with porcupine spikes for feathers, than dry off nicely in their hut; leaves lie thick in the grass. Slopping to and fro with cold hands and heavy buckets is part and parcel of the moment. This space is uncomfortable but vital and free. And we receive energy from the independent and free things around us.

As the days draw in and winter drives us indoors, the world may shrink to four walls and the tiny orbit of kitchen and fireside, but horizons go on expanding. Essentially we know that Galileo was wrong. The sun still sets and rises! We affirm it every day. Despite every scientific proof to the contrary, we know the sun goes round the Earth, because we feel it just as we feel the Earth going round *us* as it carries us on its own mysterious course. And we can prove this by turning around, as ecstatic children do, and watching it spin...

And as you shake your heads, I see you conclude that this is what comes of taking tipsy elderberry cordial (purely medicinal!) at bed-time. So with

LONG-TAILED TITS - The ties that bind "Who are these people?" You've hardly seen them all year yet here you are, paper hat askew, squashed between them on the sofa at Christmas. On a branch out in the cold darkness of the garden, also sandwiched between aunts, brothers, cousins and daughters, a tiny bird is asking a similar question. Long-tailed tits and humans are two of Britain's most social species. And just like a visit from your relatives, the arrival of a long-tailed tit flock in your garden can turn tranquillity into chaos. It's like someone has emptied a box of feathered fireworks over the fence. They manically bicker on the bird feeder and swing acrobatically upside-down on the fat balls, all the while trilling, rattling and screaming 'eee-heee' like a troupe of Michael Jackson impersonators. What you're witnessing is a group of roving relatives, roaming the neighbour-

hood to pillage your peanuts. This posse of outlaws consists of in-laws, brothers, sons and daughters. With their gorgeous pink, black and white plumage and those ridiculously long tails, these flying lollypops must qualify for Britain's cutest bird. Then, suddenly they're gone and the pulse rate of the garden returns to normal.

By late winter the extended family will drift apart to find new partners, ready to start new families. In March, the foundations are laid for an epic construction. Moss building bricks are lashed together with ropes of sticky spider's webs. The walls rise, a camouflage cladding of lichen is added to the roof and a cosy filling of a thousand feathers lines the interior. The end result looks a crocheted stomach and soon there will be plenty of rumbling from inside as eight hungry chicks demand to be fed. But raising a large family can take its toll. The constant hunt for insects can exhaust a parent almost to breaking point. And that's when something unusual and wonderful happens. Their family arrives to save them. Aunties and uncles who have not been successful raising their own family that year will selflessly help the parents and feed their nephews and nieces.

Once the children have flown the nest the whole



gang remains together and joins with other siblings to form your chaotic neighbourhood feeding flock. But the biggest challenge of the year still awaits: winter. Freezing night-time temperatures exact a heavy toll on our garden birds. And that's why at Christmas, hidden deep in a hedge, you'll find the extended family of long-tailed tits huddled together on a frosty branch, sharing their warmth and surviving. Like them, we can all extend a warm wing to surround and support our family and friends this Christmas, whether near or far. Because none of us can get through this on our own.
