

I was Googling "Old Mill House, Keymer" (Sussex) and came across a local magazine called "Hassocks and Keymer Talk About".

I think the date was early 2020 but cannot not be sure. Anyway, there was a photo in this little magazine of the Old Mill House at Keymer. The people who live there were asking for information about who the people in the photo might be. I do not know who they were, but I can tell them something about some previous occupants of the house.

I discovered yesterday, with the release of the 1921 Census of England, that my father lived in that house as an 8-year-old child in 1921. He was Eric Stanley Major Monteith (the census has transcribed his middle initials incorrectly) and lived there with his father Henry Percy Monteith, his mother Mary Ethel (Major) Monteith and siblings Sybil and Lau-



rence. I have no idea what they were doing living there as I thought they lived in Wimbledon.

My grandfather Henry Percy Monteith was a retired textile merchant.

It is fascinating to me that my father lived in this house and near the old mill which has been restored.

I was born in England in Southborough, Kent, but my family moved to Canada in 1953 when I was 7.

Can they tell me anything about the house. I see a lot of information about the mill but not much about the house?





THE **MISSING FAME OF HURST-**PIERPOINT In the 17th century there was no such thing as a domestic refrigerator. In the Big Houses meat and poultry were hung from the ceiling in the pantry until well past

their sell-by date. To make meat more palatable, generous use was made of various spices especially nutmeg and mace. Nutmeg was also valued for its medicinal properties because it was thought to be effective against many viral infections including the dreaded Plague.

Nutmeg commanded a very high price because supplies were limited and moreover were controlled by the Dutch, with whom England was at war.

The East India Company in London had no position in the East Indies much of which had been colonised by the Dutch, so the Company decided to despatch an armed vessel to attempt to gain a foothold.

Nathanial Courthope whose family home became Danny (House) in Hurstpierpoint set sail in 1616 in The Swan.

There was just one spice island which had not accepted Dutch sovereignty, and this was Run, the most prodigious yielder of nutmeg. The Chief of Run objected to the aggressive approach of the Dutch and formed an instant close relationship with Courthope. He agreed to transfer the sovereignty of Run to the English Crown. The local Dutch Commander Coen did not like this at all and entered into negotiations with Courthope at Coen's house. The Dutch colonist's way of negotiating was simple. Nathaniel Courthope was never seen again.

But despite Courthope's murder, Run was still English sovereign territory and the East India Company, and the English government were determined to avenge Courthope's death and obtain appropriate compensation. The Anglo-Dutch war continued.

Eventually after many years of conflict and negotiation, England transferred the sovereignty of Run to the Dutch in return for the transfer to England of New Amsterdam and the island of Manhattan. New Amsterdam was promptly renamed New York - not after the city of York but after the Duke of York, the King's brother.

Nathaniel's father, Peter died with only one surviving child, Barbara who married Henry Campion of Kent and the Danny estate came into the ownership of the Campion family.

So, Nathaniel Courthope's action in Run was the direct cause of the foundation of New York. Hurstpierpoint should be famous. The Danny-Run-New York connection is nonetheless recorded in the Danny Archive, the books of The East India Company, the Book 'Nathaniel's Nutmeg by Giles Milton 1999' and now in the Hassocks Talk About and Village Voice 2022.

In ancient Celtic lore, the holly and the oak divide the year between them, each representing half of the calendar. ening days to the holly. Each grows from a weakling to a giant during his reign and is deposed at the height of his power. Just now, the legend goes, with the winter solstice just past, the oak king is still a puny infant. His son is feeble and the life-sap of the earth barely stirring, but each day will bring an increase in strength. The theme surfaces in the medieval tale of Sir Gawain and the Green Knight: King Arthurs Christmas feast is interrupted by the arrival of a fantastical Knight. This figure is a giant, green from head to foot, riding a gigantic green horse - with trimmings, trappings, everything green. As a Christmas entertainment he invites whoever is brave enough to strike him dead on a condition that he may take his revenge at a later date. All demur, but finally a young knight, Gawain attempts the challenge and decapitates the Knight. Unperturbed the apparition then picks up his head, reminds Gawain of his obligation and, rides out into the night once more. The Green

Knight, or Holly King, significantly carries a bunch of holly in his hand and he turns up elsewhere in old tales as the spirit of winter. He is the 'Here come I, old Father Christmas' of traditional Mummers' plays and he is the holly-crowned ghost of Christmas past in Dickens 'A Christmas Carol'. At mid-summer, so the Celtic legend goes, the holly King strikes back. In pre-Soviet Latvia the custom was for the men to wear crowns of oak leaves at their solstice feasts and to leap over symbolic fires in honour of the sun. There would be two bonfires, my Latvian uncle told us: a large one on the ground, which represented life on earth and another small one, suspended high on a pole, to represent the departing sun. Both Earth and Sun, it seems, need protection now. With the current intensity of spraying in our skies, the Sun is hardly able to show its face and without its life-giving light, plant life and our own bodies too, will be condemned to live in a prolonged artificial Winter. Looking at the plight of our trees last Summer - willow, ash, alder, maple, chestnut, beach, fruit trees of all kinds, visibly sickening and plagued with fungal infection; looking at our herbs and native plants similarly afflicted, and our own humankind sickening for want of vitamin D, I

wish the New Year could bring an awakening and urgent debate about the harms of geo-engineering. The Horses of the Imagination - innovation - man's determination and delight in ripping out, discarding and refashioning the universe to please his own schemes of invention, have bought us all to the brink of destruction. But the Earth and all its living systems cohere and thrive, not by Darwin's in-

We have had a very busy time at The Windmills Junior School, despite us not being able to do all the usual things at this time of year, due to Covid restrictions.



In Science this term, Year 3 have been geologists and palaeontologists! They learnt about the different properties of rocks and how sedimentary, igneous and metamorphic rocks are formed. a range of seascapes from various different artists; Joseph Turner, Erin Hanson and another classic, Vincent Van Gogh. We then used our replicas to design our own landscape for a Viking longboat scene. The children had the choice of mood to create with their background designs. Some Viking adventures were calmer with a range of sunset tones whilst others were stormy, dangerous scenes with lightning splitting the sky. In History, we have been learning all about what brought different groups of people to England. You might be surprised to know that they all came for very similar reasons! The children created their own settlements and then compared this to an Anglo Saxon and a Viking settlement, making a personal response about who they would rather be and why.

RE lessons in Year 6, have been focusing on the true meaning behind Christmas. We researched and thought about the traditions we have around this time of year. We were really interested in the idea of the candy cane being either a shepherd's crook or the J of Jesus. Most of the traditions do stem from the origins of the birth of Jesus where Christians believe God was incarnate as the baby Jesus. This particular area of learning enabled the children to be really curious and question the beliefs of others, in a respectful way.



As part of this learning, we looked at paintings of this key concept and became art critics. The children then had a go at creating their own interpretations of the incarnation. Some were abstract and some were more traditional. Their understanding of the religious terminology alongside scientific knowledge was

outstanding. The uniqueness and independence really shone through.



SEXTON **BEETLES: SUBTERRANEAN** CORPSE-DISPOSAL BLUES "Now, you got a corpse in a car, minus a head...take me to it." In Quentin Tarantino's movie Pulp Fiction, Winston Wolf provides a professional clean-up service for two incompetent hitmen when they have a little 'problem' that needs solving urgently. Hopefully, illicit corpse disposal isn't a regular dilemma for readers of this magazine - but in the natural world death. disposal, decay and decomposition are vital, constant processes which recycle the nutrients that keep our planet functioning. This clean-up duty is undertaken by a cast of unsung underworld characters. Bacteria and blow-flies, fungi and foxes, worms and woodlice all put their tendrils, talons, mandibles and molars to the task. But if you want a corpse removed efficiently and cleanly you had better call in the professionals: the sexton beetles.

The sextons are members of the family Silphidae. At about 3cm long they are amongst the heavy-weights of our county's 3,000 beetle species. Some sextons can be identified by their lurid orange wing-cases; a hi-vis jacket befitting a worker at the scene of a tragedy. Now, let's say you've got a dead blue tit in the back yard. Its little soul will have winged its way to that great peanut feeder in the sky and now it's time to return its earthly body back to the soil. Sextons, armed with super-sensitive chemoreceptors in their clubbed antennae, can detect the sweet smell of death from a mile away.

The male flies in first and assesses the scene. First job - call for backup. He secretes a stink from his rear end to lure in a female and his partner arrives. Next job - secure the corpse. The beetles start

beetling around the blue tit, stripping off the feathers. But - phew-wee! That smell will soon be luring in every fly in the neighbourhood and the sextons don't want to draw attention to their work. So, they baste the body with their antibacterial and antifungal chemicals, slowing down the decay and preventing the pong. Now the sextons live up to their name. Working together, they dig a grave and line it with feathers. The corpse is tenderly lowered down into the earth. It's here, in this cosy crypt, that the sextons will raise their family. Eggs are laid and develop into hungry larvae which, unusually for an insect, 'beg' for food and are fed by their devoted parents. The bird's body is slowly stripped of flesh and reduced to a simple skeleton. After pupation, new sexton beetles emerge from the soil and fly away, perhaps to find their own corpse or to become food for birds themselves. No eulogy, no flowers, yet it's still a dignified, life-affirming send off. So, when it's my time to go, just drag me into the garden and let the sextons do their job.

I often wonder what happened to David Fuller maybe became a blacksmith like his father I suspect.
