





HURSTRETHINK.ORG In the last edition - February, there was a lovely old photograph from 1920 of a lady standing in a summer meadow next to a ramshackle barn. The first thing that struck me was how different our local countryside looked not so very long ago. High wide hedgerows left to flower, teaming with blossom from where Nightingales would have routinely sung out on spring evenings. A wildflower meadow buzzing with hundreds of species of insects.

A photograph of the same place today would look very different indeed. Hedgerows flailed to ragged waist high ugly stumps by heavy machinery offering next to nothing for wild creatures. Meadows mercilessly mowed or sprayed with herbicide. Any old buildings pulled down, sealed up or netted over so not a solitary Barn Owl could get a roost for the night or raise some chicks or where Swallows can nest.

When we zealously 'tidy' our countryside and gardens selfishly, and without a thought for wildlife, we directly destroy the very things that we miss so much. That we now resign ourselves to recalling through nostalgic photographs and on television. The lady in the photograph wouldn't recognise

Fifteen pupils from Year 6 were given the opportunity to take part in a dance workshop at Downlands Community School. The plan was to learn a dance routine from scratch and perform it to others within the session. After they arrived at Downlands, they met six GCSE dance students, who then lead them through the whole experience as part of their GCSE course. They danced to the song 'A Whole New World' from the movie Aladdin. In the dance, they had to be synchronised and energetic. Learning the moves was an exciting challenge for the pupils and they had an amazing hour of fun (while learning a lot). All in all, they thought the morning was an incredible experience. The pupils who participated want to truly thank everyone involved, especially the GCSE students who taught and created the amazing dances. They are also very grateful for being able to use the space of the assembly hall. Thank you to Downlands Community

In Year 5 we have kick-started our spring term topic, Hidden Kingdoms, by looking at various hidden treasures of planet Earth. Some that at one stage in history we didn't even know existed. In our English writing, we took guidance from the one and only David Attenborough and listened to his rich descriptions of places in the world. Using his models to aid our writing, we created our own explanation texts of our chosen hidden kingdom. These included kingdoms that are perched high upon mountain ranges (Machu Picchu) as well as under-water fantasies (Atlantis).

Year 5 have also 'launched' themselves into their Science topic of Space and it's safe to say that an incredible amount of learning has already taken place. Ably assisted by their favourite YouTube

song, Year 5 soon learnt the order of the planets and wrote some catchy mnemonics to make this stick. To learn about the greater details of the planets, they created some Top Trumps cards. As well as including key information such as: the distance from the sun and the length of days and years of these planets. They also created their own categories including 'beauty' and 'suitability for humans.' Year 5 have not stopped here - they have recreated the movement of the planets using inflatable models (Neptune is yet to complete a full orbit!) and also looked at how day and night take place.

The children in Year 4 have thoroughly enjoyed learning about the Titanic so far and are eager to find out more! We have started by learning why the Titanic was such a special ship for its time and discussed why people were choosing to go to the United States in 1912. This will then feed into our historical and geographical understanding of the passengers and will build on our knowledge of wealth and poverty and how this had huge significance on the passengers of the Titanic.

In Science, the Year 4's have been learning about states of matter and, in order to deepen their understanding, they have conducted many practical investigations. The most recent investigation focused on the processes of melting and freezing. They made ice cream in class using some freezer bags and ice (and they even got to taste some too)! They discussed what state each substance was at the start and the end of the process. They found out that in order for the ice cream mixture to be frozen, we needed to cool it.

Year 3 have been enjoying dance in their PE slots this term. Using Chinese New Year as a starting point, we learned movements inspired by dancing dragons, lions, fans and fireworks that are all

Thinking carefully about their starting positions and how to travel between their movements, they practised and then performed their dances. The Chinese music that they danced to, links with our learning in music this half term learning to play glockenspiels and composing using pentatonic scales.

Year 3 have also been getting crafty in their DT lessons. The children were given the design brief to make a stand to hold objects for a desk. They had to learn some key terminology and skills to succeed in this challenge. After learning about butt joints, the children designed their stands. They then made their frames which involved careful measuring, sawing and sticking. Accuracy and patience were needed as well a lot of problem solving on the way! We were so impressed with the children's perseverance and creativity. The results are amazing! We think we have some future designers in the Ruth Jayal making.

NEWS FROM STONEYWISH On this, the last day of January, a wind whips out of the north, scouring the sky clear of clouds so that an expanse of cobalt blue dazzles the eye beyond the bronze tips of the willows. The sky has got into the ponds, where the geese and ducks, now paddling in pairs, break it up into lacquered tiles. And the sunlight slips between tree trunks and brightens the dry beech leaves on the woodland floor. Here Spring is already a-foot: Winter aconites crowd together, their yellow blooms like miniature suns of golden heads with green neck ruffs – ('choirboys' in Suffolk idiom) and always the first to appear; snowdrops are emerging between spears of arum lily and a froth of tiny leaves of Queen Ann's lace. The wind swings the catkins in the alders and hazels, blowing flurries of small birds into the air. They are goldfinches, I think, scavenging for seeds in last year's alder cones. By the time I reach that pinetum they have hidden up in the brambly blackthorn hedge and are chattering invisibly, so that the hedge itself seems to be singing. Distant woodpeckers are vocal. The moles, driven deep by January's drought, have excavated a dense mass of mole-hills

catkins, bluebells and all – were never more than a husks of a moment. My sticky buds dried out. The rest of the tree got on with its life. If I walk around the pond again, the world will have changed. The goldfinches will be gone; the sun will have dipped behind the trees. As dusk falls, a Little Owl gives its mewing cry and wings over the water and away across the fields. Of course, he may have been there all the time, like the myriad other things I could not see before. Going round twice is like dipping a toe into Zeno's river and entering into the mystery of 'flux'. "All is change", as that Greek philosopher observed and all attempts to stall or control the flow, cut one off from the source of the mystery. Perhaps it is better to go lightly, like the invisible catkin pollen and let the wind carry us,

in the Farm Centre, where our new billy goat lifts

his nose and bleats to announce his presence while

the 'nannies' observe him, unconcerned. Every-

thing is busy, wrapped up in its own unfolding nar-

rative. It seems as though I have been doing this,

going out to 'look for Spring' all my life, and the ritual is a peculiarly human one. While I am looking

for it, everything else is busy 'being' Spring, and I

am suddenly struck by the irony that everything I

found and saved over the course of many years -

whether destined for school nature tables, or win-

dowsills at home, for scrapbooks, photograph al-

bums, dare I even say, paintings - sticky buds,

This way we would not have to be bogged down with cataloguing, collecting, counting steps, pulse beats, calories, days, miles, species - not struggling to possess Nature, but allowing ourselves to be reclaimed, enchanted by Her. Is there a lesson here for those of us who want to save the world by force? The more we try to take control, it seems to me, the more we become the problem, trying to damn the vital and evanescent pathways of things we barely comprehend, instead of stepping down with grace and accepting the gifts of being small. To go out naked, so to speak, without the usual paraphernalia of phone, camera, pedometer, sat nay, gadgets and gizmos of all descriptions, and to forge the outdoor leisure distractions of speed lights, loud music is to rediscover, with wonder, how small one is - how extraordinary the vastness of the smallest corner of the world we take for granted. One doesn't need the Rocky Mountains. lovely as they are. A vulnerable and increasingly isolated pocket of land such as Stoneywish will do. A simple back yard will do. Such spaces could collectively co-evolve, if once allowed to do so, to reestablish a coherent wider landscape where life can

flourish. How refreshing it might be to discover that a genuine face-to-face with a backvard weed was worth more than zoom time with the world's rarest flora! What I found, on my second time round, was another surprise. Perceptions also evolve. My initial glimpse of a world which was present when I was not and had a total validity with or without me, deepened as I began to see myself, a creature subject to Natures universal laws, as an inalienable part of the flux. The being which startled the owl had moved on from the being which listened to the gold-finches - declaring itself part and parcel of that greater dynamic which brings the changes of the Seasons. So Spring is not to be 'found' so much as 'lived'. It doesn't happen around us, it happens through us too. We are it and we can help to make it happen by being alive to its message. That's a breath of fresh air, if I ever there was one, after a dark, gloomy Winter! So on that note, I leave you to bud and bloom for another month and wish you all the joys of life returning!

NUTHATCH: THE BIRD TABLE BUCCANEER of

the Sussex Wildlife Trust

Back garden birdwatchers know there's a pecking order on the peanut feeder. Coal Tits are elbowed out by Blue Tits who in turn are ousted by Great Tits. But when the Nuthatch shows up, everything scarpers. With its streamlined body, blue back, pink chest and black eye-stripe, the Nuthatch cuts a dynamic figure; a swashbuckling bird table buccaneer. The weapon it wields is a stout, dagger-like beak but it's not designed for skewering birds. Nuthatches are nuts about nuts.

The Nuthatch's name comes from 'nut hacker' in reference to the bird's habit of jamming hazelnuts and acorns into tree crevices and then using its powerful bill to noisily smash them open. There's an old Sussex name which fits this manic, intense bird perfectly: Nutjobber. I have never seen this nutty little bird sitting still. They're so crazy about climbing that they're the only British bird that can actually climb headfirst down a tree.

At this time of year our garden birds become more vocal and aggressive as they claim and defend territories and croon their tunes to attract a mate. Spring lacks this urgency for the male Nuthatch. He hasn't stopped fighting all winter as he angrily defends his hectare of woodland. Nuthatches are monogamous too and the loyal pair soon dispense with spring serenades and get down to the hard work of making a home. Many birds start from scratch. Twigs and moss are laboriously collected and nests are painstakingly woven. Nuthatches however are happy to let someone else undertake the heavy construction work. Their residence of choice is a spacious tree

cavity drilled and abandoned by a woodpecker. Sure, it needs a bit of work, but the Nuthatches will make do and mend. The main problem is the front door. It's too big. This gaping hole can let in predators or Starling squatters who will happily turf out nesting Nuthatches. So, while the male keeps guard the female Nuthatch starts bricking up the entrance hole. Her bill is used like a plasterer's trowel to smear mouthfuls of mud until the terracotta porch is perfectly Nuthatch sized. She is a compulsive builder and if they move into a nestbox she still cannot resist plastering mud around the hole, even if it's already the right size.

And it's great to report on a bird that's actually increasing in number and range. Once restricted to south-east England, the Nuthatch now breeds in Scotland – probably assisted by the provision of garden peanut feeders as it marched north. And as Britain seemingly gets crazier by the day it's nice to know there's still space for a few more Nutjobbers.
